## SENATE BILL 6169

State of Washington 68th Legislature 2024 Regular Session

1 AN ACT Relating to increasing the potential pool of law 2 enforcement hires by allowing active and retired law enforcement and 3 military personnel to import certain firearms for personal use; 4 amending RCW 9.41.390; and declaring an emergency.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 Sec. 1. RCW 9.41.390 and 2023 c 162 s 3 are each amended to read 7 as follows:

8 (1) No person in this state may manufacture, import, distribute, 9 sell, or offer for sale any assault weapon, except as authorized in 10 this section.

11 (2) Subsection (1) of this section does not apply to any of the 12 following:

(a) The manufacture, importation, distribution, offer for sale,
or sale of an assault weapon by a licensed firearms manufacturer for
the purposes of sale to any branch of the armed forces of the United
States or the state of Washington, or to any law enforcement agency
for use by that agency or its employees for law enforcement purposes,
or to a person who does not reside in this state;

(b) The importation, distribution, offer for sale, or sale of an assault weapon by a dealer that is properly licensed under federal and state law for the purpose of sale to any branch of the armed 1 forces of the United States or the state of Washington, or to a law 2 enforcement agency in this state for use by that agency or its 3 employees for law enforcement purposes;

(c) The distribution, offer for sale, or sale of an assault 4 weapon to or by a dealer that is properly licensed under federal and 5 6 state law where the dealer acquires the assault weapon from an individual legally authorized to possess or transfer the assault 7 weapon for the purpose of selling or transferring the assault weapon 8 to a person who does not reside in this state. The purpose of this 9 section is to allow individuals who no longer wish to own an assault 10 weapon to sell their assault weapon and is not intended to allow 11 12 Washington dealers to purchase assault weapons wholesale for the purpose of selling a stock or inventory of assault weapons online or 13 14 in person to nonresidents;

(d) The out-of-state sale or transfer of the existing stock of assault weapons owned by a licensed dealer that was acquired prior to January 1, 2023, for the limited period of 90 days after April 25, 2023; ((<del>or</del>))

(e) The receipt of an assault weapon by a person who, on or after 19 20 April 25, 2023, acquires possession of the assault weapon by operation of law upon the death of the former owner who was in legal 21 possession of the assault weapon, provided the person in possession 22 of the assault weapon can establish such provenance. Receipt under 23 this subsection (2)(e) is not "distribution" under this chapter. A 24 25 person who legally receives an assault weapon under this subsection 26 (2) (e) may not sell or transfer the assault weapon to any other person in this state other than to a licensed dealer, to a federally 27 28 licensed gunsmith for the purpose of service or repair, or to a law 29 enforcement agency for the purpose of permanently relinquishing the 30 assault weapon; or

31 (f) Active and retired law enforcement officers, active duty 32 military personnel, honorably discharged veterans, and federal 33 employees who receive a change of station order or are directed to 34 move to Washington state by their respective federal agency, solely 35 for the purpose of importing and retaining for personal use, assault 36 weapons owned prior to receiving orders directing a change of station 37 or move to Washington state.

38 (3) For the purposes of this section, "law enforcement agency" 39 means any (a) general authority Washington law enforcement agency as 40 defined in RCW 10.93.020; (b) limited authority Washington law

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enforcement agency as defined in RCW 10.93.020; or (c) equivalent federal, state, or local law enforcement agency in the United States. (4) A person who violates this section is guilty of a gross misdemeanor.

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate 6 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of 7 the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes 8 effect immediately.

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
