AN ACT Relating to creating the LeMay-America's Car Museum special license plate; reenacting and amending RCW 46.17.220, 46.18.200, and 46.68.420; adding a new section to chapter 46.04 RCW; and providing an effective date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 Sec. 1. RCW 46.17.220 and 2022 c 239 s 1 and 2022 c 117 s 1 are 7 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

8 In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon 9 application for a vehicle registration in chapter 46.16A RCW, the 10 holder of a special license plate shall pay the appropriate special 11 license plate fee as listed in this section.

(3) Applicants for initial and renewal professional firefighters
 and paramedics special license plates must show proof of eligibility
 by providing a certificate of current membership from the Washington
 state council of firefighters.

(4) Applicants for initial volunteer firefighters special license
plates must (a) have been a volunteer firefighter for at least
((ten)) <u>10</u> years or be a volunteer firefighter for one or more years
and (b) have documentation of service from the district of the
appropriate fire service. If the volunteer firefighter leaves

1 firefighting service before ((ten)) <u>10</u> years of service have been completed, the volunteer firefighter shall surrender the license 2 plates to the department on the registration renewal date. If the 3 volunteer firefighter stays in service for at least ((ten)) 10 years 4 and then leaves, the license plate may be retained by the former 5 6 volunteer firefighter and as long as the license plate is retained 7 for use the person will continue to pay the future registration renewals. A qualifying volunteer firefighter may have no more than 8 one set of license plates per vehicle, and a maximum of two sets per 9 applicant, for their personal vehicles. If the volunteer firefighter 10 11 is convicted of a violation of RCW 46.61.502 or a felony, the license 12 plates must be surrendered upon conviction.

(5) The department shall not issue the Seattle NHL hockey special license plate until the department receives signature sheets satisfying the requirements identified in RCW 46.18.110(2)(f).

7 (3) Except as otherwise provided in this section, only the 8 director or the director's designee may authorize expenditures from 9 the accounts described in subsection (2) of this section. The 10 accounts are subject to allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW, 11 but an appropriation is not required for expenditures.

(4) Except as otherwise provided in this section, funds in the special license plate accounts described in subsection (2) of this section must be disbursed subject to the conditions described in subsection (2) of this section and under contract between the department and qualified nonprofit organizations that provide the services described in subsection (2) of this section.

(5) Funds from the Seattle Seahawks account may be provided to the Washington state leadership board solely for the purpose of administering the Washington world fellows program. Of the amounts received by the Washington state leadership board under this subsection, at least ((ninety)) <u>90</u> percent must be provided as fellowships under the program.

(6) Beginning January 1, 2019, funds from the Seattle Mariners
account may be provided to the Washington state leadership board
solely for the purpose of administering the sports mentoring program.
Of the amounts received by the Washington state leadership board, at
least ((ninety)) <u>90</u> percent must be applied towards services directly
provided to youth participants.

30 (7) For the purposes of this section, a "qualified nonprofit 31 organization" means a not-for-profit corporation operating in 32 Washington that has received a determination of tax exempt status 33 under 26 U.S.C. Sec. 501(c)(3). The qualified nonprofit organization 34 must meet all the requirements under RCW 46.18.100(1).

35 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 46.04 36 RCW to read as follows:

p. 17

1 "LeMay-America's Car Museum license plates" means special license
2 plates issued under RCW 46.18.200 that display a style homage to
3 classic Washington automobile plates.

4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. This act takes effect October 1, 2023.
