1 AN ACT Relating to the community reinvestment program; amending  
2 RCW 43.79.567; creating new sections; providing an effective date;  
3 and providing expiration dates.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that in order to  
6 address racial, economic, and social disparities in communities  
7 across the state created by the historical design and enforcement of  
8 state and federal criminal laws and penalties for drug possession and  
9 use in Washington state, aggressive approaches and targeted resources  
10 to support local design and control of community-based responses to  
11 these outcomes are required.

12 The legislature further finds that it initially appropriated  
13 \$1,000,000 for the development of a community reinvestment plan and  
14 \$200,000,000 for implementation of the plan in the 2023-2025 fiscal  
15 biennium through the community reinvestment account in RCW 43.79.567.  
16 The legislature subsequently appropriated an additional \$60,000,000  
17 and \$50,000,000 for the 2025-2027 and 2027-2029 fiscal biennia. The  
18 legislature finds that the initial phase of the program required use  
19 of the department of commerce's existing programs and networks to  
20 distribute money as quickly as possible. The department of commerce  
21 and the Washington state office of equity published a preliminary

1 report on December 1, 2022, a community reinvestment plan report on  
2 September 19, 2023, and a community reinvestment plan implementation  
3 report in October 2025. The legislature intends to continue  
4 implementation of the community reinvestment plan, reporting on the  
5 plan, and updates to the plan.

6 The legislature recognizes that despite the development of a  
7 community reinvestment plan and reporting on implementation of the  
8 plan, existing programs and networks may not reach the people who are  
9 most affected by the historic laws and penalties for drug possession.  
10 Therefore, the legislature intends for the next phase of  
11 implementation to include policy direction for expenditure of the  
12 legislative appropriations, reporting on distribution of the  
13 appropriated funds, direction to update the community reinvestment  
14 plan at least every five years, review of implementation of the  
15 program to date by the Washington state institute for public policy,  
16 and a transition to joint administration of the community  
17 reinvestment program by the Washington state office of equity and the  
18 department of commerce.

19 **Sec. 2.** RCW 43.79.567 and 2025 c 424 s 952 are each amended to  
20 read as follows:

21 (1) The community reinvestment account is created in the state  
22 treasury. Revenues to the account shall consist of appropriations and  
23 transfers by the legislature and all other moneys directed for  
24 deposit into the account. Moneys in the account may be spent only  
25 after appropriation.

26 (2) Expenditures from the account may be used by the department  
27 of commerce for:

28 (a) Economic development, which includes addressing wealth  
29 disparities to promote asset building such as homeownership and  
30 expanding access to financial resources including, but not limited  
31 to, grants ((and—loans)) for small businesses and entrepreneurs,  
32 financial literacy training, and other small business training and  
33 support activities;

34 (b) Civil and criminal legal assistance to provide postconviction  
35 relief and case assistance, including the expungement of criminal  
36 records and vacation of criminal convictions;

37 (c) Community-based violence intervention and prevention  
38 services, which may include after-school programs focused on  
39 providing education and mentorship to youths;

1 (d) Reentry services to facilitate successful transitions for  
2 persons formerly incarcerated in an adult correctional facility or  
3 juvenile residential facility in Washington; and

4 (e) (~~Beginning July 1, 2025, agricultural~~) Agricultural and  
5 economic support and services available to historically marginalized  
6 communities.

7 (3) An organization providing specialized services where fewer  
8 than five organizations statewide provide such services at no cost to  
9 clients is eligible to apply on a statewide basis rather than being  
10 limited to regional allocations.

11 (4) For specialized legal services where fewer than three  
12 organizations statewide provide such services at no cost to clients,  
13 an organization that is not a "by and for community organization" may  
14 receive grants under this section if it:

15 (a) Obtains a letter of support from at least one "by and for  
16 community organization" that directly serves the impacted  
17 communities;

18 (b) Provides up to 15 percent of the grant funding to supporting  
19 "by and for community organizations" for community outreach,  
20 referrals, and oversight; and

21 (c) Submits annual reports to the department demonstrating  
22 community impact and client demographic data showing service to the  
23 communities served.

24 (5)(a) Funds appropriated to the community reinvestment account  
25 must be allocated across the following funding strategies:

26 (i) Economic development under subsection (2)(a) of this section;

27 (ii) Civil and criminal legal assistance under subsection (2)(b)  
28 of this section;

29 (iii) Reentry services under subsection (2)(d) of this section;

30 (iv) Community-based violence intervention and prevention  
31 services under subsection (2)(c) of this section; and

32 (v) Agricultural and economic support and services under  
33 subsection (2)(e) of this section.

34 (b) A funding strategy shall receive at least 15 percent, but not  
35 more than 60 percent, of the total distribution in a fiscal biennium  
36 unless the community reinvestment plan, the Washington state office  
37 of equity, and the department recommend an alternative allocation to  
38 avoid unexpended funds or materially limiting access to an eligible  
39 community.

1 (c) The department must prohibit an organization that receives a  
2 grant under this section from distributing the funds to: An officer  
3 who has an interest in, or receives any compensation from, the  
4 recipient organization; a family member of an officer who has an  
5 interest in, or receives any compensation from, the recipient  
6 organization; or a business or nonprofit owned or managed by an  
7 officer who has an interest in, or receives any compensation from,  
8 the recipient organization. For the purposes of this section,  
9 "officer" has the same meaning as in RCW 23B.08.400 and "family  
10 member" has the same meaning as "family" in RCW 42.52.010.

11 (6) The distribution of the grants under this section must be  
12 done in collaboration with "by and for community organizations" (~~as~~  
13 defined by the department of commerce and the office of equity. For  
14 the ~~2025-2027~~ fiscal biennium, "by)) and consistent with the  
15 governor's executive order regarding consultation with federally  
16 recognized Indian tribes. "By and for community organizations"  
17 include, but are not limited to, those operated by and for Black,  
18 Latino, Native American, Asian, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander  
19 communities.

20 (7) The Washington state office of equity must, in partnership  
21 with the department and "by and for community organizations", review  
22 and update the community reinvestment plan as needed, but no less  
23 frequently than every five years, with the first update due in 2032,  
24 to guide the distribution of grants. The plan update must use a  
25 community-based participatory action research approach and include  
26 funding recommendations, programmatic guidelines, funding  
27 distribution, long-term economic benefits, monitoring, and  
28 evaluation.

29 NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. The department of commerce shall  
30 collaborate with the Washington state institute for public policy to  
31 provide the services in this section within the appropriations  
32 provided to the department of commerce for the community reinvestment  
33 program.

34 (1) The Washington state institute for public policy must conduct  
35 a study researching, analyzing, and determining, to the extent  
36 practicable, the department of commerce's distribution of and the  
37 recipient organizations' use of, and the regional impact of, the  
38 funds allocated under the community reinvestment account in RCW  
39 43.79.567.

1 (2) In conducting the study, the Washington state institute for  
2 public policy may conduct fact-finding and stakeholder discussions  
3 with the department of commerce, the Washington state office of  
4 equity, organizations that received funds, and organizations that  
5 were eligible for funds but did not receive funds.

6 (3) The department of commerce, the Washington state office of  
7 equity, and other relevant commissions must cooperate with the  
8 Washington state institute for public policy to facilitate access to  
9 data or other resources necessary to complete the work of this  
10 section.

11 (4) By June 30, 2027, and in compliance with RCW 43.01.036, the  
12 Washington state institute for public policy shall submit a report to  
13 the appropriate committees of the legislature with the findings of  
14 its study under this section.

15 (5) This section expires June 1, 2028.

16 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** (1) The community reinvestment program  
17 work group is created to facilitate a transition plan for joint  
18 administration of the community reinvestment program by the  
19 Washington state office of equity and the department of commerce. The  
20 work group membership must include the following:

21 (a) Two legislative members, one from each of the two largest  
22 caucuses of the house of representatives, appointed by the speaker of  
23 the house of representatives. One member shall be a member of a  
24 legislative caucus group that represents a minority community;

25 (b) Two legislative members, one from each of the two largest  
26 caucuses of the senate, appointed by the president of the senate. One  
27 member shall be a member of a legislative caucus group that  
28 represents a minority community;

29 (c) One person representing the Washington state office of  
30 equity, appointed by the director of the Washington state office of  
31 equity;

32 (d) One person representing the department of commerce, appointed  
33 by the director of the department of commerce; and

34 (e) Up to six optional members, including representatives of the  
35 office of minority and women's business enterprises, a workforce  
36 development council, and the relevant commissions, to be appointed by  
37 the chair of the community reinvestment plan work group.

1 (2) The representative from the Washington state office of equity  
2 shall serve as the community reinvestment program work group chair.  
3 The group may select a vice chair.

4 (3) The community reinvestment program work group shall prepare a  
5 report, including recommendations for legislative action, that  
6 reviews the roles and responsibilities of the Washington state office  
7 of equity and the department of commerce and develops a transition  
8 plan for joint administration by the Washington state office of  
9 equity and the department of commerce. The work group recommendation  
10 shall provide guidance for an administrative framework to go into  
11 effect prior to July 1, 2027.

12 (4) The community reinvestment program work group shall submit  
13 its transition plan and recommendations to the legislature, including  
14 the caucus representing a minority community, by November 1, 2026, in  
15 compliance with RCW 43.01.036.

16 (5) The department of commerce must collaborate with the  
17 Washington state office of equity to provide the services in this  
18 section within the appropriations provided to the department of  
19 commerce for the community reinvestment program.

20 (6) This section expires June 30, 2028.

21 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 5.** Section 2 of this act takes effect July 1,  
22 2027.

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
