1 AN ACT Relating to providing a sales and use tax exemption 2 related to internet and telecommunications infrastructure projects 3 involving a federally recognized Indian tribe; adding new sections to 4 chapter 82.08 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 82.12 RCW; 5 creating a new section; providing an effective date; providing 6 expiration dates; and declaring an emergency.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 82.08 9 RCW to read as follows:

10 (1) Subject to the requirements of this section, the tax levied 11 by RCW 82.08.020 does not apply to sales of, or charges made for:

12 (a) Labor and services rendered in respect to the construction of 13 a qualified infrastructure project, or the installation of any 14 equipment or tangible personal property incorporated into a qualified 15 infrastructure project; and

16 Building materials, telecommunications equipment, and (b) 17 tangible personal property incorporated into а qualified 18 infrastructure project.

19 (2) The exemption provided in subsection (1) of this section does20 not apply to local sales taxes.

1 (3) (a) In order to obtain an exemption certificate under this section, a qualified infrastructure project owner must submit an 2 application to the department for an exemption certificate. The 3 application must include the information necessary, as required by 4 the department, to determine that the qualified infrastructure 5 6 project owner qualifies for the exemption under this section. The department must issue an exemption certificate to a qualified 7 infrastructure project owner. 8

9 (b) In order to claim an exemption under this section, a 10 qualified infrastructure project owner must provide the seller with 11 an exemption certificate in a form and manner prescribed by the 12 department. The seller must retain a copy of the certificate for the 13 seller's files.

14 (c) The exemption certificate is effective on the date the 15 application is received by the department, which is the date of 16 issuance. The exemption provided in this section does not apply to 17 any property or services that are received by the qualified 18 infrastructure project owner, or its agent, before the effective date 19 of this section or on or after January 1, 2030. For the purpose of 20 this subsection (3)(c), "received" means:

(i) Taking physical possession of, or having dominion and control
 over, the tangible personal property eligible for the exemption in
 subsection (1) (b) of this section; and

24 (ii) The labor and services in subsection (1)(a) of this section 25 have been performed.

(d) The exemption certificate expires on the date the project is certified as operationally complete by the qualified infrastructure project owner or January 1, 2030, whichever is first. The qualified infrastructure project owner must notify the department, in a form and manner as required by the department, when the project is certified as operationally complete.

32 (4) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout this33 section unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

34 (a) "Local sales tax" means a sales tax imposed by a local35 government under the authority of chapter 82.14 or 81.104 RCW.

36 (b) "Operationally complete" means the qualified infrastructure 37 project is capable of being used for its intended purpose as 38 described in the exemption certificate application.

39 (c) "Qualified infrastructure project" means the construction of 40 buildings and utilities related to the deployment of a modern global

internet and telecommunications infrastructure that occurs in part in a distressed area, as defined in RCW 43.168.020, that is located on the coast of Washington. The infrastructure may include, but is not limited to, cable landing stations, communications hubs, buried utility connections and extension, and any related equipment and buildings that will add broadband capacity and infrastructure to the area.

8 (d) "Qualified infrastructure project owner" means a wholly owned 9 subsidiary of a federally recognized tribe located in a county that 10 borders the Pacific Ocean that is developing a qualified 11 infrastructure project.

12 (5) The total amount of state sales and use tax exempted under this section and section 2 of this act may not exceed \$8,000,000. A 13 14 qualified infrastructure project owner within 60 days of the expiration of the exemption certificate under subsection (3)(d) of 15 16 this section must pay any tax due under this subsection. The 17 department may not assess penalties and interest as provided in chapter 82.32 RCW on the amount due if the amount due is paid within 18 19 the 60-day period, or any extension thereof. The department may require a qualified infrastructure project owner to periodically 20 21 submit documentation, as specified by the department, prior to the 22 expiration of the exemption certificate to allow the department to 23 track the total amount of sales and use tax exempted under this section and section 2 of this act. 24

(6) This section expires January 1, 2030.

26 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 82.12 27 RCW to read as follows:

(1) Provided an exemption certificate has been issued pursuant to
 section 1 of this act, the provisions of this chapter do not apply
 with respect to the use of:

31 (a) Labor and services rendered in respect to the installation of 32 any equipment or other tangible personal property incorporated into a 33 qualified infrastructure project; and

34 (b) Building materials, telecommunications equipment, and 35 tangible personal property incorporated into a qualified 36 infrastructure project.

37 (2) The exemption provided in subsection (1) of this section does38 not apply to local use taxes.

(3) All of the eligibility requirements, conditions, limitations,
 and definitions in section 1 of this act apply to this section.

3 (4) For purposes of this section, "local use tax" means a use tax
4 imposed by a local government under the authority of chapter 82.14 or
5 81.104 RCW.

(5) This section expires January 1, 2030.

7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 82.08
8 RCW to read as follows:

(1) In order to obtain the exemption provided in this act, a 9 10 qualified infrastructure project owner must certify to the department of labor and industries that the work performed on the qualified 11 infrastructure project by the prime contractor and its subcontractors 12 was performed under the terms of a community workforce agreement or 13 project labor agreement negotiated prior to the start of the 14 15 qualified infrastructure project. The agreements must include worker 16 compensation requirements consistent with the payment of area 17 standard prevailing wages in accordance with chapter 39.12 RCW, 18 apprenticeship utilization requirements, and tribal employment and contracting opportunities, provided the following: 19

20 (a) The owner and the prime contractor and all of its subcontractors regardless of tier have the absolute right to select 21 any qualified and responsible bidder for the award of contracts on a 22 specified project without reference to the existence or nonexistence 23 24 of any agreements between such bidder and any party to such project 25 labor agreement, and only when such bidder is willing, ready, and 26 able to become a party to, signs a letter of assent, and complies 27 with such agreement or agreements, should it be designated the 28 successful bidder; and

(b) It is understood that this is a self-contained, stand-alone agreement, and that by virtue of having become bound to such agreement or agreements, neither the project contractor nor the subcontractors are obligated to sign any other local, area, or national agreement.

34 (2) This section expires January 1, 2030.

35 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. RCW 82.32.808 does not apply to this act.

36 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. This act is necessary for the immediate 37 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of
