State of Washington 69th Legislature 2025 Regular Session

AN ACT Relating to training and testing of home care aides; amending RCW 18.88B.021 and 18.88B.031; adding new sections to chapter 18.88B RCW; and making appropriations.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 18.88B
RCW to read as follows:

6 By September 1, 2026, the department shall prepare a report in 7 compliance with RCW 43.01.036 on home care aide certification testing 8 and make a recommendation to the legislature on moving home care aide 9 certification testing to approved home care aide training programs. 10 The report must include:

(1) A review of the home care aide knowledge and skills tests to ensure the test is aligned with learning outcomes and objectives in the department of social and health services basic training curriculum and is available in localized languages;

15 (2) A survey that includes stakeholder engagement with training 16 entities contracted with the department of social and health 17 services, including an entity that is already providing benefits to no fewer than 20,000 long-term care workers in the state of 18 19 Washington and has at least five years of experience in administering 20 benefits to that workforce, and facility and community-based 21 instructors to determine additional training program hours required 22 for administering skills and knowledge tests; and

1 (3) A review of all home care aide application-related materials 2 and processes utilized by consumers, with recommendations to simplify 3 and further develop these materials and methods as necessary to 4 improve consumer ease of use.

5 Sec. 2. RCW 18.88B.021 and 2023 c 424 s 2 are each amended to 6 read as follows:

7 (1) ((Beginning January 7, 2012, except)) Except as provided in RCW 18.88B.041, any person hired as a long-term care worker must be 8 certified as a home care aide as provided in ((this chapter within 9 10 200 calendar days after the date of hire)) rules established by the 11 department in consultation with the department of social and health services. A long-term care worker who is not currently certified or 12 eligible to reactivate an expired credential shall receive a new date 13 of hire when beginning work with either a new employer or returning 14 15 to a former employer after prior employment has ended.

16 (2)(a) No person may practice or, by use of any title or 17 description, represent himself or herself as a certified home care 18 aide without being certified as provided in this chapter.

(b) This section does not prohibit a person: (i) From practicing a profession for which the person has been issued a license or which is specifically authorized under this state's laws; or (ii) who is exempt from certification under RCW 18.88B.041 from providing services as a long-term care worker.

(c) In consultation with consumer and worker representatives, the department shall, by January 1, 2013, establish by rule a single scope of practice that encompasses both long-term care workers who are certified home care aides and long-term care workers who are exempted from certification under RCW 18.88B.041.

(3) If a pandemic, natural disaster, or other declared state of emergency impacts the ability of long-term care workers to complete certification as required by this section, the department may adopt rules to allow long-term care workers additional time to become certified.

34 (a) Rules adopted under this subsection (3) are effective until 35 the termination of the pandemic, natural disaster, or other declared 36 state of emergency or until the department determines that additional 37 time for long-term care workers to become certified is no longer 38 necessary, whichever is later. Once the department determines a rule

1 adopted under this subsection (3) is no longer necessary, it must 2 repeal the rule under RCW 34.05.353.

3 (b) Within 12 months of the termination of the pandemic, natural 4 disaster, or other declared state of emergency, the department shall 5 conduct a review of certification compliance with subsection (1) of 6 this section and rules adopted under this subsection (3) and provide 7 the legislature with a report.

(4) The department shall adopt rules to implement this section.

9 Sec. 3. RCW 18.88B.031 and 2023 c 323 s 2 are each amended to 10 read as follows:

(1) Except as provided in RCW 18.88B.041 and subject to the other requirements of this chapter, to be certified as a home care aide, a long-term care worker must successfully complete the training required under RCW 74.39A.074(1) and a certification examination. Any long-term care worker failing to make the required grade for the examination may not be certified as a home care aide.

17 (2) The department, in consultation with consumer and worker 18 representatives, shall develop a home care aide certification 19 examination to evaluate whether an applicant possesses the skills and 20 knowledge necessary to practice competently.

(3) The examination or series of examinations shall include both 21 22 a skills demonstration and a written or oral knowledge test. The department shall establish rules governing the number of times and 23 24 under what circumstances individuals who have failed the examination may sit for the examination, including whether any intermediate 25 remedial steps should be required. The skills demonstration, the 26 27 knowledge test, or both, may be administered throughout training, on 28 the last day of training, or after a student's formal training. An applicant may apply to take the examination during or after training. 29 30 An applicant may not sit for any part of the examination prior to 31 completing the part of the training associated with that part of the examination. The examination or series of examinations may be 32 conducted at local training or testing sites around the state. For 33 the purpose of reducing the travel time for applicants, the 34 department shall explore alternative testing options such as remote 35 36 testing.

37 (4)(a) All examinations shall be conducted by fair and wholly 38 impartial methods. All examinations shall be available to be 39 administered in the preferred language for the applicant taking the 1 examination. The certification examination shall be administered and 2 evaluated by:

3

(i) The department;

(ii) A contractor to the department that is not an employer of 4 long-term care workers unless the employer is a department of social 5 6 and health services approved instructor and has met the department standards for administering the examination; or 7

(iii) A high school or community college that has met department 8 standards for administering the examination. 9

(b) The department shall conduct an annual evaluation of the 10 11 examination results of applicants who complete the examination in ((a language other than English)) all languages. If the department finds 12 that applicants taking the examination in a particular language fail 13 at a disproportionately higher rate than other examination takers, 14 the department shall conduct a review of the translation to ensure 15 16 that it is accurate and understandable.

(5) Subject to the availability of amounts appropriated for this 17 specific purpose, home care aide testing shall be available in 18 19 qualified facility and community-based home care aide training programs by July 1, 2028, with testing conducted by facility and 20 community trainers contracted with the department of social and 21 22 health services or a training partnership affiliate.

23 (6) The department shall adopt rules to implement this section.

(7) For purposes of this section, "training partnership 24 25 affiliate" means a Washington nonprofit corporation that will contract with the department of social and health services or its 26 designee to provide home care aide testing required under this 27 28 chapter.

29 NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 18.88B 30 RCW to read as follows:

31 (1) If the department has any contracts for personal care 32 services with any individual providers represented by an exclusive bargaining representative, all home care aide testing required under 33 this chapter for those individual providers must be provided by a 34 35 training partnership affiliate.

purposes of this section, "training partnership 36 (2) For affiliate" means a Washington nonprofit corporation that will 37 38 contract with the department of social and health services or its 1 designee to provide home care aide testing required under this 2 chapter.

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. (1) The sum of \$2,000,000, or as much 4 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the fiscal year 5 ending June 30, 2026, from the general fund to a training partnership 6 affiliate for the purposes of the implementation of this act.

7 (2) The sum of \$4,500,000, or as much thereof as may be 8 necessary, is appropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2027, 9 from the general fund to a training partnership affiliate for the 10 purposes of the implementation of this act.

11 (3) For purposes of this section, "training partnership 12 affiliate" means a Washington nonprofit corporation that will 13 contract with the department of social and health services or its 14 designee to provide home care aide testing required under chapter 15 18.88B RCW.
