1 AN ACT Relating to responding to electric vehicle fires; and 2 creating a new section.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. (1) The Washington state patrol, in consultation with the department of ecology, local fire protection districts, a representative of the towing and recovery industry, and other entities, must study the following elements of electric vehicle fires:

9 (a) Impacts to the environment and proximate residential areas, 10 and health impacts to responding firefighters;

- 11 (b) Best practices for fire response; and
- 12 (c) Best practices regarding clean-up and disposal efforts.

(2) By January 1, 2025, the Washington state patrol must report
to the appropriate committees of the legislature study findings and
any resulting policy or legislative recommendations.
