AN ACT Relating to adopting the department of social and health services report recommendations addressing a regulatory oversight plan for continuing care retirement communities; and amending RCW 18.390.080.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 Sec. 1. RCW 18.390.080 and 2016 c 183 s 8 are each amended to 7 read as follows:

8 ((-(1))) The legislature finds that the ((violation of the title))protection requirements of RCW 18.390.050, the failure of a 9 10 continuing care retirement community to register with the department 11 under RCW 18.390.020, the failure of a continuing care retirement 12 community to comply with the disclosure statement delivery and 13 content requirements under RCW 18.390.060, and the failure of a 14 continuing care retirement community to comply with the resident 15 expectations established under RCW 18.390.070 are matters vitally affecting the public interest for the purpose of applying the 16 17 consumer protection act, chapter 19.86 RCW. A violation of the title 18 protection requirements under RCW 18.390.050, registration 19 requirement under RCW 18.390.020, the disclosure statement delivery 20 and content requirements under RCW 18.390.060, and the resident 21 expectations requirements under RCW 18.390.070 are not reasonable in

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1 relation to the development and preservation of business and are an 2 unfair or deceptive act in trade or commerce and an unfair method of 3 competition for the purpose of applying the consumer protection act, 4 chapter 19.86 RCW.

(2) The attorney general shall provide notice to the management 5 6 of the continuing care retirement community of submitted complaints 7 including the name of the complainant to allow the community to take corrective action. Except for violations of the title protection 8 9 requirements of RCW 18.390.050 and the failure of a continuing care 10 retirement community to register with the department under RCW 18.390.020, the attorney general shall limit its application of the 11 consumer protection act in subsection (1) of this section to those 12 13 cases in which a pattern of complaints, submitted by affected parties, or other activity that, when considered together, 14 15 demonstrate a pattern of similar conduct that, without enforcement, 16 likely establishes an unfair or deceptive act in trade or commerce and an unfair method of competition.)) practices covered by this 17 chapter are matters vitally affecting the public interest for the 18 19 purpose of applying the consumer protection act, chapter 19.86 RCW. A violation of this chapter is not reasonable in relation to the 20 development and preservation of business and is an unfair or 21 deceptive act in trade or commerce and an unfair method of 22 competition for the purpose of applying the consumer protection act, 23 24 chapter 19.86 RCW.

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
