SENATE BILL 5909

State of Washington 68th Legislature 2024 Regular Session

AN ACT Relating to electric vehicle impoundment and storage; amending RCW 82.44.200; adding a new chapter to Title 46 RCW; creating a new section; and providing an expiration date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. (1) The legislature finds that:

(a) Accelerated adoption of electric vehicles in Washington, as
intended by state policies, has required registered tow truck
operators to expeditiously address novel issues specific to the
towing, transport, and storage of electric vehicles;

10 (b) Traditional methods of towing gas-powered motor vehicles that 11 leave a vehicle's wheels on the road can be ineffective and damaging 12 to electric vehicles. Such methods generate unused electric vehicle battery power, which can lead to damage to both the electric vehicle 13 14 battery and the motor. To prevent this damage the recommended method 15 of towing an electric vehicle is on a flatbed truck, which can be 16 more expensive and are often less maneuverable than wheel lift 17 trucks;

(c) The dangers related to electric vehicle battery combustion have further rendered traditional methods of vehicle storage inadequate. The potential for reignition, sometimes up to weeks after the initial recovery, and the nature of battery fires as compared to 1 typical vehicle fires calls for registered tow truck operators to 2 implement mitigation and prevention efforts on a scale that operators 3 have not previously been required to address; and

4 (d) Damage from electric vehicle fires poses a hazard to the
5 health and safety of citizens, business owners, and the environment.
6 Proper towing, transport, and storage of electric vehicles is
7 essential to reduce these impacts.

8 (2) Therefore, it is the intent of the legislature with this act 9 to provide adequate support necessary to ensure registered tow truck 10 operators are sufficiently prepared for the influx of electric 11 vehicles as promoted by state policies and to protect the health and 12 safety of our state's citizens and the environment.

13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. (1) A registered tow truck operator may 14 apply to the department on a form prescribed by the department for 15 cost reimbursement for the towing, transport, and storage of electric 16 vehicles from public or private property.

17 (2) The department may only use funds as authorized under RCW 18 82.44.200 for cost reimbursement for the towing, transport, and 19 storage of electric vehicles. The department may not authorize 20 reimbursements that total more than \$10,000 per vehicle for which 21 cost reimbursements are requested.

(3) The department may adopt rules including, but not limited to, application form and contents, and cost reimbursement and the reimbursement process, to implement this section.

(4) For the purposes of this section, "electric vehicle" means any passenger car, light duty truck, and medium duty passenger vehicle that:

(a) Is exclusively powered by a clean alternative fuel as definedin RCW 82.08.9999(5); or

30 (b) Uses at least one method of propulsion that is capable of 31 being reenergized by an external source of electricity and is capable 32 of traveling at least 30 miles using only battery power.

33 Sec. 3. RCW 82.44.200 and 2023 c 472 s 718 are each amended to 34 read as follows:

35 The electric vehicle account is created in the transportation 36 infrastructure account. Proceeds from the principal and interest 37 payments made on loans from the account must be deposited into the 38 account. Expenditures from the account may be used only for the 1 purposes specified in RCW 47.04.350, 82.08.9999, and 82.12.9999, section 2 of this act, and the support of other transportation 2 electrification and alternative fuel related purposes, including RCW 3 47.01.520. Moneys in the account may be spent only after 4 appropriation. During the 2021-2023 and 2023-2025 fiscal biennia, the 5 6 legislature may direct the state treasurer to make transfers of moneys in the electric vehicle account to the move ahead WA flexible 7 account and multimodal transportation account. 8

9 Sec. 4. (1) The department of commerce must NEW SECTION. 10 establish a program to award grants to registered tow truck operators 11 for the purpose of retrofitting storage facilities to provide for additional facility protections to accommodate electric vehicles 12 13 including, but not limited to, the installation of containment bays constructed of concrete ecology blocks, or other storage facilities 14 15 approved or recommended by the national highway traffic safety 16 administration.

17 (2) This section expires July 1, 2027.

18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. Sections 1 and 2 of this act constitute a 19 new chapter in Title 46 RCW.
