**Semi-Annual Agenda for Rules Under Development
(Per RCW 34.05.314)
July - December 2009**

The state risk manager, risk management division, will be undergoing rule-making activity related to regulation of the local government self-insurance program. The rule-making activities include:

1. The state risk manager is required to adopt rules which create standards for solvency, management, operations and certain contracts. The office of financial management, working with the property and liability advisory board, has created proposed revisions to chapter 82.60 RCW which: (1) Remove the health and welfare rules from chapter 82.60 RCW and address them in a separate rule-making process, (2) replace temporary guidelines with updated rules specific to joint property and liability self-insurance programs to be adopted using the Administrative Procedure Act process described in chapter 34.05 RCW as required by RCW 48.62.-061, and (3) remove the provision for waivers from rules and guidelines and allow consistent regulation of all programs.

The revisions to chapter 82.60 RCW will result in standards adopted in rules which can be easily identified and are specific to individual and joint property and liability programs. Individual and joint health and welfare programs will be able to clearly identify standards that apply to those programs in a newly created separate chapter. By creating rules, rather than guidelines, local governments wishing to form new programs will be able to easily locate the specific regulations which apply to their programs in the rules, as prescribed in RCW 48.62.061. The rule-making hearings have been scheduled for four days in July, two days each in eastern and western Washington.

2. SSB 5665 was enacted during the 2009 legislative session. SSB 5665 authorizes affordable housing entities to participate in a joint self-insurance program covering property and liability risks. Section 6 requires the state risk manager to adopt rules governing the management and operation of this type of program. The rule-making process will begin this summer. The rules must be in place by January 1, 2010.

Final Issuance of the Washington State Department of Ecology Water Treatment Plant General Permit

Permit Issuance: The water treatment plant (WTP) general permit, issued by the Washington state department of ecology (ecology) on June 16, 2004, expired [expires] on July 15, 2009. Ecology reissued the general permit, with minor changes on July 15, 2009. The effective date of the permit is September 1, 2009.

Purpose of the Permit: The WTP general permit is a statewide permit providing permit coverage for thirty-two water treatment plants. Water treatment plants under this permit treat water through filtration processes producing a finished water for drinking or for industrial activities. The filtration process removes silt, organics, microorganisms, and other impurities, trapping this material in the filter. Periodically, plant operators back-flush filters to remove the trapped material and restore filtration capacity. Other wastewaters are generated through routine cleaning. Treatment plants typically treat these wastewaters using settling basins. Potential pollutants include fine silt, and trace amounts of organics, microorganisms, additives and other impurities removed during filtration as well as additives. Additives may include chlorine, chemicals to adjust pH, and chemicals that enhance the removal of impurities in the water.

Public Notice Process: Ecology accepted written and oral comments on the draft WTP general permit, fact sheet, and fact sheet addendum from May 6, 2009, through June 9, 2009. Ecology hosted a public hearing on the draft general

permit in Lacey, Washington, on June 8, 2009. Ecology received no public comments on the draft permit or associated documents.

Applying for Coverage: Facilities covered under the existing WTP general permit are automatically covered under the reissued permit. New or unpermitted facilities may obtain coverage under the general permit by submitting a complete permit application to ecology and satisfying all applicable public notice and State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) requirements (WAC 173-226-200). The application is available online at <http://www.ecy.wa.gov/programs/wq/wtp/index.html>.

Appeal Options: The terms and conditions of this general permit may be appealed only by filing an appeal to the pollution control hearings board and by serving it upon ecology at the addresses below. Appeals of the general permit must be made within thirty days of issuance or receipt, whichever is later (see chapter 43.21B RCW). The procedures and requirements for the appeal process are contained in RCW 43.21B.310. An appeal must be filed with the Pollution Control Hearings Board, P.O. Box 40903, Olympia, WA 98504-0903; or the Department of Ecology, P.O. Box 47600, Olympia, WA 98504-7600.

The terms and conditions of a general permit, as they apply to an individual discharger, are also appealable within thirty days of the effective date of coverage of that discharger, in accordance with chapter 43.21B RCW. This appeal is limited to the general permit's applicability or non-applicability to a specific discharger.

Subject: Alien emergency medical program (AEM) changes.

Effective Date: August 1, 2009.

Document Description: The legislature directed the medicaid program to reduce its expenditures. On August 1, 2009, the medical criteria for eligibility and the scope of services that will be paid for under the federal medicaid definitions for emergency services will change. Certain services will no longer be reimbursable. This affects aliens who have an emergency medical event. Evidentiary hearings to challenge these changes will not be available. Emergency WACs will be effective August 1, 2009.
