#### ETA 3043.2016 - Low-Density Light and Power Utility Deduction

The department of revenue has revised ETA 3043. This ETA explains the public utility tax deduction provided by RCW 82.16.053 to qualifying power and light businesses.

RCW 82.16.053 requires that the department determine the state average electric power rate each year and inform taxpayers of this rate. This rate is used by the power and light businesses to compute the amount of the deduction. The revised ETA 3043 updates the information to provide the rate to be used for the period of July 2016 through June 2017.

#### ANNOUNCING PHASE I MUNICIPAL STORMWATER PERMIT MODIFICATION

Purpose of the Phase I Municipal Stormwater General Permit: Federal and state water quality laws require a permit for the discharge of stormwater (see Federal Water Pollution Control Act Title 22 United States Code, Section 1251 et seq., state Water Pollution Control Act chapter 90.48 RCW and Washington waste discharge general permit regulation WAC 173-226-130). The Phase I municipal stormwater general permit (permit) regulates the discharges from storm sewer systems owned or operated by Clark, King, Pierce and Snohomish counties; the cities of Seattle and Tacoma; and public entities located in these cities and counties. The permit requires these municipalities and secondary permittees to protect surface water and groundwater quality by developing and implementing a stormwater management program to control stormwater runoff into and from their storm sewer systems.

**Proposed Modifications:** The department of ecology (ecology) issued a modified draft Phase I municipal stormwater general permit for public review and comment on **May 18, 2016**. The permit went into effect on August 1, 2013; an earlier modification went into effect on January 16, 2015.

Ecology is modifying the permit a second time. One of the permit requirements is for Phase I municipalities to adopt a stormwater program that will provide equal or similar protection of receiving waters and pollutant control as compared to Appendix 1 of the permit. This modification will incorporate, in Appendix 10 of the permit, ecology's determination of equivalency for these stormwater programs.

The modification also incorporates a new appendix, Appendix 13, which describes and requires an adaptive management plan for pollutants that discharge from the city of Seattle's municipal separate storm sewer system outfalls to the Lower Duwamish Waterway.

Description: The health care authority (the agency) previously published notice WSR 15-24-097 on January 5, 2016, to notify interested persons about the intent to submit medicaid state plan amendment (SPA) 16-0005 to add the new ground emergency medical transport (GEMT) program as mandated by HB 2007. That notice contained a start date of January 1, 2016, and inadvertently omitted the estimate for annual aggregate expenditure. The agency now anticipates initiating the GEMT program on or after July 1, 2016, and anticipates an approximate annual aggregate expenditure of \$6,845,000 for state fiscal year 2017.

From WSR 15-24-097: The purpose of the GEMT program is to provide a supplemental payment to qualifying publicly owned or operated ground emergency transportation providers.

Participation in GEMT program is voluntary. To qualify for the supplemental payment, a ground ambulance provider must:

- 1. Provide GEMT services to medicaid fee-for-service (FFS) enrollees or medicaid managed care (MC) enrollees; and
- 2. Be owned or operated by a state, city, or county fire protection district, community services district, health care district, federally recognized Indian tribe, or any unit of government as defined in 42 C.F.R. Sec. 433.50.

For FFS enrollees, the agency will fund the supplemental payments through a certified public expenditures program. The funding for increased MC payments will be provided through intergovernmental transfers program. The supplemental payments, combined with other sources of reimbursement from the agency, will not exceed the actual costs of providing the services.

- The fee schedule for home health services will be updated to reflect the legislatively approved \$10 per hour rate increase for registered nurses (RNs) and licensed practical nurses (LPNs) providing skilled nursing services in a home setting. The rate change for home health services is an increase of 11.17 percent.
- The effective date of the fee schedule for private duty nursing services. The fee schedule will be updated to reflect the legislatively approved \$10.00 per hour rate increase for RNs and LPNs providing skilled nursing services in a home setting. The rate change for private

- duty nursing services for RNs is an increase of 28.31 percent, and for LPNs is an increase of 36.72 percent.
- The methodology for determining payment rates for physical therapy, occupational therapy, and speech therapy will be updated. This is not a change in methodology; it is simply a more detailed explanation of how the agency already calculates these rates, and is being added per request from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.

The agency anticipates this SPA will affect annual aggregate expenditures for home health services in the amount of \$459,000 and for private duty nursing services in the amount of \$1,767,000. Adding details of the methodology for physical, occupational, and speech therapy rates will have no effect on annual aggregate expenditures.
