Ecology's air quality program is proposing to amend the Natural Gas Fueled Boiler General Order. (General Order 06-AQG-001.) The revised general order incorporates opportunities for using fuels besides natural gas. These additional fuels are propane, liquefied petroleum gas and diesel fuel.
