RE: Petition for Repeal of Emergency Rule

Dear Mr. Keller:

Thank you for your email of January 13, 2011, in which you request the immediate repeal of a rule pertaining to synthetic marijuana that was adopted on an emergency basis by the Washington State Board of Pharmacy.

RCW 34.05.350(1)(a) allows adoption of an emergency rule when "immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare." RCW 34.05.350(3) provides: "Within seven days after the rule is adopted, any person may petition the governor requesting the immediate repeal of a rule adopted on an emergency basis <u>by any department listed in RCW 43.17.010</u>." The Board of Pharmacy is not a department listed in RCW 43.17.010, therefore, the Governor lacks the jurisdiction to take the direct action requested in your letter.

Notwithstanding this jurisdictional issue, our review indicates the action taken by the Board of Pharmacy meets the requirements for adoption of a rule on an emergency basis. The Board found the scheduling of the substance on an emergency basis was necessary to avoid an imminent hazard to the public safety. The Drug Enforcement Administration banned the same five synthetic cannabinoids on an emergency basis, and synthetic cannibinoids poison cases reported to the Washington Poison Center have been on the rise. The Board had good cause to find that immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.

Dear Dr. Osmunson:

The Board of Health (Board) has denied your "Petition for Rule Making" submitted to the Board on October 28, 2010. Your petition asked the Board to amend WAC 246-290-460 to require water suppliers with systems with average flouride concentrations above 10 parts per billion (ppb) to provide a notice with each customer's bill stating: "The Washington State Board of Health finds the flouride level in this water may contribute to lower IQ and an increase in mental retardation." You appealed the Board's denial of your petition to me on December 15, 2010. After careful review, I have determined to deny your appeal of the Board's decision.

The Board has advised you that it believes the language and the rule change you have suggested are not consistent with the majority of scientific opinion. In particular, the Board noted that it looks to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for standards and recommendations regarding the safety of drinking water. The EPA regards 10 ppb as well within the flouride concentration that is safe for consumers.

After review, I agree with the Board that the rule language you propose is not supported by the majority scientific opinion, including the EPA standards and the report of the National Research Council, *Fluoride in Drinking Water: A scientific Review of EPA's Standards* (2006). For these reasons, I am denying your appeal and declining to recommend that the Board initiate rule-making proceedings. Sincerely,

New Permit Issued: Ecology will issue the new aquatic plant and algae management general permit (permit) on February 16, 2011. This permit replaces the previous permit issued in 2006.

Purpose of the Permit: The permit is a joint national pollutant discharge elimination system (NPDES) and state waste discharge general permit. The permit covers the discharge of products used to control aquatic plants and algae in Washington lakes. The permit also allows treatment of emergent plants along roadsides and ditch banks. Control products include aquatic herbicides, algaecides, biological clarification products, aquatic dyes, adjuvants, and nutrient inactivation products such as alum.

- Serve a copy of your appeal and coverage letter on ecology in paper form by mail or in person. (See addresses below.) E-mail is not accepted.
