Public Timber

Harvest of timber not sold by a competitive bidding process which is prohibited under the authority of state or federal law from foreign export may be eligible for the domestic market adjustment. The adjustment may be applied only to those species of timber which must be processed domestically. According to type of sale, the adjustment may be applied to the following species:

Federal Timber Sales: All species except Alaska Yellow Cedar. (Stat. Ref. - 36 CFR 223.10)

State, and Other Nonfederal, Public Timber Sales: Western Red Cedar only. (Stat. Ref. - 50 USC appendix 2406.1)

Private timber

Harvest of private timber which is legally restricted from foreign export, under the authority of The Forest Resources Conservation and Shortage Relief Act (Public Law 101-382), (16 U.S.C. Sec. 620 et seq.); the Export Administration Act of 1979 (50 U.S.C. App. 2406(i); a Cooperative Sustained Yield Unit Agreement made pursuant to the Act of March 29, 1944, (16 U.S.C. WAC 463-39-100 Registration. (1) The owner or operator of each stationary source subject to chapter 80.50 RCW shall register the source with the council.

Registration shall be on forms which have been adopted for use by the department of ecology within the time specified thereon.

A report of closure shall be filed with the council within ninety days after operations producing emissions permanently ceased at any source within the council's jurisdiction.

- (2) The council shall ensure that the following, as it pertains to sources covered under this rule, is passed on to ecology in a timely manner for inclusion in its permit register:
- (a) Public meetings or hearings on draft operating permits;
  - (b) Receipt of complete applications;
  - (c) Permit appeals;
- (d) Issuance or denial of final permit, permit modifications, or renewals;
- (e) Authorization for a source to operate without an operating permit by limiting its potential to emit to levels below those that would require the source to obtain an operating permit;
- (f) Periodic summaries of enforcement order and changes made without revising the permit pursuant to WAC 173-401-722.
