#### **Brief Summary of Bill**

• Authorizes the Pollution Control Hearings Board to hear appeals of Department of Natural Resources (DNR) actions relating to burning permits and silvicultural burning.

#### **Background:**

The State Clean Air Act.

This analysis was prepared by non-partisan legislative staff for the use of legislative members in their deliberations. This analysis is not part of the legislation nor does it constitute a statement of legislative intent.

The state Clean Air Act (CAA) regulates outdoor air pollution. Any person who violates any of the provisions of the CAA may incur a civil penalty in an amount not to exceed \$10,000 per day for each violation.

# Department of Natural Resources Burn Permits.

The Department of Natural Resources (DNR) regulates burning activities on DNR-protected land and silvicultural burning under the CAA through the issuance of permits, which may include conditions for the protection of life, property, or air quality, and may be suspended or revoked. A person who violates the requirements to have a valid, written burning permit obtained from the DNR may incur a civil penalty under the CAA.

# Pollution Control Hearings Board.

The Pollution Control Hearings Board (PCHB) is an administrative body that has jurisdiction to hear appeals covering a wide range of environmental permits and enforcement actions.

# **Summary of Bill:**

The PCHB jurisdiction is expanded to include appeals of:

- civil penalties issued by the DNR for violations of burning permits or silvicultural burning activities under the CAA; and
- decisions issued by the DNR regarding the issuance or revocation of a burning permit.

Appropriation: None.

Fiscal Note: Available.

**Effective Date:** The bill takes effect 90 days after adjournment of the session in which the bill is passed.

#### **Staff Summary of Public Testimony:**

(In support) This is agency request legislation. The DNR was granted civil enforcement authority in 2021 over silvicultural burning requirements and smoke management, but not the authority to develop an appeals process for it. This proposed change will allow for such appeals to the PCHB as an independent administrative tribunal.
