1 AN ACT Relating to protecting critical infrastructure; amending
2 RCW 19.290.020, 19.290.030, 19.290.040, 19.290.080, 19.290.140,
3 9A.82.010, and 9.94A.515; adding new sections to chapter 9A.56 RCW;
4 and prescribing penalties.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 19.290.020 and 2024 c 301 s 4 are each amended to
7 read as follows:

8 (1) At the time of a transaction, every scrap metal business
9 doing business in this state shall produce wherever that business is
10 conducted an accurate and legible record of each transaction
11 involving nonferrous metal property. This record must be written in
12 the English language, documented on a standardized form or in
13 electronic form, and contain the following information:

14 (a) The signature of the person with whom the transaction is
15 made;

16 (b) The time, date, location, and value of the transaction;

17 (c) The name of the employee representing the scrap metal
18 business in the transaction;

19 (d) The name, street address, and telephone number of the person
20 with whom the transaction is made;

1 (e) The license plate number and state of issuance of the license
2 plate on the motor vehicle used to deliver the nonferrous metal
3 property subject to the transaction;

4 (f) A description of the motor vehicle used to deliver the
5 nonferrous metal property subject to the transaction;

6 (g) The current driver's license number or other government-
7 issued picture identification card number of the seller or a copy of
8 the seller's government-issued picture identification card; (~~and~~)

9 (h) A description of the predominant types of nonferrous metal
10 property subject to the transaction, utilizing the institute of scrap
11 recycling industries' generally accepted terminology, and including
12 weight, quantity, or volume; and

13 (i) One or more photographs accurately depicting the nonferrous
14 metal property involved in the transaction and legible photographs of
15 any identifiable markings on the nonferrous metal property.

16 (2) For every transaction that involves nonferrous metal
17 property, every scrap metal business doing business in the state
18 shall require the person with whom a transaction is being made to
19 sign a declaration. The declaration may be included as part of the
20 transactional record required under subsection (1) of this section,
21 or on a receipt for the transaction. The declaration must state
22 substantially the following:

23 "I, the undersigned, affirm under penalty of law that the
24 property that is subject to this transaction is not to the best of my
25 knowledge stolen property."

26 The declaration must be signed and dated by the person with whom
27 the transaction is being made. An employee of the scrap metal
28 business must witness the signing and dating of the declaration and
29 sign the declaration accordingly before any transaction may be
30 consummated.

31 (3) The record and declaration required under this section must
32 be open to the inspection of any commissioned law enforcement officer
33 of the state or any of its political subdivisions at all times during
34 the ordinary hours of business, or at reasonable times if ordinary
35 hours of business are not kept, and must be maintained wherever that
36 business is conducted for five years following the date of the
37 transaction.

38 (4) For every transaction involving nonferrous metal property,
39 every scrap metal business doing business in this state shall

1 digitally upload information collected under subsection (1) of this
2 section to a database approved by the Washington state patrol.

3 (5) It is unlawful to sell or offer to sell records of
4 transactions involving nonferrous metal property as described in this
5 section.

6 **Sec. 2.** RCW 19.290.030 and 2024 c 301 s 5 are each amended to
7 read as follows:

8 (1) No scrap metal business may enter into a transaction to
9 purchase or receive nonferrous metal property from any person who
10 cannot produce at least one piece of current government-issued
11 picture identification, including a valid driver's license or
12 identification card issued by any state.

13 (2) No scrap metal business may purchase or receive commercial
14 metal property unless the seller: (a) Has a commercial account with
15 the scrap metal business; (b) can prove ownership of the property by
16 producing written documentation that the seller is the owner of the
17 property; or (c) can produce written documentation that the seller is
18 an employee or agent authorized to sell the property on behalf of a
19 commercial enterprise.

20 (3) No scrap metal business may enter into a transaction to
21 purchase or receive metallic wire that was burned in whole or in part
22 to remove insulation unless the seller can produce written proof to
23 the scrap metal business that the wire was lawfully burned.

24 (4) (a) No transaction involving nonferrous metal property may be
25 made in cash or with any person who does not provide a street address
26 and photographic identification and sign a declaration under the
27 requirements of RCW 19.290.020 except as described in (b) of this
28 subsection. The person with whom the transaction is being made may
29 only be paid by a stored value device, electronic funds transfer,
30 other electronic payment method, or a nontransferable check, mailed
31 by the scrap metal business to a street address provided under RCW
32 19.290.020, no earlier than three days after the transaction was
33 made. A transaction occurs on the date provided in the record
34 required under RCW 19.290.020.

35 (b) A scrap metal business that is in compliance with this
36 chapter may pay up to a maximum of \$30 in (~~cash~~) a stored value
37 device(~~(7)~~) or electronic funds transfer for nonferrous metal
38 property. The balance of the value of the transaction may be made by
39 nontransferable check, stored value device, or electronic funds

1 transfer at the time the transaction is made if the scrap metal
2 business digitally captures:

3 (i) A copy of one piece of current government-issued picture
4 identification, including a current driver's license or
5 identification card issued by any state; and

6 (ii) Either a picture or video of either the material subject to
7 the transaction in the form received or the material subject to the
8 transaction within the vehicle which the material was transported to
9 the scrap metal business.

10 (c) The requirements in this subsection do not apply to
11 transactions conducted between commercial accounts.

12 (5) (a) A scrap metal business's usage of video surveillance shall
13 be sufficient to comply with subsection (4) (b) (ii) of this section so
14 long as the video captures the material subject to the transaction.

15 (b) A digital image or picture taken under this section must be
16 available for two years from the date of transaction, while a video
17 recording must be available for 30 days.

18 (6) No scrap metal business may purchase or receive beer kegs
19 from anyone except a manufacturer of beer kegs or licensed brewery.

20 (7) When a scrap metal business enters into a nonferrous metal
21 property transaction with a person, the scrap metal business shall
22 digitally upload information collected under RCW 19.290.020(1) to a
23 database approved by the Washington state patrol.

24 **Sec. 3.** RCW 19.290.040 and 2024 c 301 s 6 are each amended to
25 read as follows:

26 (1) Every scrap metal business must create and maintain a
27 permanent record with a commercial enterprise, including another
28 scrap metal business, in order to establish a commercial account.
29 That record, at a minimum, must include the following information:

30 (a) The full name of the commercial enterprise or commercial
31 account;

32 (b) The business address and telephone number of the commercial
33 enterprise or commercial account; and

34 (c) The full name of the person employed by the commercial
35 enterprise who is authorized to deliver nonferrous metal property and
36 commercial metal property to the scrap metal business.

37 (2) The record maintained by a scrap metal business for a
38 commercial account must document every purchase or receipt of
39 nonferrous metal property and commercial metal property from the

1 commercial enterprise. The record must be maintained for three years
2 following the date of the transfer or receipt. The documentation must
3 include, at a minimum, the following information:

4 (a) The time, date, and value of the property being purchased or
5 received;

6 (b) A description of the predominant types of property being
7 purchased or received; and

8 (c) The signature of the person delivering the property to the
9 scrap metal business.

10 (3) It is unlawful to sell or offer to sell a record maintained
11 by a scrap metal business as described in this section.

12 **Sec. 4.** RCW 19.290.080 and 2024 c 301 s 9 are each amended to
13 read as follows:

14 (1) Each violation of the requirements of this chapter that are
15 not subject to criminal penalties shall be a civil penalty punishable
16 by a fine of not more than \$1,000.

17 (2) Within two years of a violation of any of the requirements of
18 this chapter that results in a civil penalty under this section, each
19 subsequent violation shall be punishable by a fine of not more than
20 \$2,000.

21 (3) (a) A scrap metal business that engages in a pledge for, the
22 purchase of, or the trade of stolen copper that was used in
23 telecommunication cable, the theft of which can result in disruption
24 to emergency telecommunications services, is liable for a civil
25 penalty of:

26 (i) Not more than \$10,000 for a first violation; and

27 (ii) Not more than \$20,000 for a second violation.

28 (b) A third violation of this subsection must result in loss of
29 licensure.

30 **Sec. 5.** RCW 19.290.140 and 2013 c 322 s 16 are each amended to
31 read as follows:

32 (1) A license issued on the scrap metal license application
33 remains in force until suspended or revoked and may be renewed
34 annually upon reapplication and upon payment of the required fee. A
35 licensee who fails or neglects to renew the license before the
36 assigned expiration date shall pay the fee for an original scrap
37 metal license as provided in this chapter.

1 (2) Whenever a scrap metal processor, recycler, or supplier
2 ceases to do business as such or the license has been suspended or
3 revoked, the licensee shall immediately surrender the license to the
4 department of licensing.

5 (3) A scrap metal business that commits three violations under
6 RCW 19.290.080 must immediately surrender the license to the
7 department of licensing.

8 **Sec. 6.** RCW 9A.82.010 and 2024 c 301 s 27 are each amended to
9 read as follows:

10 Unless the context requires the contrary, the definitions in this
11 section apply throughout this chapter.

12 (1) (a) "Beneficial interest" means:

13 (i) The interest of a person as a beneficiary under a trust
14 established under Title 11 RCW in which the trustee for the trust
15 holds legal or record title to real property;

16 (ii) The interest of a person as a beneficiary under any other
17 trust arrangement under which a trustee holds legal or record title
18 to real property for the benefit of the beneficiary; or

19 (iii) The interest of a person under any other form of express
20 fiduciary arrangement under which one person holds legal or record
21 title to real property for the benefit of the other person.

22 (b) "Beneficial interest" does not include the interest of a
23 stockholder in a corporation or the interest of a partner in a
24 general partnership or limited partnership.

25 (c) A beneficial interest is considered to be located where the
26 real property owned by the trustee is located.

27 (2) "Control" means the possession of a sufficient interest to
28 permit substantial direction over the affairs of an enterprise.

29 (3) "Creditor" means a person making an extension of credit or a
30 person claiming by, under, or through a person making an extension of
31 credit.

32 (4) "Criminal profiteering" means any act, including any
33 anticipatory or completed offense, committed for financial gain, that
34 is chargeable or indictable under the laws of the state in which the
35 act occurred and, if the act occurred in a state other than this
36 state, would be chargeable or indictable under the laws of this state
37 had the act occurred in this state and punishable as a felony and by
38 imprisonment for more than one year, regardless of whether the act is
39 charged or indicted, as any of the following:

- 1 (a) Murder, as defined in RCW 9A.32.030 and 9A.32.050;
- 2 (b) Robbery, as defined in RCW 9A.56.200 and 9A.56.210;
- 3 (c) Kidnapping, as defined in RCW 9A.40.020 and 9A.40.030;
- 4 (d) Forgery, as defined in RCW 9A.60.020 and 9A.60.030;
- 5 (e) Theft, as defined in RCW 9A.56.030, 9A.56.040, 9A.56.060,
6 9A.56.080, and 9A.56.083;
- 7 (f) Unlawful sale of subscription television services, as defined
8 in RCW 9A.56.230;
- 9 (g) Theft of telecommunication services or unlawful manufacture
10 of a telecommunication device, as defined in RCW 9A.56.262 and
11 9A.56.264;
- 12 (h) Child selling or child buying, as defined in RCW 9A.64.030;
- 13 (i) Bribery, as defined in RCW 9A.68.010, 9A.68.020, 9A.68.040,
14 and 9A.68.050;
- 15 (j) Gambling, as defined in RCW 9.46.220 (~~and~~), 9.46.215, and
16 9.46.217;
- 17 (k) Extortion, as defined in RCW 9A.56.120 and 9A.56.130;
- 18 (l) Unlawful production of payment instruments, unlawful
19 possession of payment instruments, unlawful possession of a personal
20 identification device, unlawful possession of fictitious
21 identification, or unlawful possession of instruments of financial
22 fraud, as defined in RCW 9A.56.320;
- 23 (m) Extortionate extension of credit, as defined in RCW
24 9A.82.020;
- 25 (n) Advancing money for use in an extortionate extension of
26 credit, as defined in RCW 9A.82.030;
- 27 (o) Collection of an extortionate extension of credit, as defined
28 in RCW 9A.82.040;
- 29 (p) Collection of an unlawful debt, as defined in RCW 9A.82.045;
- 30 (q) Delivery or manufacture of controlled substances or
31 possession with intent to deliver or manufacture controlled
32 substances under chapter 69.50 RCW;
- 33 (r) Trafficking in stolen property, as defined in RCW 9A.82.050;
- 34 (s) Leading organized crime, as defined in RCW 9A.82.060;
- 35 (t) Money laundering, as defined in RCW 9A.83.020;
- 36 (u) Obstructing criminal investigations or prosecutions in
37 violation of RCW 9A.72.090, 9A.72.100, 9A.72.110, 9A.72.120,
38 9A.72.130, 9A.76.070, or 9A.76.180;
- 39 (v) Fraud in the purchase or sale of securities, as defined in
40 RCW 21.20.010;

1 (w) Promoting pornography, as defined in RCW 9.68.140;
2 (x) Sexual exploitation of children, as defined in RCW 9.68A.040,
3 9.68A.050, and 9.68A.060;
4 (y) Promoting prostitution, as defined in RCW 9A.88.070 and
5 9A.88.080;
6 (z) Arson, as defined in RCW 9A.48.020 and 9A.48.030;
7 (aa) Assault, as defined in RCW 9A.36.011 and 9A.36.021;
8 (bb) Assault of a child, as defined in RCW 9A.36.120 and
9 9A.36.130;
10 (cc) A pattern of equity skimming, as defined in RCW 61.34.020;
11 (dd) Commercial telephone solicitation in violation of RCW
12 19.158.040(1);
13 (ee) Trafficking in insurance claims, as defined in RCW
14 48.30A.015;
15 (ff) Unlawful practice of law, as defined in RCW 2.48.180;
16 (gg) Commercial bribery, as defined in RCW 9A.68.060;
17 (hh) Health care false claims, as defined in RCW 48.80.030;
18 (ii) Unlicensed practice of a profession or business, as defined
19 in RCW 18.130.190(7);
20 (jj) Improperly obtaining financial information, as defined in
21 RCW 9.35.010;
22 (kk) Identity theft, as defined in RCW 9.35.020;
23 (ll) Unlawful shipment of cigarettes in violation of RCW
24 70.155.105(6) (a) or (b);
25 (mm) Unlawful shipment of cigarettes in violation of RCW
26 82.24.110(2);
27 (nn) Unauthorized sale or procurement of telephone records in
28 violation of RCW 9.26A.140;
29 (oo) Theft with the intent to resell, as defined in RCW
30 9A.56.340;
31 (pp) Organized retail theft, as defined in RCW 9A.56.350;
32 (qq) Mortgage fraud, as defined in RCW 19.144.080;
33 (rr) Commercial sexual abuse of a minor, as defined in RCW
34 9.68A.100;
35 (ss) Promoting commercial sexual abuse of a minor, as defined in
36 RCW 9.68A.101;
37 (tt) Trafficking, as defined in RCW 9A.40.100, promoting travel
38 for commercial sexual abuse of a minor, as defined in RCW 9.68A.102,
39 and permitting commercial sexual abuse of a minor, as defined in RCW
40 9.68A.103; ((~~ee~~))

1 (uu) Trafficking in catalytic converters, as defined in RCW
2 9A.82.190 and 9A.82.200; or

3 (vv) Destruction of critical communications infrastructure, as
4 described in section 7 of this act.

5 (5) "Dealer in property" means a person who buys and sells
6 property as a business.

7 (6) "Debtor" means a person to whom an extension of credit is
8 made or a person who guarantees the repayment of an extension of
9 credit or in any manner undertakes to indemnify the creditor against
10 loss resulting from the failure of a person to whom an extension is
11 made to repay the same.

12 (7) "Documentary material" means any book, paper, document,
13 writing, drawing, graph, chart, photograph, phonograph record,
14 magnetic tape, computer printout, other data compilation from which
15 information can be obtained or from which information can be
16 translated into usable form, or other tangible item.

17 (8) "Enterprise" includes any individual, sole proprietorship,
18 partnership, corporation, business trust, or other profit or
19 nonprofit legal entity, and includes any union, association, or group
20 of individuals associated in fact although not a legal entity, and
21 both illicit and licit enterprises and governmental and
22 nongovernmental entities.

23 (9) "Extortionate extension of credit" means an extension of
24 credit with respect to which it is the understanding of the creditor
25 and the debtor at the time the extension is made that delay in making
26 repayment or failure to make repayment could result in the use of
27 violence or other criminal means to cause harm to the person,
28 reputation, or property of any person.

29 (10) "Extortionate means" means the use, or an express or
30 implicit threat of use, of violence or other criminal means to cause
31 harm to the person, reputation, or property of any person.

32 (11) "Financial institution" means any bank, trust company,
33 savings and loan association, savings bank, mutual savings bank,
34 credit union, or loan company under the jurisdiction of the state or
35 an agency of the United States.

36 (12) "Pattern of criminal profiteering activity" means engaging
37 in at least three acts of criminal profiteering, one of which
38 occurred after July 1, 1985, and the last of which occurred within
39 five years, excluding any period of imprisonment, after the
40 commission of the earliest act of criminal profiteering. In order to

1 constitute a pattern, the three acts must have the same or similar
2 intent, results, accomplices, principals, victims, or methods of
3 commission, or be otherwise interrelated by distinguishing
4 characteristics including a nexus to the same enterprise, and must
5 not be isolated events. However, in any civil proceedings brought
6 pursuant to RCW 9A.82.100 by any person other than the attorney
7 general or county prosecuting attorney in which one or more acts of
8 fraud in the purchase or sale of securities are asserted as acts of
9 criminal profiteering activity, it is a condition to civil liability
10 under RCW 9A.82.100 that the defendant has been convicted in a
11 criminal proceeding of fraud in the purchase or sale of securities
12 under RCW 21.20.400 or under the laws of another state or of the
13 United States requiring the same elements of proof, but such
14 conviction need not relate to any act or acts asserted as acts of
15 criminal profiteering activity in such civil action under RCW
16 9A.82.100.

17 (13) "Real property" means any real property or interest in real
18 property, including but not limited to a land sale contract, lease,
19 or mortgage of real property.

20 (14) "Records" means any book, paper, writing, record, computer
21 program, or other material.

22 (15) "Repayment of an extension of credit" means the repayment,
23 satisfaction, or discharge in whole or in part of a debt or claim,
24 acknowledged or disputed, valid or invalid, resulting from or in
25 connection with that extension of credit.

26 (16) "Stolen property" means property that has been obtained by
27 theft, robbery, or extortion.

28 (17) "To collect an extension of credit" means to induce in any
29 way a person to make repayment thereof.

30 (18) "To extend credit" means to make or renew a loan or to enter
31 into an agreement, tacit or express, whereby the repayment or
32 satisfaction of a debt or claim, whether acknowledged or disputed,
33 valid or invalid, and however arising, may or shall be deferred.

34 (19) "Traffic" means to sell, transfer, distribute, dispense, or
35 otherwise dispose of stolen property to another person, or to buy,
36 receive, possess, or obtain control of stolen property, with intent
37 to sell, transfer, distribute, dispense, or otherwise dispose of the
38 property to another person.

39 (20) (a) "Trustee" means:

1 (i) A person acting as a trustee under a trust established under
2 Title 11 RCW in which the trustee holds legal or record title to real
3 property;

4 (ii) A person who holds legal or record title to real property in
5 which another person has a beneficial interest; or

6 (iii) A successor trustee to a person who is a trustee under
7 (a)(i) or (ii) of this subsection.

8 (b) "Trustee" does not mean a person appointed or acting as:

9 (i) A personal representative under Title 11 RCW;

10 (ii) A trustee of any testamentary trust;

11 (iii) A trustee of any indenture of trust under which a bond is
12 issued; or

13 (iv) A trustee under a deed of trust.

14 (21) "Unlawful debt" means any money or other thing of value
15 constituting principal or interest of a debt that is legally
16 unenforceable in the state in full or in part because the debt was
17 incurred or contracted:

18 (a) In violation of any one of the following:

19 (i) Chapter 67.16 RCW relating to horse racing;

20 (ii) Chapter 9.46 RCW relating to gambling;

21 (b) In a gambling activity in violation of federal law; or

22 (c) In connection with the business of lending money or a thing
23 of value at a rate that is at least twice the permitted rate under
24 the applicable state or federal law relating to usury.

25 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7.** A new section is added to chapter 9A.56
26 RCW to read as follows:

27 (1) A person is guilty of destruction of critical communications
28 infrastructure if, with intent to cause damage, commit theft, or
29 cause harm to communications infrastructure including both physical
30 and cyber components that deliver voice, video, and data services, he
31 or she causes damage to or renders inoperable such voice, video, or
32 data services.

33 (2) Destruction of critical communications infrastructure is a
34 class C felony.

35 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8.** A new section is added to chapter 9A.56
36 RCW to read as follows:

1 (1) In addition to the criminal penalties provided in section 7
2 of this act, there is created a civil cause of action for destruction
3 of critical communications infrastructure.

4 (2) A person who sustains injury to his or her person, business,
5 or property by an act described in section 7 of this act may file an
6 action in superior court against the perpetrator for the recovery of
7 damages and the costs of the suit, including reasonable investigative
8 and attorneys' fees and costs.

9 **Sec. 9.** RCW 9.94A.515 and 2025 c 220 s 7 are each amended to
10 read as follows:
