14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

15 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) A capital budget is hereby adopted
16 and, subject to the provisions set forth in this act, the several
17 dollar amounts hereinafter specified, or so much thereof as shall be
18 sufficient to accomplish the purposes designated, are hereby
19 appropriated and authorized to be incurred for capital projects
20 during the period beginning with the effective date of this act and
21 ending June 30, 2025, out of the several funds specified in this act.

1 (2) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout this act
2 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

3 (a) "Fiscal year 2024" or "FY 2024" means the period beginning
4 July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024.

5 (b) "Fiscal year 2025" or "FY 2025" means the period beginning
6 July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025.

7 (c) "Lapse" or "revert" means the amount shall return to an
8 unappropriated status.

9 (d) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spent
10 only for the specified purpose.

11 (3) Unless otherwise specifically authorized in this act, any
12 portion of an amount provided solely for a specified purpose that is
13 not expended subject to the specified conditions and limitations to
14 fulfill the specified purpose shall lapse.

15 (4) The amounts shown under the headings "Prior Biennia," "Future
16 Biennia," and "Total" in this act are for informational purposes only
17 and do not constitute legislative approval of these amounts. "Prior
18 biennia" typically refers to the immediate prior biennium for
19 reappropriations, but may refer to multiple biennia in the case of
20 specific projects. A "future biennia" amount is an estimate of what
21 may be appropriated for the project or program in the 2025-2027
22 biennium and the following three biennia; an amount of zero does not
23 necessarily constitute legislative intent to not provide funding for
24 the project or program in the future.

25 (5) "Reappropriations" in this act are appropriations and, unless
26 the context clearly provides otherwise, are subject to the relevant
27 conditions and limitations applicable to appropriations.
28 Reappropriations shall be limited to the unexpended balances
29 remaining on June 30, 2023, from the 2021-2023 biennial
30 appropriations for each project.

4 solely for grants to local governments, public higher education
5 institutions, school districts, tribal governments, and state
6 agencies for improvements to facilities and related projects that
7 result in energy and operational cost savings.

8 (a) At least 20 percent of each competitive grant round is
9 designated for award to eligible projects in small cities or towns
10 with a population of 5,000 or fewer residents.

11 (b) In each competitive round, a higher energy savings to
12 investment ratio must result in a higher project ranking. Priority
13 consideration must be given to applicants that have not received
14 grant awards for this purpose in prior biennia.

15 (c) The department must determine a minimum match ratio to
16 maximize the leverage of nonstate funds.

17 (2) \$22,500,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided
18 solely for grants to be awarded in competitive rounds to local
19 governments, public higher education institutions, school districts,
20 tribal governments, and state agencies for projects that involve the
21 purchase and installation of solar energy systems, including solar
22 modules and inverters, with a preference for products manufactured in
23 Washington.

24 (a) At least 20 percent of each competitive grant round is
25 designated for award to eligible projects in small cities or towns
26 with a population of 5,000 or fewer residents.

27 (b) In each competitive round, a higher energy savings to
28 investment ratio must result in a higher project ranking. Priority
29 consideration must be given to applicants that have not received
30 grant awards for this purpose in prior biennia.

31 (c) The department must determine a minimum match ratio to
32 maximize the leverage of nonstate funds.

33 (3) \$5,000,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided
34 solely for the energy efficiency and environmental performance
35 improvements to minor works, stand-alone, and emergency projects at
36 facilities owned by agencies that repair or replace existing building
37 systems and reduce greenhouse gas emissions from state operations,
38 including, but not limited to, HVAC, lighting, insulation, windows,
39 and other mechanical systems. Eligibility for this funding is

1 dependent on an analysis using the office of financial management's
2 life-cycle cost tool that compares project design alternatives for
3 initial and long-term cost-effectiveness. Assuming a reasonable
4 return on investment, the department shall provide grants in the
5 amount required to improve the project's energy efficiency compared
6 to the original project request.

7 (4) The department shall develop metrics that indicate the
8 performance of energy efficiency efforts.

9 (5) If a grant is provided in subsection (1) or (3) of this
10 section to purchase heating devices or systems, the agency must,
11 whenever possible and most cost effective, select devices and systems
12 that do not use fossil fuels.

13 (6) Grants provided in subsections (1), (2), and (3) of this
14 section to state agencies are exempt from the match requirements in
15 this section.

4 electric equipment program consistent with the following:

5 (a) Aid the transition of residential and commercial buildings
6 away from fossil fuels by providing education and outreach resources
7 for the installation of high efficiency electric heat pumps and other
8 high efficiency electric equipment;

9 (b) Provide grants, coordination, and technical assistance to
10 eligible third-party administrators to promote the adoption of high-
11 efficiency electric heat pump equipment for space and water heating;
12 and

13 (c) Develop strategies to ensure that the program serves low-
14 income households, vulnerable populations, and overburdened
15 communities, including dedicating a portion of the program funding
16 for this purpose. For the purposes of this subsection (2)(c),
17 "overburdened communities" has the same meaning as defined in RCW
18 70A.65.010.

19 (3) For the purposes of this section, "eligible third-party
20 administrators" include, but are not limited to, nonprofits,
21 utilities, housing providers, community action agencies and

29 (2) The department must establish a competitive process to
30 solicit proposals for and prioritize projects whose primary objective
31 is to assist libraries operated by governmental units, as defined in
32 RCW 27.12.010, in acquiring, constructing, repairing, or
33 rehabilitating facilities.

34 (3) The department must establish a committee to develop the
35 grant program criteria established under subsection (2) of this
36 section and review proposals. The committee must be composed of five
37 members as provided in this subsection. The committee must include:

1 (a) A representative from the department of commerce; (b) a
2 representative from the department of archaeology and historic
3 preservation; (c) the state librarian; (d) a representative from a
4 library district; and (e) a representative from a municipal library.

5 (4) The department must conduct a statewide solicitation of
6 project applications. The department must evaluate and rank
7 applications in consultation with the committee established in
8 subsection (3) of this section, using objective criteria. The ranking
9 of projects must prioritize library district facilities listed on a
10 local, state, or federal register of historic places and those
11 located in distressed or rural counties. The evaluation and ranking
12 process must also include an examination of existing assets that
13 applicants propose to apply to projects. Grant assistance under this
14 section may not exceed 50 percent of the total cost of the project.
15 The nonstate portion of the total project cost may include cash, the
16 value of real property when acquired solely for the purpose of the
17 project, and in-kind contributions.

18 (5) The department must submit a prioritized list of recommended
19 projects to the governor and the legislature by October 1, 2024, for
20 inclusion in the department of commerce's 2025-2027 biennial capital
21 budget request. The list must include a description of each project,
22 the amount of recommended state funding, and documentation of
23 nonstate funds to be used for the project. Individual grants may not
24 exceed \$2,000,000. The total amount of recommended state funding for
25 the projects on a biennial project list may not exceed \$10,000,000.

26 (6) In contracts for grants authorized under this section, the
27 department must include provisions that require that capital
28 improvements be held by the grantee for a specified period of time
29 appropriate to the amount of the grant and that facilities be used
30 for the express purpose of the grant. If the grantee is found to be
31 out of compliance with provisions of the contract, the grantee must
32 repay to the state general fund the principal amount of the grant
33 plus interest calculated at the rate of interest on state of
34 Washington general obligation bonds issued on the date most close in
35 time to the date of authorization of the grant.

36 (7) The department must assist grant recipients under this
37 section to apply for applicable competitive federal grant funding
38 and, upon receipt of any such funding, an equal amount of the state
39 building construction account—state appropriation must be placed in
40 unallotted status.

23 (1) The appropriation in this section is provided solely for the
24 department to issue grants to community hospitals or other community
25 providers to expand and establish new capacity for behavioral health
26 services in communities. The department must consult an advisory
27 group consisting of representatives from the department of social and
28 health services, the health care authority, one representative from a
29 managed care organization, one representative from an accountable
30 care organization, and one representative from the association of
31 county human services. Amounts provided in this section may be used
32 for construction and equipment costs associated with establishment or
33 preservation of the facilities. The department may approve funding
34 for the acquisition of a facility if the project will result in
35 increased behavioral health capacity. Amounts provided in this
36 section may not be used for operating costs associated with the
37 treatment of patients using these services.

1 (2) In awarding funding for projects in subsection (5) of this
2 section, the department must establish criteria for the issuance of

3 solely for minor renovation grants.

4 (2) \$42,050,000 of the Ruth Lecocq Kagi early learning facilities
5 development account—state appropriation in this section is provided
6 solely for the early learning facility grant and loan program,
7 subject to the provisions of RCW 43.31.573 through 43.31.583 and
8 43.84.092, to provide state assistance for designing, constructing,
9 purchasing, expanding, or modernizing public or private early
10 learning education facilities for eligible organizations. Up to four
11 percent of the funding in this subsection may be used by the

9 (a) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Grays Harbor
10 College for up to \$3,200,000 plus financing expenses and required
11 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to construct a student
12 services and instructional building.

13 (b) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Shoreline
14 Community College for up to \$3,128,000 plus financing expenses and
15 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to construct an
16 allied health, science, and manufacturing replacement building.

17 (c) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of South Puget
18 Sound Community College for up to \$5,000,000 plus financing expenses
19 and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to renovate a
20 health education building.

21 (d) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Bates Technical
22 College for up to \$1,350,000 plus financing expenses and required
23 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to purchase land and
24 facilities.

25 (7) The department of ecology: Enter into a financing contract
26 for up to \$3,797,000 plus financing expenses and required reserves
27 pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW for the Lacey headquarters parking
28 garage preservation project.

2 **MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS**

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8001.** RCW 43.88.031 requires the disclosure
4 of the estimated debt service costs associated with new capital bond
5 appropriations. The estimated debt service costs for the
6 appropriations contained in this act are \$59,934,000 for the
7 2023-2025 biennium, \$371,683,000 for the 2025-2027 biennium, and
8 \$519,454,000 for the 2027-2029 biennium.

9 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8002.** ACQUISITION OF PROPERTIES AND
10 FACILITIES THROUGH FINANCIAL CONTRACTS. (1) The following agencies
11 may enter into financial contracts, paid from any funds of an agency,
12 appropriated or nonappropriated, for the purposes indicated and in
13 not more than the principal amounts indicated, plus financing
14 expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW. When
15 securing properties under this section, agencies shall use the most
16 economical financial contract option available, including long-term
17 leases, lease-purchase agreements, lease-development with option to
18 purchase agreements or financial contracts using certificates of
19 participation. Expenditures made by an agency for one of the
20 indicated purposes before the issue date of the authorized financial
21 contract and any certificates of participation therein are intended
22 to be reimbursed from proceeds of the financial contract and any
23 certificates of participation therein to the extent provided in the
24 agency's financing plan approved by the state finance committee.

25 (2) Those noninstructional facilities of higher education
26 institutions authorized in this section to enter into financial
27 contracts are not eligible for state funded maintenance and
28 operations. Instructional space that is available for regularly
29 scheduled classes for academic transfer, basic skills, and workforce
30 training programs may be eligible for state funded maintenance and
31 operations.

32 (3) Secretary of state: Enter into a financing contract for up to
33 \$119,000,000 plus financing expenses, required reserves, and
34 capitalized interest pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to construct a new
35 library-archives building.

36 (4) Department of social and health services: Enter into a
37 financing contract for up to \$175,888,000 plus costs and financing
38 expenses, required reserves, and capitalized interest pursuant to

1 chapter 39.94 RCW to construct a nursing facility on the Fircrest
2 residential habilitation center campus. The department may contract
3 to lease develop or lease purchase the facility. Before entering into
4 a contract, the department must consult with the office of financial
5 management and the office of the state treasurer. Should the
6 department of social and health services choose to use a financing
7 contract that does not provide for the issuance of certificates of
8 participation, the financing contract shall be subject to approval by
9 the state finance committee as required by RCW 39.94.010. In
10 approving a financing contract not providing for the use of
11 certificates of participation, the state finance committee should be
12 reasonably certain that the contract is excluded from the computation
13 of indebtedness, particularly that the contract is not backed by the
14 full faith and credit of the state and the legislature is expressly
15 not obligated to appropriate funds to make payments. For purposes of
16 this subsection, "financing contract" includes but is not limited to
17 a certificate of participation and tax exempt financing similar to
18 that authorized in RCW 47.79.140.

19 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8003.** (1) To ensure that major construction
20 projects are carried out in accordance with legislative and executive
21 intent, agencies must complete a predesign for state construction
22 projects with a total anticipated cost in excess of \$10,000,000. For
23 purposes of this section, "total anticipated cost" means the sum of
24 the anticipated cost of the predesign, design, and construction
25 phases of the project.

26 (2) Appropriations for design may not be expended or encumbered
27 until the office of financial management has reviewed and approved
28 the agency's predesign.

29 (3) The predesign must explore at least three project
30 alternatives. These alternatives must be both distinctly different
31 and viable solutions to the issue being addressed. The chosen
32 alternative should be the most reasonable and cost-effective
33 solution. The predesign document must include, but not be limited to,
34 program, site, and cost analysis, and an analysis of the life-cycle
35 costs of the alternatives explored, in accordance with the predesign
36 manual adopted by the office of financial management.

37 (4) For projects exceeding the \$10,000,000 predesign threshold
38 established in this section, the office of financial management may
39 make an exception to some or all of the predesign requirements in

1 this section. The office of financial management shall report any
2 exception to the fiscal committees of the legislature:

3 (a) A description of the major capital project for which the
4 predesign waiver is made;

5 (b) An explanation of the reason for the waiver; and

6 (c) A rough order of magnitude cost estimate for the project's
7 design and construction.

8 (5) In deliberations related to submitting an exception under
9 this section, the office of financial management shall consider the
10 following factors:

11 (a) Whether there is any determination to be made regarding the
12 site of the project;

13 (b) Whether there is any determination to be made regarding
14 whether the project will involve renovation, new construction, or
15 both;

16 (c) Whether, within six years of submitting the request for
17 funding, the agency has completed, or initiated the construction of,
18 a substantially similar project;

19 (d) Whether there is any anticipated change to the project's
20 program or the services to be delivered at the facility;

21 (e) Whether the requesting agency indicates that the project may
22 not require some or all of the predesign requirements in this section
23 due to a lack of complexity; and

24 (f) Whether any other factors related to project complexity or
25 risk, as determined by the office of financial management, could
26 reduce the need for, or scope of, a predesign.

27 (6) If under this section, some or all predesign requirements are
28 waived, the office of financial management may instead propose a
29 professional project cost estimate instead of a request for predesign
30 funding.

31 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8004.** (1) The legislature finds that use of
32 life-cycle cost analysis will aid public entities, architects,
33 engineers, and contractors in making design and construction
34 decisions that positively impact both the initial construction cost
35 and the ongoing operating and maintenance cost of a project. To
36 ensure that the total cost of a project is accounted for and the most
37 reasonable and cost-efficient design is used, agencies shall develop
38 life-cycle costs for any construction project over \$10,000,000. The
39 life-cycle costs must represent the present value sum of capital

1 costs, installation costs, operating costs, and maintenance costs
2 over the life expectancy of the project. The legislature further
3 finds the most effective approach to the life-cycle cost analysis is
4 to integrate it into the early part of the design process.

5 (2) Agencies must develop a minimum of three project alternatives
6 for use in the life-cycle cost analysis. These alternatives must be
7 both distinctly different and viable solutions to the issue being
8 addressed. Agencies must choose the most reasonable and cost-
9 effective solution, as supported by the life-cycle cost analysis. A
10 brief description of each project alternative and why it was chosen
11 must be included in the life-cycle cost analysis section of the
12 predesign.

13 (3) The office of financial management shall: (a) Make available
14 a life-cycle cost model to be used for analysis; (b) in consultation
15 with the department of enterprise services, provide assistance in
16 using the life-cycle cost model; and (c) update the life-cycle cost
17 model annually including assumptions for inflation rates, discount
18 rates, and energy rates.

19 (4) Agencies shall consider architectural and engineering firms'
20 and general contractors' experience using life-cycle costs, operating
21 costs, and energy efficiency measures when selecting an architectural
22 and engineering firm, or when selecting contractors using alternative
23 contracting methods.

24 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8005.** Agencies administering construction
25 projects with a total anticipated cost in excess of \$10,000,000 must
26 submit progress reports to the office of financial management and to
27 the fiscal committees of the house of representatives and senate.
28 "Total anticipated cost" means the sum of the anticipated cost of the
29 predesign, design, and construction phases of the project. Reports
30 must be submitted on July 1st and December 31st of each year in a
31 format determined by the office of financial management. After the
32 project is completed, agencies must also submit a closeout report
33 that identifies the total project cost and any unspent
34 appropriations.

35 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8006.** (1) Allotments for appropriations in
36 this act shall be provided in accordance with the capital project
37 review requirements adopted by the office of financial management and
38 in compliance with RCW 43.88.110. Projects that will be employing

1 alternative public works construction procedures under chapter 39.10
2 RCW are subject to the allotment procedures defined in this section
3 and RCW 43.88.110.

4 (2) Each project is defined as proposed in the legislative budget
5 notes or in the governor's budget document.

6 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8007.** (1) The office of financial management
7 may authorize a transfer of appropriation authority provided for a
8 capital project that is in excess of the amount required for the
9 completion of such project to another capital project for which the
10 appropriation is insufficient. No such transfer may be used to expand
11 the capacity of any facility beyond that intended in making the
12 appropriation. Such transfers may be effected only between capital
13 appropriations to a specific department, commission, agency, or
14 institution of higher education and only between capital projects
15 that are funded from the same fund or account. No transfers may occur
16 between projects to local government agencies except where the grants
17 are provided within a single omnibus appropriation and where such
18 transfers are specifically authorized by the implementing statutes
19 that govern the grants.

20 (2) The office of financial management may find that an amount is
21 in excess of the amount required for the completion of a project only
22 if: (a) The project as defined in the notes to the budget document is
23 substantially complete and there are funds remaining; or (b) bids
24 have been let on a project and it appears to a substantial certainty
25 that the project as defined in the notes to the budget document can
26 be completed within the biennium for less than the amount
27 appropriated in this act.

28 (3) For the purposes of this section, the intent is that each
29 project be defined as proposed to the legislature in the governor's
30 budget document, unless it clearly appears from the legislative
31 history that the legislature intended to define the scope of a
32 project in a different way.

33 (4) A report of any transfer effected under this section, except
34 emergency projects or any transfer under \$250,000, shall be filed
35 with the fiscal committees of the legislature by the office of
36 financial management at least 30 days before the date the transfer is
37 effected. The office of financial management shall report all
38 emergency or smaller transfers within 30 days from the date of
39 transfer.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8008.** (1) It is expected that projects be
2 ready to proceed in a timely manner depending on the type or phase of
3 the project or program that is the subject of the appropriation in
4 this act. Except for major projects that customarily may take more
5 than two biennia to complete from predesign to the end of
6 construction, or large infrastructure grant or loan programs
7 supporting projects that often take more than two biennia to
8 complete, the legislature generally does not intend to reappropriate
9 funds more than once, particularly for smaller grant programs, local/
10 community projects, and minor works.

11 (2) Agencies shall expedite the expenditure of reappropriations
12 and appropriations in this act in order to: (a) Rehabilitate
13 infrastructure resources; (b) accelerate environmental rehabilitation
14 and restoration projects for the improvement of the state's natural
15 environment; (c) reduce additional costs associated with acquisition
16 and construction inflationary pressures; and (d) provide additional
17 employment opportunities associated with capital expenditures.

18 (3) To the extent feasible, agencies are directed to accelerate
19 expenditure rates at their current level of permanent employees and
20 shall use contracted design and construction services wherever
21 necessary to meet the goals of this section.

22 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8009.** Any building project that receives over
23 \$10,000,000 in funding from the capital budget must be built to
24 sustainable standards. "Sustainable building" means a building that
25 integrates and optimizes all major high-performance building
26 attributes, including energy efficiency, durability, life-cycle
27 performance, and occupant productivity, and minimizes greenhouse gas
28 emissions. The following design and construction attributes must be
29 integrated into the building project:

30 (1) Employ integrated design principles: Use a collaborative,
31 integrated planning and design process that initiates and maintains
32 an integrated project team in all stages of a project's planning and
33 delivery. Establish performance goals for siting, energy, water,
34 materials, and indoor environmental quality along with other
35 comprehensive design goals and ensures incorporation of these goals
36 throughout the design and life-cycle of the building. Consider all
37 stages of the building's life-cycle, including deconstruction.

38 (2) Commissioning: Employ commissioning practices tailored to the
39 size and complexity of the building and its system components in

1 order to verify performance of building components and systems and
2 help ensure that design requirements are met. This should include an
3 experienced commissioning provider, inclusion of commissioning
4 requirements in construction documents, a commissioning plan,
5 verification of the installation and performance of systems to be
6 commissioned, and a commissioning report.

7 (3) Optimize energy performance: Establish a whole building
8 performance target that takes into account the intended use,
9 occupancy, operations, plug loads, other energy demands, and design
10 to earn the ENERGY STAR targets for new construction and major
11 renovation where applicable. For new construction target low energy
12 use index. For major renovations, target reducing energy use by 50
13 percent below prerenovations baseline.

14 (4) On-site renewable energy: Implement renewable energy
15 generation projects on agency property for agency use, when life-
16 cycle cost effective.

17 (5) High-efficiency electric equipment: Use only high-efficiency
18 electric equipment for water and space heating needs not met through
19 on-site renewable energy, when life-cycle cost effective.

20 (6) Measurement and verification: For buildings over 50,000
21 square feet, install building level electricity meters in new major
22 construction and renovation projects to track and continuously
23 optimize performance. Include equivalent meters for natural gas and
24 steam, where natural gas and steam are used. Where appropriate,
25 install dashboards inside buildings to display and incentivize
26 occupants on energy use.

27 (7) Benchmarking: Compare performance data from the first year of
28 operation with the energy design target. Verify that the building
29 performance meets or exceeds the design target. For other building
30 and space types, use an equivalent benchmarking tool.

31 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8010.** State agencies, including institutions
32 of higher education, shall allot and report full-time equivalent
33 staff for capital projects in a manner comparable to staff reporting
34 for operating expenditures.

35 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8011.** Executive Order No. 21-02,
36 archaeological and cultural resources, was issued effective April 7,
37 2021. Agencies shall comply with the requirements set forth in this
38 executive order and must consult with the department of archaeology

1 and historic preservation and affected tribes on the potential
2 effects of projects on cultural resources and historic properties
3 proposed in state-funded construction or acquisition projects,
4 including grant or pass-through funding that culminates in
5 construction or land acquisitions. Consultation with the department
6 of archaeology and historic preservation and affected tribes must be
7 initiated early in the project planning process, prior to
8 construction or taking title.

9 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8012.** FOR THE ARTS COMMISSION—ART WORK
10 ALLOWANCE. (1) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this
11 act for original construction of school plant facilities is provided
12 solely for the purposes of RCW 28A.335.210.

13 (2) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act
14 for original construction or any major renovation or remodel work
15 exceeding \$200,000 by colleges or universities is provided solely for
16 the purposes of RCW 28B.10.027.

17 (3) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act
18 for original construction of any public building by a state agency
19 identified in RCW 43.17.200 is provided solely for the purposes of
20 RCW 43.17.200.

21 (4) At least 75 percent of the moneys spent by the Washington
22 state arts commission during the 2023-2025 fiscal biennium for the
23 purposes of RCW 28A.335.210, 28B.10.027, and 43.17.200 must be
24 expended solely for direct acquisition of works of art; 20 percent
25 may be expended for program administration; and 5 percent may be
26 expended to conserve or maintain existing pieces in the state art
27 collection.

28 (5) Except for art allocations made under K-3 class size
29 reduction grants under section 6530 of this act, art allocations not
30 expended within the ensuing two fiscal biennia shall lapse.

31 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8013.** To carry out the provisions of this
32 act, the governor may assign responsibility for predesign, design,
33 construction, and other related activities to any appropriate agency.

34 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8014.** If any federal moneys appropriated by
35 this act for capital projects are not received by the state, the
36 department or agency to which the moneys were appropriated may
37 replace the federal moneys with funds available from private or local

1 sources. No replacement may occur under this section without the
2 prior approval of the director of financial management in
3 consultation with the senate ways and means committee and the house
4 of representatives capital budget committee.

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8015.** (1) Unless otherwise stated, for all
6 appropriations under this act that require a match of nonstate money
7 or in-kind contributions, the following requirement, consistent with
8 RCW 43.88.150, shall apply: Expenditures of state money shall be
9 timed so that the state share of project expenditures never exceeds
10 the intended state share of total project costs.

11 (2) Provision of the full amount of required matching funds is
12 not required to permit the expenditure of capital budget
13 appropriations for phased projects if a proportional amount of the
14 required matching funds is provided for each distinct, identifiable
15 phase of the project.

16 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8016.** NONTAXABLE AND TAXABLE BOND PROCEEDS.
17 Portions of the appropriation authority granted by this act from the
18 state building construction account, or any other account receiving
19 bond proceeds, may be transferred to the state taxable building
20 construction account as deemed necessary by the state treasurer, on
21 behalf of the state finance committee, to comply with the federal
22 internal revenue service rules and regulations pertaining to the use
23 of nontaxable bond proceeds. Portions of the general obligation bond
24 proceeds authorized by Substitute House Bill No. 1148 (state general
25 obligation bonds and related accounts) for deposit into the state
26 taxable building construction account that are in excess of amounts
27 required to comply with the federal internal revenue service rules
28 and regulations shall be deposited into the state building
29 construction account. The state treasurer shall submit written
30 notification to the director of financial management and the
31 legislative evaluation and accountability program committee if it is
32 determined that a shift of appropriation authority between the state
33 building construction account, or any other account receiving bond
34 proceeds, and the state taxable building construction account is
35 necessary, or that a shift of appropriation authority from the state
36 taxable building construction account to the state building
37 construction account may be made.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8017.** (1) Minor works project lists are
2 single line appropriations that include multiple projects of a
3 similar nature and that are valued between \$25,000 and \$1,500,000
4 each, with the exception of higher education minor works projects
5 that may be valued up to \$2,000,000. Funds appropriated in this act
6 for minor works may not be initially allotted until agencies submit
7 project lists to the office of financial management for review and
8 approval.

9 (2) Revisions to the project lists, including the addition of
10 projects and the transfer of funds between projects, are allowed but
11 must be submitted to the office of financial management, the house of
12 representatives capital budget committee, and the senate ways and
13 means committee for review and comment, and must include an
14 explanation of variances from prior approved lists. Any project list
15 revisions must be approved by the office of financial management
16 before funds may be expended from the minor works appropriation.

17 (3) (a) All minor works projects should be completed within two
18 years of the appropriation with the funding provided.

19 (b) Agencies are prohibited from including projects on their
20 minor works lists that are a phase of a larger project, and that if
21 combined over a continuous period of time, would exceed \$1,500,000,
22 or \$2,000,000 for higher education minor works projects.

23 (c) Minor works appropriations may not be used for the following:
24 Studies, except for technical or engineering reviews or designs that
25 lead directly to and support a project on the same minor works list;
26 planning; design outside the scope of work on a minor works list;
27 movable, temporary, and traditionally funded operating equipment not
28 in compliance with the equipment criteria established by the office
29 of financial management; software not dedicated to control of a
30 specialized system; moving expenses; land or facility acquisition;
31 rolling stock; computers; or to supplement funding for projects with
32 funding shortfalls unless expressly authorized. The office of
33 financial management may make an exception to the limitations
34 described in this subsection (3) (c) for exigent circumstances after
35 notifying the legislative fiscal committees and waiting 10 days for
36 comments by the legislature regarding the proposed exception.

37 (d) Minor works preservation projects may include program
38 improvements of no more than 25 percent of the individual minor works
39 preservation project cost.

1 (e) Improvements for accessibility in compliance with the
2 Americans with disabilities act may be included in any of the minor
3 works categories.

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8018.** To the extent that any appropriation
5 authorizes expenditures of state funds from the state building
6 construction account, or from any other capital project account in
7 the state treasury, for a capital project or program that is
8 specified to be funded with proceeds from the sale of bonds, the
9 legislature declares that any such expenditures for that project or
10 program made prior to the issue date of the applicable bonds are
11 intended to be reimbursed from proceeds of those bonds in a maximum
12 amount equal to the amount of such appropriation.

13 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8019. FOR THE STATE TREASURER—TRANSFERS**

14 (1) Public Works Assistance Account: For transfer to the
15 water pollution control revolving account—state, up to
16 \$17,500,000 for fiscal year 2024 and up to \$17,500,000
17 for fiscal year 2025. \$35,000,000

18 (2) Public Works Assistance Account: For transfer
19 to the drinking water assistance account—state, up to
20 \$1,750,000 for fiscal year 2024 and up to \$1,750,000
21 for fiscal year 2025. \$3,500,000

22 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8020.** In order to accelerate the reduction of
23 embodied carbon and improve the environmental performance of
24 construction materials, agencies shall, whenever possible, review and
25 consider embodied carbon reported in environmental product
26 declarations when evaluating proposed structural materials for
27 construction projects.

28 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8021.** The department of natural resources, in
29 coordination with the department of social and health services, shall
30 enter into long-term, revenue-generating opportunities for
31 underutilized portions of the Fircrest residential habilitation
32 center bounded by 15th Ave NE and NE 150th Street to benefit the
33 charitable, educational, penal, and reformatory institutions account.
34 Long-term, revenue generating opportunities may include, but are not
35 limited to, land leases, land sales, and land swaps. The department

1 of social and health services and the department of natural resources
2 must amend their lease under chapter 7, Laws of 1986 if necessary to
3 conform with this section.

4 **Sec. 8022.** RCW 28A.320.330 and 2021 c 332 s 7045 are each
5 amended to read as follows:

6 School districts shall establish the following funds in addition

26 (3) Amounts in this section must be increased annually by the
27 United States implicit price deflator for state and local government
28 construction provided by the office of financial management.

29 **Sec. 8032.** RCW 43.82.010 and 2018 c 217 s 7 are each amended to
30 read as follows:

31 (1) The director of enterprise services, on behalf of the agency
32 involved and after consultation with the office of financial
33 management, shall purchase, lease, lease purchase, rent, or otherwise
34 acquire all real estate, improved or unimproved, as may be required
35 by elected state officials, institutions, departments, commissions,
36 boards, and other state agencies, or federal agencies where joint
37 state and federal activities are undertaken and may grant easements
38 and transfer, exchange, sell, lease, or sublease all or part of any
39 surplus real estate for those state agencies which do not otherwise

1 have the specific authority to dispose of real estate. Any such
2 transfer, exchange, or sale must comply with RCW 43.17.400, and may
3 be made in accordance with RCW 39.33.015. This section does not
4 transfer financial liability for the acquired property to the
5 department of enterprise services.

6 (2) Except for real estate occupied by federal agencies, the
7 director shall determine the location, size, and design of any real
8 estate or improvements thereon acquired or held pursuant to
9 subsection (1) of this section. Facilities acquired or held pursuant
10 to this chapter, and any improvements thereon, shall conform to
11 standards adopted by the director and approved by the office of
12 financial management governing facility efficiency unless a specific
13 exemption from such standards is provided by the director of
14 enterprise services. The director of enterprise services shall report
15 to the office of financial management and the appropriate committees
16 of the legislature annually on any exemptions granted pursuant to
17 this subsection.

18 (3) Except for leases permitted under subsection (4) of this
19 section, the director of enterprise services may fix the terms and
20 conditions of each lease entered into under this chapter, except that
21 no lease shall extend greater than twenty years in duration. The
22 director of enterprise services may enter into a long-term lease
23 greater than ten years in duration upon a determination by the
24 director of the office of financial management that the long-term
25 lease provides a more favorable rate than would otherwise be
26 available, it appears to a substantial certainty that the facility is
27 necessary for use by the state for the full length of the lease term,

30 into a long-term lease greater than ten years in duration if an

39 community and technical colleges on behalf of north Seattle community
40 college may enter into a long-term lease, not to exceed 99 years, of

1 a portion of the north Seattle community college for purposes of
2 affordable housing under RCW 39.33.015.

3 (5) Except as permitted under chapter 39.94 RCW, no lease for or
4 on behalf of any state agency may be used or referred to as
5 collateral or security for the payment of securities offered for sale
6 through a public offering. Except as permitted under chapter 39.94
7 RCW, no lease for or on behalf of any state agency may be used or
8 referred to as collateral or security for the payment of securities
9 offered for sale through a private placement without the prior
10 written approval of the state treasurer. However, this limitation
11 shall not prevent a lessor from assigning or encumbering its interest
12 in a lease as security for the repayment of a promissory note
13 provided that the transaction would otherwise be an exempt
14 transaction under RCW 21.20.320. The state treasurer shall adopt
15 rules that establish the criteria under which any such approval may
16 be granted. In establishing such criteria the state treasurer shall
17 give primary consideration to the protection of the state's credit
18 rating and the integrity of the state's debt management program. If
19 it appears to the state treasurer that any lease has been used or

27 consolidation of state services into single or adjacent facilities,

31 (7) The director of enterprise services shall provide coordinated
32 long-range planning services to identify and evaluate opportunities
33 for collocating and consolidating state facilities. Upon the renewal
34 of any lease, the inception of a new lease, or the purchase of a
35 facility, the director of enterprise services shall determine whether
36 an opportunity exists for collocating the agency or agencies in a
37 single facility with other agencies located in the same geographic
38 area. If a colocation opportunity exists, the director of enterprise
39 services shall consult with the affected state agencies and the
40 office of financial management to evaluate the impact colocation

1 would have on the cost and delivery of agency programs, including
2 whether program delivery would be enhanced due to the centralization
3 of services. The director of enterprise services, in consultation
4 with the office of financial management, shall develop procedures for
5 implementing colocation and consolidation of state facilities.

6 (8) The director of enterprise services is authorized to
7 purchase, lease, rent, or otherwise acquire improved or unimproved
8 real estate as owner or lessee and to lease or sublet all or a part
9 of such real estate to state or federal agencies. The director of
10 enterprise services shall charge each using agency its proportionate
11 rental which shall include an amount sufficient to pay all costs,
12 including, but not limited to, those for utilities, janitorial and
13 accounting services, and sufficient to provide for contingencies;
14 which shall not exceed five percent of the average annual rental, to
15 meet unforeseen expenses incident to management of the real estate.

16 (9) If the director of enterprise services determines that it is
17 necessary or advisable to undertake any work, construction,
18 alteration, repair, or improvement on any real estate acquired
19 pursuant to subsection (1) or (8) of this section, the director shall
20 cause plans and specifications thereof and an estimate of the cost of
21 such work to be made and filed in his or her office and the state
22 agency benefiting thereby is hereby authorized to pay for such work
23 out of any available funds: PROVIDED, That the cost of executing such
24 work shall not exceed the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars. Work,
25 construction, alteration, repair, or improvement in excess of twenty-
26 five thousand dollars, other than that done by the owner of the
27 property if other than the state, shall be performed in accordance
28 with the public works law of this state.

29 (10) In order to obtain maximum utilization of space, the
30 director of enterprise services shall make space utilization studies,
31 and shall establish standards for use of space by state agencies.
32 Such studies shall include the identification of opportunities for
33 colocation and consolidation of state agency office and support
34 facilities.

35 (11) The director of enterprise services may construct new
36 buildings on, or improve existing facilities, and furnish and equip,
37 all real estate under his or her management. Prior to the
38 construction of new buildings or major improvements to existing
39 facilities or acquisition of facilities using a lease purchase
40 contract, the director of enterprise services shall conduct an

1 evaluation of the facility design and budget using life-cycle cost
2 analysis, value-engineering, and other techniques to maximize the
3 long-term effectiveness and efficiency of the facility or
4 improvement.

5 (12) All conveyances and contracts to purchase, lease, rent,
6 transfer, exchange, or sell real estate and to grant and accept
7 easements shall be approved as to form by the attorney general,
8 signed by the director of enterprise services or the director's
9 designee, and recorded with the county auditor of the county in which
10 the property is located.

11 (13) The director of enterprise services may delegate any or all
12 of the functions specified in this section to any agency upon such
13 terms and conditions as the director deems advisable. By January 1st

17 (14) This section does not apply to the acquisition of real

30 including community meeting and training facilities, where the real

32 (15) Notwithstanding any provision in this chapter to the
33 contrary, the department of enterprise services may negotiate ground
34 leases for public lands on which property is to be acquired under a
35 financing contract pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW under terms approved
36 by the state finance committee.

37 (16) The department of enterprise services shall report annually
38 to the office of financial management and the appropriate fiscal
39 committees of the legislature on facility leases executed for all
40 state agencies for the preceding year, lease terms, and annual lease

1 costs. The report must include leases executed under RCW 43.82.045
2 and subsection (13) of this section.

3 **Sec. 8033.** RCW 43.83B.430 and 2022 c 297 s 957 and 2022 c 296 s
4 7008 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

5 The state drought preparedness and response account is created in
6 the state treasury. All receipts from appropriated funds designated
7 for the account and all cost recovery revenues collected under RCW
8 43.83B.410(5) must be deposited into the account. Expenditures from
9 the account may be used for drought preparedness and response
10 activities under this chapter, including grants issued under RCW
11 43.83B.415. (~~During the 2021-2023 fiscal biennium, moneys in the~~
12 ~~account may be used for water banking pilot projects.~~) Moneys in the
13 account may be spent only after appropriation. During the 2021-2023
14 and 2023-2025 fiscal (~~biennium~~) biennia, the legislature may
15 appropriate moneys from the account for activities related to water
16 banking.

17 **Sec. 8034.** RCW 43.88D.010 and 2021 c 332 s 7034 are each amended
18 to read as follows:

19 (1) By October 1st of each even-numbered year, the office of
20 financial management shall complete an objective analysis and scoring
21 of all capital budget projects proposed by the public four-year
22 institutions of higher education and submit the results of the
23 scoring process to the legislative fiscal committees and the four-
24 year institutions. Each project must be reviewed and scored within
25 one of the following categories, according to the project's principal
26 purpose. Each project may be scored in only one category. The
27 categories are:

28 (a) Access-related projects to accommodate enrollment growth at
29 all campuses, at existing or new university centers, or through
30 distance learning. Growth projects should provide significant
31 additional student capacity. Proposed projects must demonstrate that
32 they are based on solid enrollment demand projections, more
33 cost-effectively provide enrollment access than alternatives such as
34 university centers and distance learning, and make cost-effective use
35 of existing and proposed new space;

36 (b) Projects that replace failing permanent buildings. Facilities
37 that cannot be economically renovated are considered replacement
38 projects. New space may be programmed for the same or a different use

1 than the space being replaced and may include additions to improve
2 access and enhance the relationship of program or support space;

3 (c) Projects that renovate facilities to restore building life
4 and upgrade space to meet current program requirements. Renovation
5 projects should represent a complete renovation of a total facility
6 or an isolated wing of a facility. A reasonable renovation project
7 should cost between sixty to eighty percent of current replacement
8 value and restore the renovated area to at least twenty-five years of
9 useful life. New space may be programmed for the same or a different
10 use than the space being renovated and may include additions to
11 improve access and enhance the relationship of program or support
12 space;

13 (d) Major stand-alone campus infrastructure projects;

14 (e) Projects that promote economic growth and innovation through
15 expanded research activity. The acquisition and installation of
16 specialized equipment is authorized under this category; and

17 (f) Other project categories as determined by the office of
18 financial management in consultation with the legislative fiscal
19 committees.

20 (2) The office of financial management, in consultation with the
21 legislative fiscal committees, shall establish a scoring system and
22 process for each four-year project category that is based on the
23 framework used in the community and technical college system of
24 prioritization. Staff from the state board for community and
25 technical colleges and the four-year institutions shall provide
26 technical assistance on the development of a scoring system and
27 process.

28 (3) The office of financial management shall consult with the
29 legislative fiscal committees in the scoring of four-year institution
30 project proposals, and may also solicit participation by independent
31 experts.

32 (a) For each four-year project category, the scoring system must,
33 at a minimum, include an evaluation of enrollment trends,
34 reasonableness of cost, the ability of the project to enhance
35 specific strategic master plan goals, age and condition of the
36 facility if applicable, and impact on space utilization.

37 (b) Each four-year project category may include projects at the
38 predesign, design, or construction funding phase.

39 (c) To the extent possible, the objective analysis and scoring
40 system of all capital budget projects shall occur within the context

1 of any and all performance agreements between the office of financial
2 management and the governing board of a public, four-year institution
3 of higher education that aligns goals, priorities, desired outcomes,
4 flexibility, institutional mission, accountability, and levels of
5 resources.

6 (4) In evaluating and scoring four-year institution projects, the
7 office of financial management shall take into consideration project
8 schedules that result in realistic, balanced, and predictable
9 expenditure patterns over the ensuing three biennia.

10 (5) The office of financial management shall distribute common
11 definitions, the scoring system, and other information required for
12 the project proposal and scoring process as part of its biennial
13 budget instructions. The office of financial management, in
14 consultation with the legislative fiscal committees, shall develop
15 common definitions that four-year institutions must use in developing
16 their project proposals and lists under this section.

17 (6) In developing any scoring system for capital projects
18 proposed by the four-year institutions, the office of financial
19 management:

20 (a) Shall be provided with all required information by the four-
21 year institutions as deemed necessary by the office of financial
22 management;

23 (b) May utilize independent services to verify, sample, or
24 evaluate information provided to the office of financial management
25 by the four-year institutions; and

26 (c) Shall have full access to all data maintained by the joint
27 legislative audit and review committee concerning the condition of
28 higher education facilities.

29 (7) By August 1st of each even-numbered year each public four-
30 year higher education institution shall prepare and submit
31 prioritized lists of the individual projects proposed by the

1 (8) For (~~the 2019-2021 fiscal biennium and~~) the 2021-2023

4 higher education capital project criteria with a rating scale that
5 assesses how well a particular project satisfies those criteria. The
6 office of financial management may not use a rating scale that weighs

8 (9) For (~~the 2019-2021 fiscal biennium and~~) the 2021-2023
9 fiscal biennium, pursuant to subsection (6)(a) of this section and in
10 lieu of the requirements of subsection (7) of this section, by August
11 15, 2022, the institutions of higher education shall prepare and
12 submit or resubmit to the office of financial management and the
13 legislative fiscal committees:

14 (a) Individual project proposals developed pursuant to subsection
15 (1) of this section;

16 (b) Individual project proposals scored in prior biennia pursuant
17 to subsection (1) of this section; and

18 (c) A prioritized list of up to five project proposals submitted
19 pursuant to (a) and (b) of this subsection.

20 (10) The requirements of this section are suspended during the
21 2023-2025 fiscal biennium. However, instead of these requirements,
22 the public four-year institutions of higher education must submit
23 additional supporting information for major project funding requests
24 for the 2025-2027 fiscal biennium that is equivalent to the
25 information produced for the 2022 higher education scoring process
26 under subsection (9) of this section. Examples of the information
27 required under this subsection include, but are not limited to,
28 measures of: (a) Space efficiency, (b) reasonableness of project
29 cost, (c) facility condition, and (d) anticipated impacts of the
30 requested major projects on projected degree totals. The public four-
31 year institutions of higher education shall consult with the office
32 of financial management and legislative fiscal staff regarding the
33 implementation of this requirement and the content of the additional
34 information.

35 **Sec. 8035.** RCW 43.88.030 and 2020 c 218 s 1 are each amended to
36 read as follows:

37 (1) The director of financial management shall provide all
38 agencies with a complete set of instructions for submitting biennial
39 budget requests to the director at least three months before agency

1 budget documents are due into the office of financial management. The
2 budget document or documents shall consist of the governor's budget
3 message which shall be explanatory of the budget and shall contain an
4 outline of the proposed financial policies of the state for the
5 ensuing fiscal period, as well as an outline of the proposed six-year
6 financial policies where applicable, and shall describe in connection
7 therewith the important features of the budget. The biennial budget
8 document or documents shall also describe performance indicators that
9 demonstrate measurable progress towards priority results. The message
10 shall set forth the reasons for salient changes from the previous

13 shall be such supporting schedules, exhibits and other explanatory

18 period where applicable, based upon the estimated revenues and
19 caseloads as approved by the economic and revenue forecast council
20 and caseload forecast council or upon the estimated revenues and
21 caseloads of the office of financial management for those funds,
22 accounts, sources, and programs for which the forecast councils do
23 not prepare an official forecast. Revenues shall be estimated for
24 such fiscal period from the source and at the rates existing by law
25 at the time of submission of the budget document, including the
26 supplemental budgets submitted in the even-numbered years of a
27 biennium. However, the estimated revenues and caseloads for use in
28 the governor's budget document may be adjusted to reflect budgetary
29 revenue transfers and revenue and caseload estimates dependent upon
30 budgetary assumptions of enrollments, workloads, and caseloads. All
31 adjustments to the approved estimated revenues and caseloads must be
32 set forth in the budget document. The governor may additionally
33 submit, as an appendix to each supplemental, biennial, or six-year
34 agency budget or to the budget document or documents, a proposal for

36 derived from proposed changes in existing statutes.

37 The budget document or documents shall also contain:

38 (a) Revenues classified by fund and source for the immediately

40 fiscal period, and those anticipated for the ensuing biennium;

- 2 (c) Such additional information dealing with expenditures,
3 revenues, workload, performance, and personnel as the legislature may
4 direct by law or concurrent resolution;
- 5 (d) Such additional information dealing with revenues and
6 expenditures as the governor shall deem pertinent and useful to the
7 legislature;
- 8 (e) Tabulations showing expenditures classified by fund,
9 function, and agency;
- 10 (f) The expenditures that include nonbudgeted, nonappropriated
11 accounts outside the state treasury;
- 12 (g) Identification of all proposed direct expenditures to
13 implement the Puget Sound water quality plan under chapter 90.71 RCW,
14 shown by agency and in total; and
- 15 (h) Tabulations showing each postretirement adjustment by
16 retirement system established after fiscal year 1991, to include, but
17 not be limited to, estimated total payments made to the end of the
18 previous biennial period, estimated payments for the present
19 biennium, and estimated payments for the ensuing biennium.
- 20 (2) The budget document or documents shall include detailed
21 estimates of all anticipated revenues applicable to proposed
22 operating or capital expenditures and shall also include all proposed
23 operating or capital expenditures. The total of beginning
24 undesignated fund balance and estimated revenues less working capital
25 and other reserves shall equal or exceed the total of proposed
26 applicable expenditures. The budget document or documents shall
27 further include:
- 28 (a) Interest, amortization and redemption charges on the state
29 debt;
- 30 (b) Payments of all reliefs, judgments, and claims;
- 31 (c) Other statutory expenditures;
- 32 (d) Expenditures incident to the operation for each agency;
- 33 (e) Revenues derived from agency operations;
- 34 (f) Expenditures and revenues shall be given in comparative form
35 showing those incurred or received for the immediately past fiscal
36 period and those anticipated for the current biennium and next
37 ensuing biennium;
- 38 (g) A showing and explanation of amounts of general fund and
39 other funds obligations for debt service and any transfers of moneys
40 that otherwise would have been available for appropriation;

1 (h) Common school expenditures on a fiscal-year basis;

2 (i) A showing, by agency, of the value and purpose of financing
3 contracts for the lease/purchase or acquisition of personal or real
4 property for the current and ensuing fiscal periods; and

5 (j) A showing and explanation of anticipated amounts of general
6 fund and other funds required to amortize the unfunded actuarial
7 accrued liability of the retirement system specified under chapter
8 41.45 RCW, and the contributions to meet such amortization, stated in
9 total dollars and as a level percentage of total compensation.

10 (3) The governor's operating budget document or documents shall
11 reflect the statewide priorities as required by RCW 43.88.090.

12 (4) The governor's operating budget document or documents shall
13 identify activities that are not addressing the statewide priorities.

14 (5)(a) Beginning in the 2021-2023 fiscal biennium, the governor's
15 operating budget document or documents submitted to the legislature
16 must leave, in total, a positive ending fund balance in the general
17 fund and related funds.

18 (b) Beginning in the 2021-2023 fiscal biennium, the projected
19 maintenance level of the governor's operating budget document or
20 documents submitted to the legislature must not exceed the available
21 fiscal resources for the next ensuing fiscal biennium.

23 (i) "Available fiscal resources" means the beginning general fund
24 and related funds balances and any fiscal resources estimated for the
25 general fund and related funds, adjusted for proposed revenue
26 legislation, and with forecasted revenues adjusted to the greater of

28 the ensuing biennium, or (B) the official general fund and related
29 funds forecast for the second fiscal year of the current fiscal
30 biennium, increased by 4.5 percent for each fiscal year of the

32 (ii) "Projected maintenance level" means estimated appropriations
33 necessary to maintain the continuing costs of program and service
34 levels either funded in the governor's budget document or documents
35 submitted to the legislature or mandated by other state or federal
36 law, adjusted by the estimated cost of proposed executive branch
37 legislation, and the amount of any general fund moneys projected to
38 be transferred to the budget stabilization account pursuant to
39 Article VII, section 12 of the state Constitution. Proposed executive
40 branch legislation does not include proposals by institutions of

1 higher education, other separately elected officials, or other
2 boards, commissions, and offices not under the authority of the
3 governor that are not funded or assumed in the governor's budget
4 document or documents submitted to the legislature.

5 (iii) "Related funds" has the meaning defined in RCW 43.88.055.

6 (d) (b) of this subsection (5) does not apply:

7 (i) To any governor-proposed legislation submitted to the
8 legislature that makes net reductions in general fund and related
9 funds appropriations to prevent the governor from making across-the-
10 board reductions in allotments for these particular funds as provided
11 in RCW 43.88.110(~~(+7)~~) (10); or

12 (ii) In a fiscal biennium for which the governor proposes
13 appropriations from the budget stabilization account pursuant to
14 Article VII, section 12(d)(ii) of the state Constitution.

15 (6) A separate capital budget document or schedule shall be
16 submitted that will contain the following:

17 (a) A statement setting forth a long-range facilities plan for
18 the state that identifies and includes the highest priority needs
19 within affordable spending levels;

20 (b) A capital program consisting of proposed capital projects for
21 the next biennium and the two biennia succeeding the next biennium
22 consistent with the long-range facilities plan. Inasmuch as is
23 practical, and recognizing emergent needs, the capital program shall
24 reflect the priorities, projects, and spending levels proposed in
25 previously submitted capital budget documents in order to provide a
26 reliable long-range planning tool for the legislature and state
27 agencies;

28 (c) A capital plan consisting of proposed capital spending for at
29 least four biennia succeeding the next biennium;

30 (d) A strategic plan for reducing backlogs of maintenance and
31 repair projects. The plan shall include a prioritized list of
32 specific facility deficiencies and capital projects to address the
33 deficiencies for each agency, cost estimates for each project, a
34 schedule for completing projects over a reasonable period of time,
35 and identification of normal maintenance activities to reduce future
36 backlogs;

37 (e) A statement of the reason or purpose for a project;

38 (f) Verification that a project is consistent with the provisions
39 set forth in chapter 36.70A RCW;

1 (g) A statement about the proposed site, size, and estimated life
2 of the project, if applicable;

3 (h) Estimated total project cost;

4 (i) For major projects valued over five million dollars,
5 estimated costs for the following project components: Acquisition,
6 consultant services, construction, equipment, project management, and
7 other costs included as part of the project. Project component costs
8 shall be displayed in a standard format defined by the office of
9 financial management to allow comparisons between projects;

10 (j) Estimated total project cost for each phase of the project as
11 defined by the office of financial management;

Note: Governor's explanation of partial veto is as follows:

"I am returning herewith, without my approval as to Sections 5012, 5067 and 8038, Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill No. 5200 entitled:

"AN ACT Relating to the capital budget."

Section 5012, page 164, Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction, Lapse of Funding

Funding was provided to the agency to implement Substitute House Bill 1044 relating to capital financial assistance for small school districts. Because this bill did not pass the Legislature, the funding has lapsed. For this reason, I have vetoed Section 5012.

Section 5067, page 179, The Evergreen State College, State Building Code Council Study

This section directs the Washington State Institute for Public Policy to study and report on the costs and benefits of moving from a three-year building code cycle to a six-year cycle. Increasing the time between code updates will impact the ability to apply the newest and best technologies for safety, health and efficiency to new construction in Washington. In addition, changing our state's code cycle to every six years will jeopardize the Legislature's mandate to reduce energy use 70% by 2031. Limiting the code cycles between now and 2031 would require a greater amount of change at each code cycle, increasing challenges for designers, builders and building owners. For these reasons, I have vetoed Section 5067.

Section 8038, pages 466-467, Department of Enterprise Services, Capitol Dome Access

This section directs the Department of Enterprise Services to give legislators and their guests access to the top of the Capitol dome. The Olympia Fire Department has assessed this space in the past, and, among other issues, reported that it could not use a firefighter's rescue technique in this space or use a gurney to assist an injured person. The Department of Labor and Industries classifies the area as a "confined space," which means that it has a restricted entry and exit and is not primarily designed for human occupancy. Access should be authorized only for individuals who need to do work on the dome. For this reason, I have vetoed Section 8038.

For these reasons I have vetoed Sections 5012, 5067 and 8038 of Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill No. 5200.

With the exception of Sections 5012, 5067 and 8038, Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill No. 5200 is approved."
