**SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 6130**

1 AN ACT Relating to celebrating national voter registration day;  
2 amending RCW 28A.230.150; and adding a new section to chapter 28A.230  
3 RCW.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.230  
6 RCW to read as follows:

7 (1) On the third Tuesday of September of each year, or the  
8 following Tuesday if the third Tuesday of September falls on a major  
9 religious holiday, each public high school shall observe "National  
10 Voter Registration Day."

11 (2) Each year on "National Voter Registration Day," or within a  
12 two-week period before or after that date to accommodate school  
13 schedules, public high schools must, as resources allow, coordinate a  
14 voter registration event in each history or social studies class  
15 attended by high school seniors and when possible high school  
16 students in other grades. This event is part of the future voter  
17 program. Teachers must make voter sign up and registration available  
18 to all students.

19 (3) County auditors may, as resources allow, help coordinate  
20 elements of the future voter program, and participate in voter

1 registration events for students on "National Voter Registration  
2 Day."

3 (4) On each "National Voter Registration Day" all students 16  
4 years of age or older will be given the opportunity to register to  
5 vote or sign up to register to vote online in the classroom as part  
6 of the future voter program. Paper registration forms must also be  
7 made available in the classroom. Students who cannot use the online  
8 registration must be provided a paper registration form. The event  
9 must include adequate time for students to complete the registration  
10 process in class.

11 (5) The superintendent of public instruction, in consultation  
12 with the secretary of state, must update and distribute youth voter  
13 registration materials annually for eligible students to register to  
14 vote at school. Electronic notification of the availability of the  
15 materials must be distributed to high school principals and secondary  
16 social studies and history teachers.

17 (6) The superintendent of public instruction must consult with  
18 the secretary of state to provide registration methods that enable  
19 the electronic collection of information on the number of students  
20 who registered to vote on "National Voter Registration Day," with the  
21 goal of achieving at least 50,000 new voter registrations for high  
22 school students annually.

23 (7) Each year the superintendent of public instruction must  
24 report on yearly progress toward the goal established in subsection  
25 (6) of this section, including the number of high school students  
26 registered to vote by county and recommendations for increasing youth  
27 voter registration, to the governor and the appropriate standing  
28 committees of the legislature in accordance with RCW 43.01.036.

29 (8) For the purposes of this section:

30 (a) "Future voter program" refers to the information that may be  
31 collected by a number of processes about a future voter. Information  
32 about a future voter that is otherwise disclosable under chapter  
33 29A.08 RCW is subject to RCW 29A.08.725.

34 (b) "Sign up" means the act of providing information relevant to  
35 eventual official voter registration, prior to such time that the  
36 student will be 18 years of age by the next election.

37 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28A.230.150 and 2018 c 109 s 3 are each amended to  
38 read as follows:

1 (1) On January 16th of each year or the preceding Friday when  
2 January 16th falls on a nonschool day, there shall be observed within  
3 each public school "Temperance and Good Citizenship Day." Annually  
4 the state superintendent of public instruction shall duly prepare and  
5 publish for circulation among the teachers of the state a program for  
6 use on such day embodying topics pertinent thereto and may from year  
7 to year designate particular laws for special observance.

8 (2) Each year on "Temperance and Good Citizenship Day," (~~social~~  
9 ~~studies teachers~~) public high schools must, as resources allow,  
10 coordinate a voter registration event in each history or social  
11 studies class attended by high school seniors in alignment with  
12 section 1 of this act. The primary focus of these events must be to  
13 support eligible students who missed the opportunity to become future  
14 voters or registered voters on "National Voter Registration Day"  
15 earlier in the school year. (~~This event is part of the future voter~~  
16 ~~program. Teachers must make voter sign up and registration available~~  
17 ~~to all students.~~

18 ~~(3) County auditors may, as resources allow, help coordinate~~  
19 ~~elements of the future voter program, and participate in voter~~  
20 ~~registration events for students on "Temperance and Good Citizenship~~  
21 ~~Day."~~

22 ~~(4) On each temperance and good citizenship day all students who~~  
23 ~~will be eighteen years of age or older by the time of the next~~  
24 ~~general election will be given the opportunity to register to vote~~  
25 ~~online in the classroom. Paper registration must also be made~~  
26 ~~available in the classroom. Students who do not possess a state~~  
27 ~~identificard or driver's license must be provided a paper registration~~  
28 ~~form. The event must include adequate time for students to complete~~  
29 ~~the registration process in class.~~

30 ~~(5) The superintendent of public instruction, in consultation~~  
31 ~~with the secretary of state, must update and distribute youth voter~~  
32 ~~registration materials annually, by December 1st, for eligible~~  
33 ~~students to register to vote at school. Electronic notification of~~  
34 ~~the availability of the materials must be distributed to high school~~  
35 ~~principals and secondary social studies and history teachers.~~

36 ~~(6) The superintendent of public instruction must consult with~~  
37 ~~the secretary of state to provide registration methods that enable~~  
38 ~~the electronic collection of information on the number of students~~  
39 ~~who registered to vote on "Temperance and Good Citizenship Day," with~~  
40 ~~the goal of achieving at least fifty thousand new voter registrations~~

1 ~~for seventeen and eighteen year olds annually, beginning in January~~  
2 ~~2020.~~

3 ~~(7) Beginning March 1, 2020, and annually thereafter, the~~  
4 ~~superintendent of public instruction must report on yearly progress~~  
5 ~~toward the goal established in subsection (5) of this section,~~  
6 ~~including the number of seventeen and eighteen year olds registered~~  
7 ~~to vote by county and recommendations for increasing youth voter~~  
8 ~~registration, to the governor and the appropriate standing committees~~  
9 ~~of the legislature in accordance with RCW 43.01.036.~~

10 ~~(8) For the purposes of this section:~~

11 ~~(a) "Future voter program" refers to the information that may be~~  
12 ~~collected by a number of processes about a future voter. Information~~  
13 ~~that is otherwise disclosable under chapter 29A.08 RCW cannot be~~  
14 ~~disclosed on the future voter until the person reaches age eighteen,~~  
15 ~~except for the purpose of processing and delivering ballots.~~

16 ~~(b) "Sign up" means the act of providing information relevant to~~  
17 ~~eventual official voter registration, prior to such time that he or~~  
18 ~~she will be eighteen years of age by the next election.) )~~
