## HOUSE BILL 1608

69th Legislature 2025 Regular Session State of Washington

- AN ACT Relating to the selling, possessing, transporting, and 1 2 distributing of farmed octopus; adding a new chapter to Title 19 RCW;
- 3 and prescribing penalties.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that octopuses are 6 highly intelligent animals that exhibit the ability to learn and 7 problem solve. Octopuses use tools, solve puzzles, untie knots, and learn from observation. A new study indicates that octopuses may 8 share a genetic trait with humans, called a transposon or "jumping 9 10 gene," that could explain octopuses' intelligence and ability to 11 cognitively process and adapt to their environment. In addition, octopuses are sentient beings capable of experiencing emotions, such 12 13 fear, pain, pleasure, stress, and affection. In 2024, 14 legislature prohibited octopus aquaculture in Washington for reasons 15 including that an octopus' intelligence makes it difficult to execute 16 and balance high welfare farming with a need for solitary enclosures. 17 Octopus are solitary creatures that can become aggressive toward each other when kept in confinement and are known for being able to escape 18 from many different types of enclosures. Therefore, the legislature 19 intends to expand on protections for these highly intelligent and 20

- sentient beings by eliminating the economic market for farmed octopus.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** The definitions in this section apply
- 4 throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires
- 5 otherwise.
- 6 (1) "Aquaculture" has the same definition as in RCW 15.85.020.
- 7 (2) "Person" includes individuals, firms, partnerships, 8 corporations, and associations.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** (1) A person may not knowingly sell,
- 10 possess, transport, or distribute any species of octopus that is the
- 11 result or product of aquaculture.
- 12 (2) A person violating this section may be subject to a civil
- 13 penalty of up to \$1,000 for each violation. The attorney general,
- 14 acting in the name of the state, may seek recovery of the penalty in
- 15 civil action in superior court.
- 16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** Sections 1 through 3 of this act
- 17 constitute a new chapter in Title 19 RCW.
