SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 1651

- 1 AN ACT Relating to teacher residency and apprenticeship programs;
- 2 adding new sections to chapter 28A.410 RCW; and adding a new section
- 3 to chapter 49.04 RCW.

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- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.410 6 RCW to read as follows:
 - (1) A teacher residency is a teacher preparation model that integrates a full year of collaborative hands-on classroom teaching with an experienced preservice mentor with concurrent, targeted academic coursework, designed to develop effective, community-focused teachers. This collaborative model is offered by a public elementary or secondary school and a board-approved teacher preparation program.
- 13 (2) At a minimum, a teacher residency model must meet the 14 following requirements:
- 15 (a) It must be operated as a formal partnership between a school 16 district, charter school, or state-tribal education compact school 17 and a board-approved teacher preparation program;
- 18 (b) The partners must collaboratively design the coursework to 19 align with the unique context of each resident's classroom and to the 20 context and priorities of the elementary or secondary school, and 21 school district if applicable;

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- 1 (c) Each resident must be assigned to at least one preservice 2 mentor, who must co-teach with the resident, throughout the 3 resident's preservice clinical practice;
 - (d) Each resident must receive at least 900 hours of preservice clinical practice over the course of one school year;
- 6 (e) Each resident must be grouped into a cohort based on 7 geography, specialty, or other relevant criteria determined by the 8 board;
 - (f) Funding must be provided to each resident; and

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- (g) A stipend must be provided to each preservice mentor.
- 11 (3) For purposes of this section, the following definitions 12 apply:
- 13 (a) "Board" means the Washington professional educator standards 14 board.
- 15 (b) "Cohort" means a group of residents enrolled in the same 16 board-approved teacher preparation program who begin their 17 residencies at the same time and have the same anticipated completion 18 date.
- 19 (c) "Preservice mentor" means a teacher qualified to be a mentor 20 for the beginning educator support team program under RCW 21 28A.415.265.
- 22 (d) "Resident" means a person enrolled in a board-approved 23 teacher preparation program who is participating in a teacher 24 residency model.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 28A.410 RCW to read as follows:
 - (1) A teacher apprenticeship program is a program approved by both the Washington state apprenticeship and training council under chapter 49.04 RCW and the Washington professional educator standards board under RCW 28A.410.210. In addition to meeting other requirements, the program must provide the apprentice with 2,000 hours of on-the-job mentored teaching experience under a gradual release method. Up to 500 hours working as a paraeducator may count towards the minimum on-the-job requirement.
- 35 (2) Beginning September 1, 2025, before applying to the 36 Washington state apprenticeship and training council to operate a 37 teacher apprenticeship program, an entity must be approved by the 38 Washington professional educator standards board as a teacher 39 preparation program.

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- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 49.04
- 2 RCW to read as follows:
- A teacher apprenticeship program must meet the requirements in section 2 of this act.

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
