## HOUSE BILL 1554

## State of Washington 69th Legislature 2025 Regular Session

1 AN ACT Relating to equity in eligibility for the college bound 2 scholarship; and amending RCW 28B.118.010.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 28B.118.010 and 2024 c 323 s 2 are each amended to 5 read as follows:

6 The office of student financial assistance shall design the 7 Washington college bound scholarship program in accordance with this section and in alignment with the Washington college grant program in 8 chapter 28B.92 RCW unless otherwise provided in this section. The 9 10 right of an eligible student to receive a college bound scholarship 11 vest upon enrollment in the program that is earned by meeting the 12 requirements of this section as it exists at the time of the student's enrollment under subsection (2) of this section. 13

14 15 (1) "Eligible students" are those students who:

(a) Qualify for free or reduced-price lunches.

16 (i) If a student qualifies in the seventh or eighth grade, the 17 student remains eligible even if the student does not receive free or 18 reduced-price lunches thereafter.

(ii) Beginning in the 2019-20 academic year, if a student qualifies for free or reduced-price lunches in the ninth grade and was previously ineligible during the seventh or eighth grade while he or she was a student in Washington, the student is eligible for the
college bound scholarship program;

3 (b) Are dependent pursuant to chapter 13.34 RCW and:

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(i) In grade seven through 12; or

5 (ii) Are between the ages of 18 and 21 and have not graduated 6 from high school; or

7 (c) Were dependent pursuant to chapter 13.34 RCW and were adopted 8 between the ages of 14 and 18 with a negotiated adoption agreement 9 that includes continued eligibility for the Washington state college 10 bound scholarship program pursuant to RCW 74.13A.025.

(2) (a) Every eligible student shall be automatically enrolled by the office of student financial assistance, with no action necessary by the student, student's family, or student's guardians.

(b) Eligible students and the students' parents or guardians shall be notified of the student's enrollment in the Washington college bound scholarship program and the requirements for award of the scholarship by the office of student financial assistance. To the maximum extent practicable, an eligible student must acknowledge enrollment in the college bound scholarship program and receipt of the requirements for award of the scholarship.

(c) The office of the superintendent of public instruction and 21 the department of children, youth, and families must provide the 22 23 office of student financial assistance with a list of eligible students when requested. The office of student financial assistance 24 25 must determine the most effective methods, including timing and frequency, to notify eligible students of enrollment 26 in the Washington college bound scholarship program. The office of student 27 28 financial assistance must take reasonable steps to ensure that eligible students acknowledge enrollment in the college bound 29 scholarship program and receipt of the requirements for award of the 30 31 scholarship. The office of student financial assistance shall also 32 make available to every school district information, brochures, and posters to increase awareness and to enable school districts to 33 notify eligible students directly or through school teachers, 34 counselors, or school activities. 35

36 (3) Except as provided in subsection (4) of this section, an 37 eligible student must:

38 (a)(i) Graduate from a public high school under RCW 39  $28A.150.010((\tau))$  or an approved private high school under chapter 40 28A.195 RCW in Washington, have received a high school equivalency 1 certificate under RCW 28B.50.536, or have received home-based 2 instruction under chapter 28A.200 RCW; and

3 (ii) For eligible students enrolling in a postsecondary 4 educational institution for the first time beginning with the 2023-24 5 academic year, graduate with at least a "C" average for consideration 6 of direct admission to a public or private four-year institution of 7 higher education;

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(b) Have no felony convictions;

9 (c) Be a resident student as defined in RCW 28B.15.012(2) (a) 10 through (e); and

11 (d) Have a family income that does not exceed 65 percent of the 12 state median family income at the time of high school graduation.

(4) ((((a))) An eligible student who is a resident student under RCW 28B.15.012(2)(e) must also provide the institution, as defined in RCW 28B.15.012, an affidavit indicating that the individual will file an application to become a permanent resident at the earliest opportunity the individual is eligible to do so and a willingness to engage in any other activities necessary to acquire citizenship, including but not limited to citizenship or civics review courses.

20 (((b) For eligible students as defined in subsection (1)(b) and 21 (c) of this section, a student may also meet the requirement in 22 subsection (3)(a) of this section by receiving a high school 23 equivalency certificate as provided in RCW 28B.50.536.))

(5) (a) For students attending two or four-year institutions of higher education as defined in RCW 28B.10.016, the value of the award shall be (i) the difference between the student's tuition and required fees, less the value of any state-funded grant, scholarship, or waiver assistance the student receives; (ii) plus five hundred dollars for books and materials.

30 (b) For students attending private four-year institutions of 31 higher education in Washington, the award amount shall be the 32 representative average of awards granted to students in public 33 research universities in Washington or the representative average of 34 awards granted to students in public research universities in 35 Washington in the 2014-15 academic year, whichever is greater.

36 (c) For students attending private vocational schools in 37 Washington, the award amount shall be the representative average of 38 awards granted to students in public community and technical colleges 39 in Washington or the representative average of awards granted to 1 students in public community and technical colleges in Washington in 2 the 2014-15 academic year, whichever is greater.

3 (6) Eligible students must enroll no later than the fall term, as 4 defined by the institution of higher education, one academic year 5 following high school graduation. College bound scholarship 6 eligibility may not extend beyond six years or 150 percent of the 7 published length of the program in which the student is enrolled or 8 the credit or clock-hour equivalent.

9 (7) Institutions of higher education shall award the student all 10 need-based and merit-based financial aid for which the student would 11 otherwise qualify. The Washington college bound scholarship is 12 intended to replace unmet need, loans, and, at the student's option, 13 work-study award before any other grants or scholarships are reduced.

14 (8) The first scholarships shall be awarded to students 15 graduating in 2012.

(9) The eligible student has a property right in the award, but the state of Washington retains legal ownership of tuition units awarded as scholarships under this chapter until the tuition units are redeemed. These tuition units shall remain separately held from any tuition units owned under chapter 28B.95 RCW by a Washington college bound scholarship recipient.

(10) Should the recipient terminate his or her enrollment for any reason during the academic year, the unused portion of the scholarship tuition units shall revert to the Washington college bound scholarship account.

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
