1 AN ACT Relating to opioid and fentanyl prevention education and
2 awareness at institutions of higher education; adding a new section
3 to chapter 28B.10 RCW; and creating a new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 28B.10
6 RCW to read as follows:

7 (1) Each public and private institution of higher education shall
8 provide opioid and fentanyl prevention education and awareness
9 information to all students. Education may be offered in person or
10 electronically and must include information on the "good samaritan"
11 statute in RCW 69.50.315. This education must be posted on each
12 institution's public website for students, parents, and legal
13 guardians to view.

14 (2) Naloxone and fentanyl strips must be made available to
15 students on campus in various accessible locations such as student
16 wellness centers, student union buildings, and student housing.

17 (3) Institutions of higher education must provide staff working
18 in residence halls education and training on administering naloxone.

19 (4) For the purpose of assisting a person at risk of experiencing
20 an opioid-related overdose, an institution of higher education may
21 obtain and maintain opioid overdose reversal medication through a

1 standing order prescribed and dispensed in accordance with RCW
2 69.41.095.

3 (5) For the purposes of this section, "institutions of higher
4 education" has the same meaning as defined in RCW 28B.92.030.

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** If specific funding for the purposes of
6 this act, referencing this act by bill or chapter number, is not
7 provided by June 30, 2024, in the omnibus appropriations act, this
8 act is null and void.

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
