1 AN ACT Relating to the veterans affairs advisory committee; and
2 amending RCW 43.60A.080.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.60A.080 and 2015 c 219 s 1 are each amended to
5 read as follows:

6 (1) There is hereby created a veterans affairs advisory committee
7 which shall serve in an advisory capacity to the governor and the
8 director of the department of veterans affairs. The committee shall
9 appoint members to serve as liaisons to each of the state veterans'
10 homes, unless the home has a representative appointed to the
11 committee. This liaison must share information on committee meetings
12 and business with the resident council of the state's veterans'
13 homes, as well as bring information back for the committee's
14 consideration to ensure veterans' home resident issues are included
15 at regular committee meetings. The committee shall be composed of
16 seventeen members to be appointed by the governor, and shall consist
17 of the following:

18 (a) ((One)) Two representatives of the ((Washington soldiers'
19 home and colony at Orting and one representative of the Washington
20 veterans' home at Retsil)) state veterans' homes identified in RCW
21 43.60A.075. Each home's resident council may nominate up to three

1 individuals whose names are to be forwarded by the director to the
2 governor. In making the appointments, the governor shall consider
3 these recommendations or request additional nominations. If (~~the~~
4 ~~resident council does not provide any nomination~~) there are no homes
5 nominations, the governor may appoint a member at large in place of
6 (~~the~~) a home's representative.

7 (b) One representative each from the three congressionally
8 chartered or nationally recognized veterans service organizations as
9 listed in the current "Directory of Veterans Service Organizations"
10 published by the United States department of veterans affairs with
11 the largest number of active members in the state of Washington as
12 determined by the director. The organizations' state commanders may
13 each submit a list of three names to be forwarded to the governor by
14 the director. In making the appointments, the governor shall consider
15 these recommendations or request additional nominations.

16 (c) (~~Ten~~) Six members shall be chosen to represent those
17 congressionally chartered or nationally recognized veterans service
18 organizations listed in the directory under (b) of this subsection
19 and having at least one active chapter within the state of
20 Washington. Up to three nominations may be forwarded from each
21 organization to the governor by the director. In making the
22 appointments, the governor shall consider these recommendations or
23 request additional nominations.

24 (d) (~~Two~~) Six members shall be veterans at large, as well as
25 any other at large member appointed pursuant to (a) of this
26 subsection. Any individual or organization may nominate a veteran for
27 an at large position. Organizational affiliation shall not be a
28 prerequisite for nomination or appointment. All nominations for the
29 at large positions shall be forwarded by the director to the
30 governor.

31 (e) No organization shall have more than one official
32 representative on the committee at any one time.

33 (f) In making appointments to the committee, care shall be taken
34 to ensure that members represent all geographical portions of the
35 state (~~and~~), minority viewpoints, military experiences, and
36 personal attributes, and that the issues and views of concern to
37 women veterans are represented.

38 (2) All members shall have terms of four years. In the case of a
39 vacancy, appointment shall be only for the remainder of the unexpired
40 term for which the vacancy occurs. No member may serve more than two

1 consecutive terms, with vacancy appointments to an unexpired term not
2 considered as a term. (~~Members appointed before June 11, 1992, shall~~
3 ~~continue to serve until the expiration of their current terms; and~~
4 ~~then, subject to the conditions contained in this section, are~~
5 ~~eligible for reappointment.~~)

6 (3) The committee shall adopt an order of business for conducting
7 its meetings.

8 (4) The committee shall have the following powers and duties:

9 (a) To serve in an advisory capacity to the governor and the
10 director on matters pertaining to the department of veterans affairs;

11 (b) To acquaint themselves fully with the operations of the
12 department and recommend such changes to the governor and the
13 director as they deem advisable.

14 (5) Members of the committee shall receive no compensation for
15 the performance of their duties but shall receive a per diem
16 allowance and mileage expense according to the provisions of chapter
17 43.03 RCW.
