- AN ACT Relating to prohibiting the use of hog-tying; adding a new section to chapter 10.116 RCW; creating a new section; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- The legislature finds it is imperative 5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. that our criminal justice systems, including the law enforcement 6 7 profession, must secure public trust and ensure accountability. In 8 order to do so, the legislature finds that it is important 9 discontinue practices and tactics that dehumanize and create unnecessary risk of harm and/or death to the people they serve. 10 11 Additionally, it is important that law enforcement is using up-to-12 date tactics that come with adequate training from the criminal 13 justice training commission to ensure continuity and oversight in the 14 standards applied across the profession. This includes tactics that 15 comply with the model use of force policies put forward by our 16 state's attorney general.

The legislature finds that, in the quest to ensure that all communities are and feel safe, it is important to take guidance from published model policies, comport with statewide standards and training on restraint tactics, and prohibit hog-tying and other

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- 1 similar tactics that are inhumane, outdated, and have led to the
- 2 unnecessary loss of human life.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 10.116 4 RCW to read as follows:
 - (1) A peace officer is prohibited from:
- 6 (a) Hog-tying a person; or

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- 7 (b) Assisting in putting a person into a hog-tie.
- 8 (2) Hog-tying shall constitute the use of excessive force for the purposes of RCW 10.93.190.
- 10 (3) For purposes of this section, "hog-tie" or "hog-tying" means
 11 maximum prone restraint with knees flexed and wrists handcuffed
 12 behind the back and secured to bound ankles. "Hog-tie" or "hog-tying"
 13 does not include the following:
- 14 (a) Use of transport chains or waist chains to transport 15 prisoners; or
- 16 (b) Use of a product or device that does not require the person's
 17 knees to be flexed while their wrists are handcuffed behind the back
 18 and secured to bound ankles.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect immediately.

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
