Purpose of the Proposal and Its Anticipated Effects, Including Any Changes in Existing Rules: This proposal adopts the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) handbooks as follows:

- (1) 2006 edition of NIST Handbook 44 (Specifications, Tolerances, and Other Technical Requirements for Weighing and Measuring Devices) as required by RCW 19.94.195; and
- (2) 2006 edition of NIST Handbook 130 (Uniform Laws and Regulations in the areas of legal metrology and engine fuel quality).

There is not a 2006 version of NIST Handbook 133 (Checking the Net Contents of Packaged Goods) - the 2005 (fourth edition) remains the most current.

Reasons Supporting Proposal: RCW 19.94.195 requires that the most current version of NIST Handbook 44 be adopted every year. The department also adopts the current version of NIST Handbook 130 and NIST Handbook 133 in order to maintain uniformity with other states. Forty-eight of

the fifty states use NIST Handbook 130 and the majority of the states use NIST Handbook 44 and NIST Handbook 133.
