- AN ACT Relating to reforming the fish and wildlife commission; amending RCW 77.04.030 and 77.04.040; adding a new section to chapter 77.04 RCW; and adding a new section to chapter 77.12 RCW.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 77.04.030 and 2001 c 155 s 1 are each amended to 6 read as follows:
 - (1) The fish and wildlife commission consists of nine registered voters of the state((. In January of each odd-numbered year, the governor shall appoint with the advice and consent of the senate three registered voters to the commission to serve for terms of six years from that January or until their successors are appointed and qualified. If a vacancy occurs on the commission prior to the expiration of a term, the governor shall appoint a registered voter within sixty days to complete the term. Three members shall be residents of that portion of the state lying east of the summit of the Cascade mountains, and three shall be residents of that portion of the state lying west of the summit of the Cascade mountains. Three additional members shall be appointed at large. No two members may be residents of the same county.)), to be appointed to six-year terms as follows:

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1 (a) Six members, one from each of the six regions of the
2 department, as those regions existed on January 1, 2025, shall be
3 appointed by the counties within each region as follows:

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- (i) Each county legislative authority within each region must nominate candidates from within their county for appointment to the commission. The county legislative authority may solicit input on candidates from the department's regional director, and from organizations representing all aspects of fish and wildlife.
- 9 <u>(ii) The counties within each region must select one person to</u>
 10 <u>represent their region on the fish and wildlife commission. Each</u>
 11 <u>county legislative authority must delegate one member to vote on the</u>
 12 final list of nominated candidates.
 - (iii) If a vacancy occurs prior to the expiration of a term, the appropriate counties shall conduct the appointment process established in this subsection (1)(a) to appoint a registered voter within 60 days to complete the term.
 - (b) The governor shall appoint three additional at-large members with the advice and consent of the senate. At least one at-large member must reside in eastern Washington and at least one at-large member must reside in western Washington. If a vacancy occurs prior to the expiration of a term, the governor shall appoint a registered voter within 60 days to complete the term.
- (c) No region may be represented on the commission by more than two members.
 - (2) To establish staggered terms, initial appointees to the commission shall draw lots to determine:
 - (a) Three appointees whose initial term ends after two years; and
- 28 (b) Three appointees whose initial term ends after four years.
- 29 (3) Initial regional appointments made pursuant to subsection
 30 (1)(a) of this section must be made by December 31, 2025, and begin
 31 their terms January 1, 2026.
- 32 (4) The term of each commissioner appointed as of January 1, 33 2025, ends on December 31, 2025. Commissioners appointed as of June 34 1, 2025, are eligible for reappointment pursuant to this section.
- 35 <u>(5)</u> The legal office of the commission is at the administrative office of the department in Olympia.
- 37 **Sec. 2.** RCW 77.04.040 and 1995 1st sp.s. c 2 s 3 are each 38 amended to read as follows:

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1 Persons eligible for appointment as members of the commission ((shall have general knowledge of the habits and distribution of fish 2 and wildlife)) must have held a hunting or fishing license under 3 either chapter 77.32 or 77.65 RCW, or both, in three of the five 4 years immediately preceding appointment, and shall not hold another 5 6 state, county, or municipal elective or appointive office. In making 7 these appointments, the governor and appointing counties shall seek to maintain a balance reflecting all aspects of fish and wildlife, 8 including representation recommended by organized groups representing 9 sportfishers, commercial fishers, hunters, private landowners, and 10 11 environmentalists. Persons eligible for appointment as fish and 12 wildlife commissioners shall comply with the provisions of chapter((s)) 42.52 ((and 42.17)) RCW and Title 29B RCW. 13

NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 77.04
RCW to read as follows:

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Subject to amounts appropriated for this specific purpose, the commission shall convene in-person meetings in each of the department's six regions, as those regions existed on January 1, 2025, to increase the capacity of participants to represent different interests and constructively communicate and address conflicts.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 77.12 RCW to read as follows:

The department is encouraged to invite commissioners to participate in any department training offered to staff on tribal sovereignty, treaty rights, comanagement, and working with tribal governments. Within existing resources, commissioners may participate in such training.

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
