AN ACT Relating 1 to pupil transportation; amending RCW 2 section to chapter 28A.160 RCW; 28A.160.140; adding a new and 3 creating a new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature recognizes that school bus 6 drivers play a crucial role in ensuring students' safe passage to and 7 from school, preventing absences, and extending a positive school climate beyond the classroom. By delivering this essential service, 8 school bus drivers provide a significant time and convenience benefit 9 10 to thousands of Washington families, remove cars from the road, 11 reduce overall emissions, and increase traffic safety. However, a 12 recent national survey revealed that 94 percent of bus contractors 13 experience driver shortages, with 21 percent reporting their 14 shortages as severe. With this act, the state of Washington intends 15 to encourage the retention of bus drivers who provide vital services 16 to local communities.

17 Sec. 2. RCW 28A.160.140 and 1990 c 33 s 140 are each amended to 18 read as follows:

19 <u>(1)</u> As a condition of entering into a pupil transportation 20 services contract with a private nongovernmental entity, each school

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district shall engage in an open competitive process at least once every five years. This requirement shall not be construed to prohibit a district from entering into a pupil transportation services contract of less than five years in duration with a district option to renew, extend, or terminate the contract, if the district engages in an open competitive process at least once every five years after July 26, 1987.

8 (2) (a) A school district may only enter into, renew, or extend a 9 pupil transportation services contract with a private nongovernmental 10 entity if that entity provides the following to, or on behalf of, its 11 employees who choose to opt in for coverage:

12 <u>(i) An employer health benefits contribution equal to the</u> 13 <u>employer payment dollar amount in effect for the first year of the</u> 14 <u>contract for health care benefit rates (cockle rates), published</u> 15 <u>annually by the health care authority, for the school employees'</u> 16 <u>benefits board program for school employees; and</u>

17 <u>(ii) An amount equivalent to the salaries of the employees of the</u> 18 private nongovernmental entity multiplied by the employer normal cost 19 contribution rate determined under the entry age cost method for the 20 school employees' retirement system, as published in the most recent 21 actuarial valuation report from the office of the state actuary for 22 the first year of the contract.

(b) All pupil transportation service contracts entered into or modified after the effective date of this section must include a detailed explanation of any contract cost increase by year, expenditure type, and amount, including any increases in cost that result from providing the benefits required under this section.

28 (c) For contracts entered into, renewed, or extended in the 2024 29 calendar year, the benefits required under this section must be 30 provided to employees by the beginning of the 2025-26 school year.

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(3) As used in this section:

32 (((1))) (a) "Employees" means in-state employees of the private 33 nongovernmental entity working sufficient compensated hours 34 performing services pursuant to the contract with the school district 35 to meet the eligibility requirements for the school employees' 36 benefits board program if the employees were directly employed by a 37 school district;

38 (b) "Open competitive process" means either one of the following, 39 at the choice of the school district: 1 (((a))) <u>(i)</u> The solicitation of bids or quotations and the award 2 of contracts under RCW 28A.335.190; or

3 (((b))) <u>(ii)</u> The competitive solicitation of proposals and their 4 evaluation consistent with the process and criteria recommended or 5 required, as the case may be, by the office of financial management 6 for state agency acquisition of personal service contractors;

7 (((2))) <u>(c)</u> "Pupil transportation services contract" means a 8 contract for the operation of privately owned or school district 9 owned school buses, and the services of drivers or operators, 10 management and supervisory personnel, and their support personnel 11 such as secretaries, dispatchers, and mechanics, or any combination 12 thereof, to provide students with transportation to and from school 13 on a regular basis; and

14 (((3))) <u>(d)</u> "School bus" means a motor vehicle as defined in RCW 15 46.04.521 and under the rules of the superintendent of public 16 instruction.

17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 28A.160 18 RCW to read as follows:

(1) A school district that experiences an increase in costs to a pupil transportation services contract as compared to prior year contract costs as a result of the provisions in RCW 28A.160.140 is eligible for supplemental transportation allocations as described in this section.

(2) Beginning September 1, 2024, school districts that provide
pupil transportation through a contract with a nongovernmental entity
under RCW 28A.160.140 must annually provide the office of the
superintendent of public instruction with the following information:

28 (a) A breakdown of the total contract cost increase, including a detailed explanation of the increase by expenditure 29 type 30 demonstrating dollar equivalency required as in RCW 31 28A.160.140(2)(a)(i) and percentage equivalency as required in RCW 32 28A.160.140(2)(a)(ii), as defined by the office of the superintendent of public instruction, and amount; 33

34 (b) A breakdown of cost from the contractor that shows the cost 35 to provide health care and pension benefits to employees prior to the 36 effective date of this section and the cost to provide health care 37 and pension benefits to employees after the implementation of 38 benefits as described in RCW 28A.160.140;

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1 The amount of funding received through transportation (C) allocations under RCW 28A.160.150 through 28A.160.192 prior to the 2 implementation of school employee benefits under chapter 41.05 RCW 3 and the amount of funding received through the same transportation 4 allocations for the period immediately following the implementation 5 6 of school employee benefits under chapter 41.05 RCW, to determine the 7 amount of funding for health care that is already being included in allocations. 8

9 (3) The office of the superintendent of public instruction may 10 suspend the reporting requirements under subsection (2) of this 11 section on or after September 1, 2027, for districts that do not 12 request supplemental transportation allocations under this section.

(4) Subject to the availability of amounts appropriated for this 13 14 specific purpose, the office of the superintendent of public instruction must reimburse a school district for the increased cost 15 16 that is directly attributable to increased benefits as required under 17 this act, using the following formula: The total contract cost increase, less any amounts not attributable to benefits required 18 19 under RCW 28A.160.140, less the amount the allocation was increased based on the actual cost increase through the transportation funding 20 21 formula.

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
