12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

NEW SECTION. 13 Sec. 1. (1) A capital budget is hereby adopted 14 and, subject to the provisions set forth in this act, the several 15 dollar amounts hereinafter specified, or so much thereof as shall be 16 sufficient to accomplish the purposes designated, are hereby 17 appropriated and authorized to be incurred for capital projects 18 during the period beginning with the effective date of this act and 19 ending June 30, 2025, out of the several funds specified in this act. 20 (2) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout this act

21 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

(a) "Fiscal year 2024" or "FY 2024" means the period beginning 1 2 July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024.

(b) "Fiscal year 2025" or "FY 2025" means the period beginning 3 July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025. 4

(c) "Lapse" or "revert" means the amount shall return to an 5 6 unappropriated status.

7 (d) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spent only for the specified purpose. 8

(3) Unless otherwise specifically authorized in this act, any 9 portion of an amount provided solely for a specified purpose that is 10 11 not expended subject to the specified conditions and limitations to 12 fulfill the specified purpose shall lapse.

(4) The amounts shown under the headings "Prior Biennia," "Future 13 Biennia," and "Total" in this act are for informational purposes only 14 and do not constitute legislative approval of these amounts. "Prior 15 16 biennia" typically refers to the immediate prior biennium for 17 reappropriations, but may refer to multiple biennia in the case of specific projects. A "future biennia" amount is an estimate of what 18 may be appropriated for the project or program in the 2025-2027 19 biennium and the following three biennia; an amount of zero does not 20 21 necessarily constitute legislative intent to not provide funding for 22 the project or program in the future.

(5) "Reappropriations" in this act are appropriations and, unless 23 24 the context clearly provides otherwise, are subject to the relevant 25 conditions and limitations applicable to appropriations. Reappropriations shall be limited to the unexpended balances 26 remaining on June 30, 2023, from the 2021-2023 biennial 27 28 appropriations for each project.

20 (c) In each competitive round, a higher energy savings to 21 investment ratio must result in a higher project ranking. Priority 22 consideration must be given to applicants that have not received 23 grant awards for this purpose in prior biennia.

24 (d) The department must determine a minimum match ratio to 25 maximize the leverage of nonstate funds.

26 (3) \$3,000,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided solely for the energy efficiency and environmental performance 27 improvements to minor works, stand-alone, and emergency projects at 28 facilities owned by agencies that repair or replace existing building 29 systems and reduce greenhouse gas emissions from state operations, 30 31 including, but not limited to, HVAC, lighting, insulation, windows, 32 and other mechanical systems. Eligibility for this funding is dependent on an analysis using the office of financial management's 33 life-cycle cost tool that compares project design alternatives for 34 initial and long-term cost-effectiveness. 35

36 (4) The department shall develop metrics that indicate the 37 performance of energy efficiency efforts.

38 (5) If a grant is provided in subsection (1) or (3) of this 39 section to purchase heating devices or systems, the agency must,

1 whenever possible and most cost effective, select devices and systems 2 that do not use fossil fuels.

3 (6) Grants provided in subsections (1), (2), and (3) of this 4 section to state agencies are exempt from the match requirements in 5 this section.

The committee must include: 23 24 (a) A representative from the department of commerce; (b) a 25 representative from the department of archaeology and historic preservation; (c) the state librarian; (d) a representative from a 26 27 library district; and (e) a representative from a municipal library.

28 (4) The department must conduct a statewide solicitation of The department must evaluate and rank 29 project applications. 30 applications in consultation with the committee established in 31 subsection (3) of this section, using objective criteria. The ranking of projects must prioritize library district facilities listed on a 32 local, state, or federal register of historic places and those 33 located in distressed or rural counties. The evaluation and ranking 34 process must also include an examination of existing assets that 35 applicants propose to apply to projects. Grant assistance under this 36 section may not exceed 50 percent of the total cost of the project. 37 38 The nonstate portion of the total project cost may include cash, the

1 value of real property when acquired solely for the purpose of the 2 project, and in-kind contributions.

(5) The department must submit a prioritized list of recommended 3 projects to the governor and the legislature by October 1, 2024, for 4 inclusion in the department of commerce's 2025-2027 biennial capital 5 6 budget request. The list must include a description of each project, 7 the amount of recommended state funding, and documentation of nonstate funds to be used for the project. Individual grants may not 8 exceed \$2,000,000. The total amount of recommended state funding for 9 the projects on a biennial project list may not exceed \$10,000,000. 10

11 (6) In contracts for grants authorized under this section, the 12 department must include provisions that require that capital improvements be held by the grantee for a specified period of time 13 14 appropriate to the amount of the grant and that facilities be used for the express purpose of the grant. If the grantee is found to be 15 16 out of compliance with provisions of the contract, the grantee must 17 repay to the state general fund the principal amount of the grant 18 plus interest calculated at the rate of interest on state of 19 Washington general obligation bonds issued on the date most close in time to the date of authorization of the grant. 20

(7) The department must assist grant recipients under this section to apply for applicable competitive federal grant funding and, upon receipt of any such funding, an equal amount of the state building construction account—state appropriation must be placed in unallotted status.

 College for up to \$3,200,000 plus financing expenses and required

31 (b) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Shoreline 32 Community College for up to \$3,128,000 plus financing expenses and 33 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to construct an 34 allied health, science, and manufacturing replacement building.

35 (c) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of South Puget 36 Sound Community College for up to \$5,000,000 plus financing expenses 37 and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to renovate a 38 health education building.

(d) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Bates TechnicalCollege for up to \$1,350,000 plus financing expenses and required

1 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to purchase land and 2 facilities.

3 (7) The department of ecology: Enter into a financing contract 4 for up to \$3,797,000 plus financing expenses and required reserves 5 pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW for the Lacey headquarters parking 6 garage preservation project.

7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7055. 2021 c 332 s 3111 (uncodified) is 8 repealed.

PART 8 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Sec. 8001. RCW 43.88.031 requires the disclosure 3 NEW SECTION. of the estimated debt service costs associated with new capital bond 4 5 appropriations. The estimated debt service costs for the appropriations contained in this act are \$62,480,000 6 for the 7 2023-2025 biennium, \$379,283,000 for the 2025-2027 biennium, and \$529,187,000 for the 2027-2029 biennium. 8

8002. 9 <u>NEW</u> SECTION. Sec. ACOUISITION OF PROPERTIES AND FACILITIES THROUGH FINANCIAL CONTRACTS. (1) The following agencies 10 may enter into financial contracts, paid from any funds of an agency, 11 12 appropriated or nonappropriated, for the purposes indicated and in not more than the principal amounts indicated, plus financing 13 14 expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW. When 15 securing properties under this section, agencies shall use the most 16 economical financial contract option available, including long-term 17 leases, lease-purchase agreements, lease-development with option to 18 purchase agreements or financial contracts using certificates of 19 participation. Expenditures made by an agency for one of the 20 indicated purposes before the issue date of the authorized financial 21 contract and any certificates of participation therein are intended 22 to be reimbursed from proceeds of the financial contract and any 23 certificates of participation therein to the extent provided in the 24 agency's financing plan approved by the state finance committee.

Those noninstructional facilities of education 25 (2)higher institutions authorized in this section to enter into financial 26 27 not eligible for state funded maintenance and contracts are operations. Instructional space that is available for 28 regularly 29 scheduled classes for academic transfer, basic skills, and workforce 30 training programs may be eligible for state funded maintenance and 31 operations.

(3) Secretary of state: Enter into a financing contract for up to 32 33 \$119,000,000 plus financing expenses, required reserves, and 34 capitalized interest pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to construct a new 35 library-archives building.

36 Department of social and health services: Enter into a (4) 37 financing contract for up to \$146,038,000 plus costs and financing 38 expenses, required reserves, and capitalized interest pursuant to

1 chapter 39.94 RCW to construct a nursing facility on the fircrest residential habilitation center campus. The department may contract 2 to lease develop or lease purchase the facility. Before entering into 3 a contract, the department must consult with the office of financial 4 management and the office of the state treasurer. Should the 5 department of social and health services choose to use a financing 6 contract that does not provide for the issuance of certificates of 7 participation, the financing contract shall be subject to approval by 8 the state finance committee as required by RCW 39.94.010. 9 In approving a financing contract not providing for the use 10 of 11 certificates of participation, the state finance committee should be 12 reasonably certain that the contract is excluded from the computation of indebtedness, particularly that the contract is not backed by the 13 full faith and credit of the state and the legislature is expressly 14 not obligated to appropriate funds to make payments. For purposes of 15 16 this subsection, "financing contract" includes but is not limited to a certificate of participation and tax exempt financing similar to 17 that authorized in RCW 47.79.140. 18

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8003. (1) To ensure that major construction projects are carried out in accordance with legislative and executive intent, agencies must complete a predesign for state construction projects with a total anticipated cost in excess of \$10,000,000. For purposes of this section, "total anticipated cost" means the sum of the anticipated cost of the predesign, design, and construction phases of the project.

(2) Appropriations for design may not be expended or encumbered
 until the office of financial management has reviewed and approved
 the agency's predesign.

The predesign must explore at least three project 29 (3) 30 alternatives. These alternatives must be both distinctly different 31 and viable solutions to the issue being addressed. The chosen alternative should be the most reasonable and cost-effective 32 solution. The predesign document must include, but not be limited to, 33 program, site, and cost analysis, and an analysis of the life-cycle 34 35 costs of the alternatives explored, in accordance with the predesign manual adopted by the office of financial management. 36

37 (4) For projects exceeding the \$10,000,000 predesign threshold 38 established in this section, the office of financial management may 39 make an exception to some or all of the predesign requirements in

1 this section. The office of financial management shall report any 2 exception to the fiscal committees of the legislature:

3 (a) A description of the major capital project for which the 4 predesign waiver is made;

(b) An explanation of the reason for the waiver; and

5

6 (c) A rough order of magnitude cost estimate for the project's 7 design and construction.

8 (5) In deliberations related to submitting an exception under 9 this section, the office of financial management shall consider the 10 following factors:

11 (a) Whether there is any determination to be made regarding the 12 site of the project;

(b) Whether there is any determination to be made regarding whether the project will involve renovation, new construction, or both;

16 (c) Whether, within six years of submitting the request for 17 funding, the agency has completed, or initiated the construction of, 18 a substantially similar project;

(d) Whether there is any anticipated change to the project'sprogram or the services to be delivered at the facility;

(e) Whether the requesting agency indicates that the project may not require some or all of the predesign requirements in this section due to a lack of complexity; and

(f) Whether any other factors related to project complexity or risk, as determined by the office of financial management, could reduce the need for, or scope of, a predesign.

(6) If under this section, some or all predesign requirements are waived, the office of financial management may instead propose a professional project cost estimate instead of a request for predesign funding.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 8004. (1) The legislature finds that use of 31 life-cycle cost analysis will aid public entities, architects, 32 engineers, and contractors in making design and construction 33 decisions that positively impact both the initial construction cost 34 35 and the ongoing operating and maintenance cost of a project. To ensure that the total cost of a project is accounted for and the most 36 reasonable and cost efficient design is used, agencies shall develop 37 38 life-cycle costs for any construction project over \$10,000,000. The life-cycle costs must represent the present value sum of capital 39

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1 costs, installation costs, operating costs, and maintenance costs 2 over the life expectancy of the project. The legislature further 3 finds the most effective approach to the life-cycle cost analysis is 4 to integrate it into the early part of the design process.

(2) Agencies must develop a minimum of three project alternatives 5 6 for use in the life-cycle cost analysis. These alternatives must be both distinctly different and viable solutions to the issue being 7 addressed. Agencies must choose the most reasonable and cost-8 effective solution, as supported by the life-cycle cost analysis. A 9 brief description of each project alternative and why it was chosen 10 11 must be included in the life-cycle cost analysis section of the 12 predesign.

(3) The office of financial management shall: (a) Make available a life-cycle cost model to be used for analysis; (b) in consultation with the department of enterprise services, provide assistance in using the life-cycle cost model; and (c) update the life-cycle cost model annually including assumptions for inflation rates, discount rates, and energy rates.

19 (4) Agencies shall consider architectural and engineering firms' 20 and general contractors' experience using life-cycle costs, operating 21 costs, and energy efficiency measures when selecting an architectural 22 and engineering firm, or when selecting contractors using alternative 23 contracting methods.

24 NEW SECTION. Sec. 8005. Agencies administering construction projects with a total anticipated cost in excess of \$10,000,000 must 25 submit progress reports to the office of financial management and to 26 27 the fiscal committees of the house of representatives and senate. "Total anticipated cost" means the sum of the anticipated cost of the 28 predesign, design, and construction phases of the project. Reports 29 30 must be submitted on July 1st and December 31st of each year in a format determined by the office of financial management. After the 31 project is completed, agencies must also submit a closeout report 32 identifies the total project cost 33 that and any unspent 34 appropriations.

35 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8006. (1) Allotments for appropriations in 36 this act shall be provided in accordance with the capital project 37 review requirements adopted by the office of financial management and 38 in compliance with RCW 43.88.110. Projects that will be employing alternative public works construction procedures under chapter 39.10
 RCW are subject to the allotment procedures defined in this section
 and RCW 43.88.110.

4 (2) Each project is defined as proposed in the legislative budget 5 notes or in the governor's budget document.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 8007. (1) The office of financial management 6 may authorize a transfer of appropriation authority provided for a 7 capital project that is in excess of the amount required for the 8 completion of such project to another capital project for which the 9 appropriation is insufficient. No such transfer may be used to expand 10 the capacity of any facility beyond that intended in making the 11 appropriation. Such transfers may be effected only between capital 12 appropriations to a specific department, commission, agency, or 13 institution of higher education and only between capital projects 14 15 that are funded from the same fund or account. No transfers may occur 16 between projects to local government agencies except where the grants are provided within a single omnibus appropriation and where such 17 transfers are specifically authorized by the implementing statutes 18 19 that govern the grants.

20 (2) The office of financial management may find that an amount is in excess of the amount required for the completion of a project only 21 if: (a) The project as defined in the notes to the budget document is 22 substantially complete and there are funds remaining; or (b) bids 23 24 have been let on a project and it appears to a substantial certainty 25 that the project as defined in the notes to the budget document can be completed within the biennium for less than the 26 amount 27 appropriated in this act.

(3) For the purposes of this section, the intent is that each project be defined as proposed to the legislature in the governor's budget document, unless it clearly appears from the legislative history that the legislature intended to define the scope of a project in a different way.

(4) A report of any transfer effected under this section, except emergency projects or any transfer under \$250,000, shall be filed with the fiscal committees of the legislature by the office of financial management at least 30 days before the date the transfer is effected. The office of financial management shall report all emergency or smaller transfers within 30 days from the date of transfer.

1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8008. (1) It is expected that projects be ready to proceed in a timely manner depending on the type or phase of 2 the project or program that is the subject of the appropriation in 3 this act. Except for major projects that customarily may take more 4 than two biennia to complete from predesign to the end of 5 6 construction, or large infrastructure grant or loan programs 7 supporting projects that often take more than two biennia to complete, the legislature generally does not intend to reappropriate 8 funds more than once, particularly for smaller grant programs, local/ 9 community projects, and minor works. 10

11 (2) Agencies shall expedite the expenditure of reappropriations 12 and appropriations in this act in order to: (a) Rehabilitate 13 infrastructure resources; (b) accelerate environmental rehabilitation 14 and restoration projects for the improvement of the state's natural 15 environment; (c) reduce additional costs associated with acquisition 16 and construction inflationary pressures; and (d) provide additional 17 employment opportunities associated with capital expenditures.

18 (3) To the extent feasible, agencies are directed to accelerate 19 expenditure rates at their current level of permanent employees and 20 shall use contracted design and construction services wherever 21 necessary to meet the goals of this section.

22 NEW SECTION. Sec. 8009. Any building project that receives over \$10,000,000 in funding from the capital budget must be built to 23 24 sustainable standards. "Sustainable building" means a building that 25 integrates and optimizes all major high-performance building attributes, including energy efficiency, durability, life-cycle 26 27 performance, and occupant productivity, and minimizes greenhouse gas 28 emissions. The following design and construction attributes must be integrated into the building project: 29

30 (1) Employ integrated design principles: Use a collaborative, 31 integrated planning and design process that initiates and maintains 32 an integrated project team in all stages of a project's planning and delivery. Establish performance goals for siting, energy, water, 33 indoor environmental quality along with other 34 materials, and comprehensive design goals and ensures incorporation of these goals 35 throughout the design and life-cycle of the building. Consider all 36 stages of the building's life-cycle, including deconstruction. 37

38 (2) Commissioning: Employ commissioning practices tailored to the 39 size and complexity of the building and its system components in

order to verify performance of building components and systems and help ensure that design requirements are met. This should include an experienced commissioning provider, inclusion of commissioning requirements in construction documents, a commissioning plan, verification of the installation and performance of systems to be commissioned, and a commissioning report.

7 (3) Optimize energy performance: Establish a whole building 8 performance target that takes into account the intended use, 9 occupancy, operations, plug loads, other energy demands, and design 10 to earn the ENERGY STAR targets for new construction and major 11 renovation where applicable. For new construction target low energy 12 use index. For major renovations, target reducing energy use by 50 13 percent below prerenovations baseline.

14 (4) On-site renewable energy: Implement renewable energy 15 generation projects on agency property for agency use, when life-16 cycle cost effective.

17 (5) High-efficiency electric equipment: Use only high-efficiency 18 electric equipment for water and space heating needs not met through 19 on-site renewable energy, when life-cycle cost effective.

(6) Measurement and verification: For buildings over 50,000 square feet, install building level electricity meters in new major construction and renovation projects to track and continuously optimize performance. Include equivalent meters for natural gas and steam, where natural gas and steam are used. Where appropriate, install dashboards inside buildings to display and incentivize occupants on energy use.

(7) Benchmarking: Compare performance data from the first year of operation with the energy design target. Verify that the building performance meets or exceeds the design target. For other building and space types, use an equivalent benchmarking tool.

31 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8010. State agencies, including institutions 32 of higher education, shall allot and report full-time equivalent 33 staff for capital projects in a manner comparable to staff reporting 34 for operating expenditures.

35 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8011. Executive Order No. 21-02, 36 archaeological and cultural resources, was issued effective April 7, 37 2021. Agencies shall comply with the requirements set forth in this 38 executive order and must consult with the department of archaeology

and historic preservation and affected tribes on the potential 1 effects of projects on cultural resources and historic properties 2 proposed in state-funded construction or acquisition projects, 3 including grant or pass-through funding that culminates 4 in construction or land acquisitions. Consultation with the department 5 6 of archaeology and historic preservation and affected tribes must be 7 initiated early in the project planning process, prior to construction or taking title. 8

9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8012. FOR THE ARTS COMMISSION—ART WORK 10 ALLOWANCE. (1) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this 11 act for original construction of school plant facilities is provided 12 solely for the purposes of RCW 28A.335.210.

(2) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act for original construction or any major renovation or remodel work exceeding \$200,000 by colleges or universities is provided solely for the purposes of RCW 28B.10.027.

(3) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act for original construction of any public building by a state agency identified in RCW 43.17.200 is provided solely for the purposes of RCW 43.17.200.

21 (4) At least 75 percent of the moneys spent by the Washington state arts commission during the 2023-2025 fiscal biennium for the 22 23 purposes of RCW 28A.335.210, 28B.10.027, and 43.17.200 must be 24 expended solely for direct acquisition of works of art; 15 percent may be expended for program administration; and 10 percent may be 25 26 expended to conserve or maintain existing pieces in the state art 27 collection. Except for art allocations made under K-3 class size reduction grants under section 6527 of this act, art allocations not 28 expended within the ensuing two biennia shall lapse. 29

30 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8013. To carry out the provisions of this 31 act, the governor may assign responsibility for predesign, design, 32 construction, and other related activities to any appropriate agency.

33 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8014. If any federal moneys appropriated by 34 this act for capital projects are not received by the state, the 35 department or agency to which the moneys were appropriated may 36 replace the federal moneys with funds available from private or local 37 sources. No replacement may occur under this section without the

1 prior approval of the director of financial management in 2 consultation with the senate ways and means committee and the house 3 of representatives capital budget committee.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8015. (1) Unless otherwise stated, for all appropriations under this act that require a match of nonstate money or in-kind contributions, the following requirement, consistent with RCW 43.88.150, shall apply: Expenditures of state money shall be timed so that the state share of project expenditures never exceeds the intended state share of total project costs.

10 (2) Provision of the full amount of required matching funds is 11 not required to permit the expenditure of capital budget 12 appropriations for phased projects if a proportional amount of the 13 required matching funds is provided for each distinct, identifiable 14 phase of the project.

15 NEW SECTION. Sec. 8016. NONTAXABLE AND TAXABLE BOND PROCEEDS. 16 Portions of the appropriation authority granted by this act from the 17 state building construction account, or any other account receiving bond proceeds, may be transferred to the state taxable building 18 19 construction account as deemed necessary by the state treasurer, on 20 behalf of the state finance committee, to comply with the federal 21 internal revenue service rules and regulations pertaining to the use of nontaxable bond proceeds. Portions of the general obligation bond 22 23 proceeds authorized by chapter . . . (Senate Bill No. 5201), Laws of 24 2023 (state general obligation bonds and related accounts) for deposit into the state taxable building construction account that are 25 26 in excess of amounts required to comply with the federal internal revenue service rules and regulations shall be deposited into the 27 state building construction account. The state treasurer shall submit 28 29 written notification to the director of financial management and the 30 legislative evaluation and accountability program committee if it is 31 determined that a shift of appropriation authority between the state building construction account, or any other account receiving bond 32 proceeds, and the state taxable building construction account is 33 necessary, or that a shift of appropriation authority from the state 34 taxable building construction account to the state building 35 36 construction account may be made.

1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8017. (1) Minor works project lists are 2 single line appropriations that include multiple projects of a 3 similar nature and that are valued between \$25,000 and \$2,000,000 4 each. Funds appropriated in this act for minor works may not be 5 initially allotted until agencies submit project lists to the office 6 of financial management for review and approval.

7 (2) Revisions to the project lists, including the addition of projects and the transfer of funds between projects, are allowed but 8 must be submitted to the office of financial management, the house of 9 representatives capital budget committee, and the senate ways and 10 means committee for review and comment, and must 11 include an 12 explanation of variances from prior approved lists. Any project list revisions must be approved by the office of financial management 13 before funds may be expended from the minor works appropriation. 14

The office of financial management may make an exception to the 30 limitations 31 described in this subsection (3)(c) for exigent circumstances after 32 notifying the legislative fiscal committees and waiting 10 days for 33 comments by the legislature regarding the proposed exception.

(d) Minor works preservation projects may include program
 improvements of no more than 25 percent of the individual minor works
 preservation project cost.

37 (e) Improvements for accessibility in compliance with the 38 Americans with disabilities act may be included in any of the minor 39 works categories. 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8018. To the extent that any appropriation authorizes expenditures of state funds from the state building 2 construction account, or from any other capital project account in 3 the state treasury, for a capital project or program that 4 is specified to be funded with proceeds from the sale of bonds, the 5 legislature declares that any such expenditures for that project or 6 7 program made prior to the issue date of the applicable bonds are intended to be reimbursed from proceeds of those bonds in a maximum 8 amount equal to the amount of such appropriation. 9

10 NEW SECTION. Sec. 8019. FOR THE STATE TREASURER-TRANSFERS 11 (1) Public Works Assistance Account: For transfer to the 12 water pollution control revolving account, up to 13 \$17,500,000 for fiscal year 2024 and up to \$17,500,000 14 (2) Public Works Assistance Account: For transfer 15 16 to the drinking water assistance account, up to 17 \$1,750,000 for fiscal year 2024 and up to \$1,750,000 18

19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8020. In order to accelerate the reduction of 20 embodied carbon and improve the environmental performance of 21 construction materials, agencies shall, whenever possible, review and 22 consider embodied carbon reported in environmental product 23 declarations when evaluating proposed structural materials for 24 construction projects.

25 NEW SECTION. Sec. 8021. The department of natural resources, in 26 coordination with the department of social and health services, shall 27 enter into long-term, revenue-generating opportunities for under used portions of the Fircrest residential habilitation center bounded by 28 29 15th Ave NE and NE 150th Street to benefit the charitable, educational, penal, and reformatory institutions account. Long-term, 30 31 revenue generating opportunities may include, but are not limited to, 32 land leases, land sales, and land swaps. The department of social and 33 health services and the department of natural resources must amend 34 their lease under chapter 7, Laws of 1986 if necessary to conform 35 with this section.

31 (f) Shelters and related services for the homeless, including 32 emergency shelters and overnight youth shelters;

33 (g) Mortgage subsidies, including temporary rental and mortgage 34 payment subsidies to prevent homelessness;

35 (h) Mortgage insurance guarantee or payments for eligible 36 projects;

37 (i) Down payment or closing cost assistance for eligible first-38 time home buyers;

39 (j) Acquisition of housing units for the purpose of preservation 40 as low-income or very low-income housing; (k) Projects making housing more accessible to families with
 members who have disabilities; and

(1) Remodeling and improvements as required to meet building
code, licensing requirements, or legal operations to residential
properties owned and operated by an entity eligible under RCW
43.185A.040, which were transferred as described in RCW
82.45.010(3)(t) by the parent of a child with developmental
disabilities.

9 (3) Preference must be given for projects that include an early 10 learning facility, as defined in RCW 43.31.565.

11 (4) Legislative appropriations from capital bond proceeds may be 12 used only for the costs of projects authorized under subsection (2) (a), (i), and (j) of this section, and not for the administrative 13 costs of the department, except that during the 2021-2023 and 14 2023-2025 fiscal ((biennium)) biennia, the department may use up to 15 16 three percent of the appropriations from capital bond proceeds for 17 administrative costs associated with application, distribution, and project development activities of the housing assistance program. 18

(e) Projects that promote economic growth and innovation through

The)) 14 15 Except for the 2023-2025 fiscal biennium, the director of the 16 recreation and conservation office may expend up to one and one-half 17 percent of the moneys deposited in the account created in this subsection for administrative purposes. 11 (g) Identification of all proposed direct expenditures to 12 implement the Puget Sound water quality plan under chapter 90.71 RCW, shown by agency and in total; and 13

Tabulations showing each postretirement adjustment 14 (h) by retirement system established after fiscal year 1991, to include, but 15 16 not be limited to, estimated total payments made to the end of the biennial period, estimated payments 17 previous for the present biennium, and estimated payments for the ensuing biennium. 18

19 (2) The budget document or documents shall include detailed estimates of all anticipated revenues applicable to proposed 20 21 operating or capital expenditures and shall also include all proposed 22 operating or capital expenditures. (b) A capital program consisting of proposed capital projects for 19 the next biennium and the two biennia succeeding the next biennium 20 consistent with the long-range facilities plan. Insomuch as 21 is 22 practical, and recognizing emergent needs, the capital program shall 23 reflect the priorities, projects, and spending levels proposed in previously submitted capital budget documents in order to provide a 24 25 reliable long-range planning tool for the legislature and state 26 agencies;

(c) A capital plan consisting of proposed capital spending for atleast four biennia succeeding the next biennium;

(d) A strategic plan for reducing backlogs of maintenance and repair projects. The plan shall include a prioritized list of specific facility deficiencies and capital projects to address the deficiencies for each agency, cost estimates for each project, a schedule for completing projects over a reasonable period of time, and identification of normal maintenance activities to reduce future backlogs;

36 (e) A statement of the reason or purpose for a project;

37 (f) Verification that a project is consistent with the provisions 38 set forth in chapter 36.70A RCW;

39 (g) A statement about the proposed site, size, and estimated life 40 of the project, if applicable; 1

(h) Estimated total project cost;

(i) For major projects valued over five million dollars,
estimated costs for the following project components: Acquisition,
consultant services, construction, equipment, project management, and
other costs included as part of the project. Project component costs
shall be displayed in a standard format defined by the office of
financial management to allow comparisons between projects;

8 (j) Estimated total project cost for each phase of the project as 9 defined by the office of financial management;

(k) Estimated ensuing biennium costs;

12 (m) Estimated construction start and completion dates;

(1) Estimated costs beyond the ensuing biennium;

13 (n) Source and type of funds proposed;

(o) Estimated ongoing operating budget costs or savings resultingfrom the project, including staffing and maintenance costs;

16 (p) For any capital appropriation requested for a state agency 17 for the acquisition of land or the capital improvement of land in which the primary purpose of the acquisition or improvement is 18 recreation or wildlife habitat conservation, the capital budget 19 document, or an omnibus list of recreation and habitat acquisitions 20 21 provided with the governor's budget document, shall identify the projected costs of operation and maintenance for at least the two 22 23 biennia succeeding the next biennium. Omnibus lists of habitat and recreation land acquisitions shall include individual project cost 24 25 estimates for operation and maintenance as well as a total for all state projects included in the list. The document shall identify the 26 27 source of funds from which the operation and maintenance costs are 28 proposed to be funded;

(q) For any capital budget request for funding in the 2023-2025 or 2025-2027 fiscal biennia by an institution of higher education to address a cost increase for any major project, a statement describing the unexpected project costs, ways the agency has mitigated or will mitigate the estimated project costs, and identification of other funding that may be applied to the project. For purposes of this subsection (6)(q):

36 (i) "Cost increases" means total project costs estimated above 37 those listed in the prior agency budget request and for which the 38 legislature relied in making a funding decision for design or 39 construction, adjusted for C-100 inflation factors; and 1 (ii) "Institution of higher education" has the meaning provided
2 in RCW 28B.10.016;

3 <u>(r)</u> Such other information bearing upon capital projects as the 4 governor deems to be useful;

5 (((r))) <u>(s)</u> Standard terms, including a standard and uniform 6 definition of normal maintenance, for all capital projects; <u>and</u>

7 (((s))) <u>(t)</u> Such other information as the legislature may direct 8 by law or concurrent resolution.

9 For purposes of this subsection (6), the term "capital project" 10 shall be defined subsequent to the analysis, findings, and 11 recommendations of a joint committee comprised of representatives 12 from the house capital appropriations committee, senate ways and 13 means committee, legislative evaluation and accountability program 14 committee, and office of financial management.

(7) No change affecting the comparability of agency or program 15 16 information relating to expenditures, revenues, workload, performance 17 and personnel shall be made in the format of any budget document or 18 report presented to the legislature under this section or RCW 43.88.160(1) relative to the format of the budget document or report 19 which was presented to the previous regular session of the 20 21 legislature during an odd-numbered year without prior legislative concurrence. Prior legislative concurrence shall consist of (a) a 22 favorable majority vote on the proposal by the standing committees on 23 ways and means of both houses if the legislature is in session or (b) 24 25 a favorable majority vote on the proposal by members of the 26 legislative evaluation and accountability program committee if the legislature is not in session. 27

Sec. 8031. RCW 43.155.050 and 2022 c 296 s 7009, 2022 c 182 s 302, and 2022 c 157 s 15 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

31 (1) The public works assistance account is hereby established in the state treasury. Money may be placed in the public works 32 assistance account from the proceeds of bonds when authorized by the 33 legislature or from any other lawful source. Money in the public 34 works assistance account shall be used to make loans and grants and 35 to give financial guarantees to local governments for public works 36 37 projects. Moneys in the account may also be appropriated or 38 transferred to the water pollution control revolving fund and the drinking water assistance account to provide for state match 39

requirements under federal law. Moneys in the account may be 1 transferred to the move ahead WA account to provide support of public 2 works projects funded in the move ahead WA program. Not more than 20 3 percent of the biennial capital budget appropriation to the public 4 works board from this account may be expended or obligated for 5 6 preconstruction loans and grants, emergency loans and grants, or loans and grants for capital facility planning under this chapter. 7 Not more than 10 percent of the biennial capital budget appropriation 8 to the public works board from this account may be expended or 9 obligated as grants for preconstruction, emergency, capital facility 10 11 planning, and construction projects. During the 2017-2019 and 12 2019-2021 fiscal biennia, the legislature may appropriate moneys from the account for activities related to rural economic development, the 13 growth management act, the aviation revitalization loan program, the 14 community economic revitalization board broadband program, and the 15 16 voluntary stewardship program. During the 2021-2023 ((biennium)) and 2023-2025 fiscal biennia, the legislature may appropriate moneys from 17 18 the account for activities related to the community aviation revitalization board. During the 2019-2021 fiscal biennia, the 19 legislature may direct the state treasurer to make transfers of 20 21 moneys in the public works assistance account to the education legacy trust account. During the 2019-2021 and 2021-2023 fiscal biennia, the 22 legislature may direct the state treasurer to make transfers of 23 moneys in the public works assistance account to the statewide 24 25 broadband account. The legislature may appropriate moneys from the public works assistance account for activities related to the 26 voluntary stewardship program, rural economic development, and the 27 28 growth management act. During the 2021-2023 biennium, the legislature 29 may appropriate moneys from the account for projects identified in section 1033, chapter 296, Laws of 2022. 30

31 (2) For fiscal year 2024 through fiscal year 2038, the state 32 treasurer must transfer from the public works assistance account to 33 the move ahead WA account created in RCW 46.68.510 \$57,000,000 each 34 fiscal year in four equal quarterly transfers.

35 Sec. 8032. RCW 43.07.410 and 2019 c 448 s 9 are each amended to 36 read as follows:

The Washington state library-archives building account is created in the custody of the state treasurer. All moneys received under RCW 36.18.010(12), 36.22.175(3), and 43.07.370(3) must be deposited in

the account. Expenditures from the account may be made only for the 1 purposes of payment of the financing contract entered into by the 2 3 secretary of state for the Washington state library-archives building. However, during the 2023-2025 fiscal biennium, up to 4 \$5,000,000 may be used for costs associated with the design, 5 6 permitting, and conservation plan development of the library-archives 7 building. Only the secretary of state or the secretary of state's may authorize expenditures from the 8 designee account. An appropriation is not required for expenditures, but the account is 9 subject to allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW. 10

11 Sec. 8033. RCW 87.03.136 and 2011 c 50 s 1 are each amended to 12 read as follows:

13 An irrigation district has the power to sell or lease real property owned by the district whenever its board of directors, by 14 15 resolution: Determines that the property is not necessary or needed 16 for the use of the district; and authorizes the sale or lease. Notice 17 of the district's intention to sell or lease the property shall be made by publication at least twenty days before the transaction is 18 executed regarding the property in a newspaper of general circulation 19 20 in the county where the property or part of the property is located 21 or, if there is no such newspaper in the county, in a newspaper of general circulation published in an adjoining county. The publication 22 shall be made at least once a week during three consecutive weeks. 23 24 The notice shall state whether the sale or lease will be negotiated 25 by the district or will be awarded by bid.

The district may lease the property for a duration determined by the board, afford the lessee the option to purchase the property, sell the property on contract for deferred payments, sell the property pursuant to a promissory note secured by a mortgage or deed of trust, or sell the property for cash and conveyance by deed. The appropriate documents shall be executed by the president of the board and acknowledged by the secretary.

33 The resolution authorizing the sale or lease shall be entered in 34 the minutes of the board and shall fix the price at which the lease, 35 option, or sale may be made. The price shall be not less than the 36 reasonable market value of the property; however, the board may, 37 without consideration, dedicate, grant, or convey district land or 38 easements in district land for highway or public utility purposes 39 that convenience the inhabitants of the district if the board deems

1 that the action will enhance the value of the remaining district land 2 to an extent equal to or greater than the value of the land or 3 easement dedicated, granted, or conveyed.

During the 2023-2025 fiscal biennium, the requirements of this section do not apply to a property transferred to the bureau of reclamation or to a public owner under section 3068, chapter . . ., Laws of 2023.

8 **Sec. 8034.** RCW 43.19.125 and 2011 1st sp.s. c 43 s 204 are each 9 amended to read as follows:

10 (1) The director of enterprise services shall have custody and 11 control of the capitol buildings and grounds, supervise and direct 12 proper care, heating, lighting and repairing thereof, and designate 13 rooms in the capitol buildings to be occupied by various state 14 officials.

15 (2) ((During the 2007-2009 biennium, responsibility for 16 development of the "Wheeler block" on the capitol campus as authorized in section 6013, chapter 520, Laws of 2007 shall be 17 18 transferred from the department of general administration to the department of information services.)) During the 2023-2025 fiscal 19 biennium, the director may access and tour the top of the legislative 20 21 dome and, upon request, shall provide access to any legislative 22 member and the member's quest.

23 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8035. If any provision of this act or its 24 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the 25 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other 26 persons or circumstances is not affected.

27 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8036. Except for section 8022 of this act, 28 this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 29 peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its 30 existing public institutions, and takes effect immediately.
