Dear Rogers:

As you know, today I signed Engrossed Second Substitute House Bill 2658 into law, with the exception of Section 404 of the bill. This section, among other things, required the legislature to approve or recommend changes to the state energy strategy and updates via concurrent resolution. I believe this subsection would have created ambiguities that would impede the Department of Commerce in the performance of its duties. The language could be read to require legislative approval before the Department undertakes any actions contained in the strategy, including executive actions authorized by existing law.

Unfortunately, section 404 of the bill also defined the process by which the department would update and revise the state energy strategy. I acknowledge the process outlined in the bill reflected significant negotiation throughout the legislative process and agreement among stakeholders.

Therefore, I direct the Department of Commerce to following the process and schedule outlined in the bill by conducting the update and revision under the Department's existing statutory authority.

Specifically, I direct the Department to:

- Update the strategy by December 1, 2010;
- Fully revise the strategy by December 1, 2011;
- Convene a technical experts panel to provide unbiased information that supports high quality decision making;
- Engage a broad advisory committee with membership that represents a balance of interests;
- Deliver the update and full revision reports, including implementation actions to the Legislature and to me; and
- Seek in-kind and financial support for this process from non state sources.

I further direct you to work closely with legislators during development of, and in crafting the recommendations for, the updated state energy strategy. Many of the needed actions will require the support and affirmative action of the state Legislature.

Announcing a Draft Aquatic Invasive Species Management General Permit for Review and Comment

Proposed Permit: The Washington state department of ecology (ecology) is proposing a new aquatic invasive species management general permit to regulate the use of chemicals or control products for the management of aquatic invasive species animals and nonnative invasive marine algae in surface waters of Washington state. Ecology limits chemical application to marine and freshwater animals or marine algae. The permit will regulate the use of chemicals for potentially invasive aquatic species as determined by ecology in consultation with other agencies.

Washington's water quality statutes and regulations do not allow the discharge of pollutants to waters of the state without permit coverage. Algaecides, herbicides, insecticides, molluscicides, piscicides and any other chemical or product appropriate for aquatic invasive species management are potential pollutants, and therefore require a discharge permit before application to surface waters. Ecology issues general permits in place of a series of individual permits when the permitted activities are similar. Agencies that receive coverage under the general permit must comply with the terms and conditions of the permit.

Purpose of the Permit: This permit would allow for the treatment of early infestations and for small localized projects that may lead to the eradication of the invasive species from each site, or for the containment of the invasive species to one area or site. State agencies will apply for coverage under this permit prior to implementing their invasive aquatic animal control activities. Management activities are organized into either marine/estuarine projects or freshwater projects.

rate storm sewer system (MS4). MS4s are conveyances or a system of conveyances including roads with drainage systems, streets, catch basins, ditches, man-made channels, and storm drains. The effective date of this permit was March 6, 2009.

Ecology issued a modified final permit May 5, 2010. The modification adds substantive language to the permit as a result of a settlement agreement between the departments of ecology and transportation and Puget Soundkeeper Alliance. Permit sections modified include: S6.C, S7. E.2.d., S8.E., Appendix 7, Stormwater Management Program Plan, Sections 3 and 3.1, 5.4, 6.2, and Appendix 3, Applicable TMDL Requirements.

Purpose to the Permit: State and federal regulations require WSDOT to have national pollutant discharge elimination system (NPDES) permit coverage in areas covered by Phase I and Phase II of the municipal stormwater permit program. This permit covers stormwater runoff from state highways, rest areas, park and ride lots, ferry terminals, and maintenance facilities. The permit addresses these legal requirements and regulates the discharge of pollutants to protect water quality in Washington state.

Public Notice Process and Comments: Ecology accepted public comment on the draft permit and fact sheet from February 17, 2010, until March 31, 2010. Ecology held a hearing and workshop in Lacey, Washington on March 29, 2010. Ecology received written comments during the public comment period and responded to these comments in a response to comments appended to the fact sheet.
