1 AN ACT Relating to addressing high demand workforce shortages; 2 and reenacting and amending RCW 43.79.195.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 43.79.195 and 2021 c 334 s 971 and 2021 c 170 s 6 5 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

6 (1) The workforce education investment account is created in the 7 state treasury. All revenues from the workforce investment surcharge created in RCW 82.04.299 and those revenues as specified under RCW 8 82.04.290(2)(c) must be deposited directly into the account. Moneys 9 in the account may be spent only after appropriation. Expenditures 10 11 from the account may be used only for higher education programs, higher education operations, higher education compensation, state-12 funded student aid programs, and workforce development including 13 14 career connected learning as defined by RCW 28C.30.020.

15 (2) <u>Beginning in fiscal year 2024, and each year thereafter, an</u> 16 <u>amount up to all revenues collected under RCW 82.04.299 must be used</u> 17 <u>for higher education programs that lead to a credential in advanced</u> 18 <u>computing fields and related science, technology, engineering, and</u> 19 <u>math computing fields to increase access and equity, especially for</u> 20 low-income students and students of color. Expenditures from the 1 account under this subsection may be inclusive of the Washington 2 college grant awards of students enrolled in these programs.

3 (3) Expenditures from the workforce education investment account 4 must be used to supplement, not supplant, other federal, state, and 5 local funding for higher education.

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
