1 AN ACT Relating to victims of nonfatal strangulation; amending 2 RCW 7.68.803; providing an effective date; and declaring an 3 emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 Sec. 1. RCW 7.68.803 and 2021 c 269 s 3 are each amended to read 6 as follows:

7 (1) No costs incurred by a hospital or other emergency medical 8 facility for the examination of the victim of domestic violence 9 assault involving nonfatal strangulation, when such examination is 10 performed for the purposes of gathering evidence for possible 11 prosecution, shall be billed or charged directly or indirectly to the 12 victim of such assault. Such costs shall be paid by the state 13 pursuant to this chapter.

14 (2) The department must notify the office of financial management 15 and the fiscal committees of the legislature if it projects that the 16 cost of services provided under this section exceeds the amount of 17 funding provided by the legislature solely for the purposes of this 18 section.

19 ((<del>(3)</del> No later than October 1, 2022, the department shall report 20 to the legislature the following information for fiscal year 2022:

- 1 (a) The number, type, and amount of claims received by victims of 2 suspected nonfatal strangulation, with a subtotal of claims that also 2 involved servel accoult.
- 3 involved sexual assault;
- 4 (b) The number, type, and amount of claims paid for victims of
  5 suspected nonfatal strangulation, with a subtotal of claims that also
  6 involved sexual assault; and
- 7 (c) The number of police reports filed by victims of suspected
   8 nonfatal strangulation who received services under this section.
- 9 (4) This section expires June 30, 2023.))

10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate 11 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of 12 the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes 13 effect June 30, 2023.
