**SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 2274**

1 AN ACT Relating to modifying the Washington commercial electronic  
2 mail act; amending RCW 19.190.020 and 19.190.040; and creating a new  
3 section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 19.190.020 and 1999 c 289 s 2 are each amended to  
6 read as follows:

7 (1) No person may initiate the transmission, conspire with  
8 another to initiate the transmission, or assist the transmission, of  
9 a commercial electronic mail message from a computer located in  
10 Washington or to an electronic mail address that the sender knows, or  
11 has reason to know, is held by a Washington resident that:

12 (a) Uses a third party's internet domain name without permission  
13 of the third party, or otherwise misrepresents or obscures any  
14 information in identifying the point of origin or the transmission  
15 path of a commercial electronic mail message; or

16 (b) Contains a subject line that contains false or misleading  
17 information (~~(in the subject line)~~) concerning the commercial nature  
18 of the commercial electronic mail message.

19 (2) For purposes of this section, a person knows that the  
20 intended recipient of a commercial electronic mail message is a  
21 Washington resident if that information is available, upon request,

1 from the registrant of the internet domain name contained in the  
2 recipient's electronic mail address.

3 **Sec. 2.** RCW 19.190.040 and 2003 c 137 s 5 are each amended to  
4 read as follows:

5 (1) Damages to (~~the recipient of~~) a person who received,  
6 reviewed, and detrimentally relied upon a commercial electronic mail  
7 message or a commercial electronic text message sent in violation of  
8 this chapter are (~~five hundred dollars~~) \$500, or actual damages,  
9 whichever is greater.

10 (2) Damages to an interactive computer service resulting from a  
11 violation of this chapter are (~~one thousand dollars~~) \$1,000, or  
12 actual damages, whichever is greater.

13 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** This act applies to all causes of action  
14 commenced on or before the effective date of this section, regardless  
15 of when the cause of action arose. To this extent, this act applies  
16 retroactively, but in all other respects it applies prospectively.
