This agenda is for information purposes, and the noted dates of anticipated rule-making actions are estimates. Governor Chris Gregoire signed an Executive Order (EO) 10-06 on November 17, 2010, directing agencies under her jurisdic-

tion to suspend noncritical rule development and adoption activities until the end of 2011. Under the order agency directors can allow exemptions from the suspension so some specific rules may move ahead. The office of financial management has provided guidelines for these exemptions. The department has reviewed the rule development projects underway to determine if any rules meet the exemption criteria. Exemptions for rules under the authority of the SBOH will be determined at the board's January 2011 meeting.

Any errors in this agenda do not affect the rules and rule-making notices filed with the office of the code reviser and published in the Washington State Register. There may be additional DOH rule-making activities that cannot be forecasted as DOH initiates rule making to implement new state laws, meet federal requirements, or meet unforeseen circumstances. CR-101 is a preproposal statement of inquiry filed under RCW 34.05.310.

CR-102 is a proposed rule-making notice filed under RCW 34.05.320 or 34.05.340.

Proposal is Exempt under RCW 34.05.310(4) means a rule that does not require the filing of a CR-101 notice under RCW 34.05.310(4).

CR-105 is an expedited rule-making notice filed under RCW 34.05.353. This is an accelerated rule adoption process with no public hearing required.

CR-103 is rule-making order permanently adopting a rule, and filed under RCW 34.05.360 and 34.05.380.

EMERGENCY rules are temporary rules filed under RCW 34.05.350 and 34.05.380 by using a CR-103 Rule-making order. Emergency rules may be used to meet certain urgent circumstances. These rules are effective for one hundred twenty days after the filing date, and may be extended in certain circumstances.

FOREST PRACTICES BOARD

Rule Development Agenda January - June 2011

The forest practices board's mandate is to adopt rules to protect the state's public resources while maintaining a viable

forest products industry. The following rule proposals are under development or are anticipated during this time period. There may be additional rule-making activity not on the agenda as conditions warrant.

1. **Notice of Forest Practice to Affected Indian Tribes.**

The board may consider rule making that will require landowners to meet with tribes when an application involves a cultural resource.

2. **Riparian Open Space Program.** The board will consider initiating rule making at the February 2011 meeting to implement SSB 5401, 2009 session, which expanded the program to include the acquisition of conservation easements on forest land that contains critical habitat for threatened or endangered species as designated by the board. The legislation also changed the type of channel migration lands eligible for acquisition from "unconfined avulsing channel migration zones" to simply "unconfined channel migration zones."

3. **Forest Biomass.** The board will consider initiating rule making at the February 2011 meeting to amend WAC 222-16-010 to ensure the public understands that this activity is a forest practice and subject to the resource protection measures required in Title 222 WAC and chapter 76.09 RCW.

4. **Watershed Analysis.** The board will consider initiating rule making at the February 2011 meeting to amend rules relating to the use and review of approved watershed analyses.

5. **Road Maintenance and Abandonment Plan.** The board may consider rule making to amend WAC 222-24-050 and 222-24-051 to allow landowners to apply for an extension of the road maintenance and abandonment plan (RMAP) deadline for up to five years.

Thank you for your letter of January 5, 2011, and the attached "Petition for Adoption, Amendment, or Repeal of a State Administrative Rule (RCW 34.05.350)" in which you petition for the repeal of the Department of Social and Health Services (DSHS) Emergency Rule Change WSR 11-02-026.

DSHS cited RCW 34.05.350(1)(b) and (c) as the grounds for adoption of the rule on an emergency basis. Those subsections provide that an agency may adopt an emergency rule "if the agency finds that state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule" or "in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal years 2009, 2010, or 2011, which necessi-

tates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency."

The Governor has limited authority under chapter 34.05 RCW with regard to emergency rules. RCW 34.05.350(3) provides that when a petitioner requests the immediate repeal of an emergency rule "[i]n ruling on the petition, the governor shall consider only whether the conditions in subsection (1) of this section were met such that adoption of the rule on an emergency basis was necessary." Thus, the only question for the Governor is whether the Department of Social and Health Services correctly concluded that the situation met the requirements of RCW 34.05.350(1)(b) or RCW 34.05.350(1)(c).

DSHS stated the following reason for its findings under RCW 34.05.350: "Governor Gregoire issued Executive Order 10-04 on September 13, 2010, under the authority of RCW 43.88.110(7). In the Executive Order, the Governor required DSHS and all other state agencies to reduce their expenditures in state fiscal year 2011 by approximately 6.3%. As a consequence of the Executive Order, funding will no longer be available as of January 1, 2011, for the benefits that are being eliminated as part of these regulatory amendments. Delaying the adoption of these cuts to optional services could jeopardize the state's ability to maintain the mandatory Medicaid services for the majority of DSHS clients."

In order to meet state budget requirements, it was necessary to exclude certain categories of services from the state's Medicaid program. Since they are no longer included in Washington's benefit package, it was also essential to adopt immediate amendments to rules relating to providers that were consistent with the exclusion of certain services. While I encourage you to participate in the development of any permanent rules to provide input on the notice given to clients, I agree with DSHS that the situation addressed by Emergency Rule Change WSR 11-02-026 met the requirements of RCW 34.05.350(1)(b) or RCW 34.05.350(1)(c).

For these reasons, your petition for repeal of the Department of Social and Health Service Emergency Rule Change WSR 11-02-026 is denied.

SB 5041 and HB 1149: These identical "companion" bills would clarify that in calculating the "financing allowance" component rate, the "minimum occupancy" assumption would be eighty-five percent for essential community

providers, ninety percent for small nonessential community providers, and ninety-two percent for large nonessential community providers. Each would also clarify that "bed banking" would no longer have any effect on the calculation of the financing allowance component.

Each bill would also clarify that, after DSHS has fully implemented minimum data set 3.0, there will be no requirement to adjust any semiannual rate setting which used the previously established case mix adjustment using the new minimum data set 3.0 data.

Further, each bill would provide that, to allow for the transition to minimum data set 3.0 and implementation of resource utilization group (RUG) IV, for the July 1, 2011, through July 1, 2012, cost-rebasing periods, DSHS may determine the calendar quarter or quarters upon which the facility average case mix index will be calculated.

HB 1249: The governor's supplemental budget proposes certain changes to the nursing facility medicaid payment system in chapter 74.46 RCW. HB 1249 would make these statutory changes, which would:

- Amend RCW 74.46.431 to provide, beginning July 1, 2013, for the rebasing of costs biennially during every odd-numbered year, using cost report data from two years prior to the rebase period. For example, adjusted cost report data from 2011 would be used for rates from July 1, 2013, through June 30, 2015, and so forth. Adjusted cost report data for calendar year 2007 would continue to be used for rates through June 30, 2013.
- Amend RCW 74.46.437 to provide that the factor used to calculate the allowable return on investment in setting the financing allowance component rate be changed to 4.0 percent for all facilities, from the current two-tiered factor of ten percent or 8.5 percent depending on date of acquisition. The section would also be amended to clarify that in calculating the financing allowance component rate, the minimum occupancy assumption would be eighty-five percent for essential community providers, ninety percent for small nonessential community providers, and ninety-two percent for large nonessential community providers. The section would further be amended to clarify that bed banking would no longer have any effect on the calculation of the financing allowance component rate.
- Amend RCW 74.46.485 to provide that DSHS may adjust the case mix index for any of the lowest ten resource utilization group categories beginning with PA1 through PE2 to any case mix index that aids in achieving the purpose and intent of RCW 74.39A.-007 and cost-efficient care; and to remove the requirement that, after DSHS has fully implemented minimum data set 3.0, it must adjust any semiannual rate setting in which it used the previously established case mix adjustment using the new minimum data set 3.0 data.
- Amend RCW 74.46.496 to provide that case mix weights shall be determined by assigning the lowest case mix weight (rather than a case mix weight of 1.000) to the resource utilization group III classification group with the lowest total weighted minutes.
- Amend RCW 74.46.501 to provide that, to allow for the transition to minimum data set 3.0 and implementation of resource utilization group IV for the July 1, 2011, through July 1, 2012, cost-rebasing periods DSHS may determine the calendar quarter or quarters upon which the facility average case mix will be calculated.
- Repeal RCW 74.46.433 concerning the variable return component rate. The effect of the repeal would be to accelerate the termination of the variable return component rate to March 1, 2011, from the currently scheduled termination date of July 1, 2011.

This proposal has an emergency clause that would put it into effect on March 1, 2011.
