**Announcing the Draft Modification of the Sand and Gravel General Permit**

**Permit:** The Washington state department of ecology (ecology) proposes to modify the sand and gravel national pollutant discharge elimination system (NPDES) and state waste discharge general permit (permit). The current permit was issued April 1, 2016, and appealed by the Washington Aggregate and Concrete Association. A settlement was reached on modified language for the permit in August 2017. The modified language allows more flexibility for portable operations and new concrete recyclers. The modified permit and fact sheet are available for review and public comment from **September 26 through December 8, 2017, at 11:59 p.m.**

**Purpose of the Permit:** The purpose of the sand and gravel general permit is to control the discharge of pollutants from sand and gravel mining operations and related facilities into waters of the state. This general permit provides coverage for discharges of process water, stormwater, and mine dewatering water associated with sand and gravel operations, rock quarries and similar mining activities, including stockpiles of mined materials, concrete batch operations, and hot mix asphalt operations. The permit authorizes wastewater discharges to waters of the state of Washington subject to the permit conditions.

permit modifications and to answer questions prior to the formal public hearing. The purpose of the hearing is to provide an opportunity to give formal oral testimony and comment on the proposed draft permit modifications. Written comments will receive the same consideration as oral testimony. There will be two public workshops and hearings as listed above. The public hearing will begin immediately following the workshop and will conclude when public testimony is complete.

**Issuing the Permit:** The final decision on permit modification will be made after ecology receives and considers all public comments. Ecology expects to issue the final permit in January 2018.

## SUPPLEMENTAL NOTICE

Title or Subject: Supplemental Notice - Medicaid State Plan Amendment 17-0007 Supplemental Rebate Agreement  
Effective Date: On or after October 1, 2017.

Description: The health care authority (the agency) previously published notice of its intent to submit medicaid state plan amendment (SPA) 17-0007 in order to create a new supplemental rebate agreement (SRA) contract template which will be available for the agency to use in contracting with pharmaceutical manufacturers effective July 1, 2017. The agency is revising the proposed effective date to be on or

after October 1, 2017. A revised effective date will not affect changes to SRA that will allow the state to negotiate rebates:

- On drug utilization covered by managed care organizations (MCO) when the agency requires MCOs to cover specific drugs or specific drugs within drug classes.
- Which include rebates on professionally administered drugs.
- Which do not require a rebated drug to be preferred over competitor products, or be placed on a preferred drug list.
- Based on an industry standard benchmark price (wholesale acquisition cost).
- With more flexible options for rebate methodology, allowing the state to collect rebates on the basis of either a guaranteed net cost or a unit rebate amount.

In addition to the new SRA noted above, the agency has joined a national supplemental rebate pool called *The Optimal PDL Solutions* or TOP\$ to begin collecting supplemental rebates on drug utilization covered by both the medicaid fee-for-service program and medicaid MCOs, starting January 1, 2018.

SPA 17-0007 is not anticipated to affect provider reimbursement. The SPA is expected to decrease the state's annual aggregate expenditures for prescription drugs by securing additional rebates from pharmaceutical manufacturers.

This SPA is in the development process; therefore a copy is not yet available for review. The agency would appreciate any input or concerns regarding this SPA. Title or Subject: Medicaid State Plan Amendment (SPA) 17-0043.

Effective Date: January 1, 2018.

Description: Single preferred drug list (PDL).

The health care authority (the agency) intends to submit medicaid SPA 17-0043 to implement a legislatively mandated single medicaid apple health PDL to be used by its contracted medicaid managed care organizations (MCO) in addition to the fee-for-service (FFS) program. The agency contracts with five health plans for its managed medicaid services and each MCO currently has its own PDL. The FFS medicaid program also has its own PDL. To realize a single apple health PDL, the agency intends to collaboratively work with MCOs to identify commonalities of drugs and coverage criteria and resolve the differences. The resulting apple health PDL would serve to reduce administrative burden on providers, allow all medicaid clients a uniform experience when transferring between MCOs and the FFS program over time, and maximize available rebates.

SPA 17-0043 is not anticipated to affect provider reimbursement. The SPA is expected to decrease the state's annual aggregate expenditures for prescription drugs by securing additional rebates from pharmaceutical manufacturers.

- To distribute the funds for each fiscal year, free standing psychiatric hospitals were given the greater of 68.15 per- cent of the statewide average cost per day. All other hos- pitals were given the greater of seventy-five percent of their provider-specific cost, or their current medicaid psychiatric per diem rate. This ensured that no hospital is worse off, after rebasing, than they are today
- This approach results in higher rate increase percentages for hospitals with current rates based on the statewide average psychiatric per diem rate, to be consistent with legislative intent.
- HCA did not apply a higher percent of cost to providers with current rates based on the statewide average than for providers with current provider-specific rates, as it was determined to not be equitable.
- Sixteen hospitals met the criteria for per diem rate increase for the remaining nine months of SFY 2018 and for the entire SFY 2019.

The candidate must take and pass the WEST B or provide evidence of meeting an alternative or exception at the time of admissions. Candidates admitted to a residency teacher preparation program prior to the passage of the WEST B or its approved alternative or exemption must pass the WEST B or its approved alternative or exemptions prior to student teaching."*

Description: The health care authority (the agency) intends to submit an application to extend the Section 1115 Family Planning Only Demonstration Waiver for five years (through December 2022). The current waiver expires on December 31, 2017. It covers limited family planning and family planning-related services for women and men who are enrolled in the agency's two programs -- Family planning only extension and take charge.

The purpose, client eligibility requirements, and benefit package will remain the same. The name will change to family planning only to reduce confusion inherent in two program names.

The purpose of the family planning only program is to:

- Assure access to family planning services.
- Decrease unintended pregnancies and births.
- Lengthen intervals between births.
- Reduce state and federal medicaid expenditures for averted births from unintended pregnancies.

The following groups are eligible for services under the family planning only program:

- Recently pregnant women who lose medicaid coverage after their pregnancy coverage ends. These women are automatically enrolled for ten months.
- Uninsured women and men with family incomes at or below two hundred sixty percent federal poverty level (FPL), seeking to prevent an unintended pregnancy.
- Teens and domestic violence victims who need confidential family planning services and are covered under their perpetrator's or parent's health insurance and are at or below two hundred sixty percent FPL.

Coverage is for twelve months, starting on the first day of the month the application was signed. Applications are available on the agency web site or at specified providers who can assist with completion of the application. Services are currently provided at specified clinics across Washington state (listed on the agency web site).

The family planning only program provides the following services on a fee-for-service basis: All FDA-approved contraceptives; natural family planning; over-the-counter contraception; emergency contraception; sterilization; contraceptive education, counseling, and management; limited STI/STD testing and treatment related to successful use of the chosen contraceptive method; cervical cancer screening according to national clinical guidelines when associated with a family planning visit; office visits and limited ancillary services related to the above services. There are no cost-sharing requirements to receive services under this program.

Because eligibility and services will remain the same, this extension is anticipated to have no effect on annual aggregate expenditures or enrollment. Based on fiscal year 2016 experience we expect enrollment of approximately four thousand clients with an expenditure of \$1.5 million for each year of the five year renewal period.

Washington will evaluate two goals of the 1115 family planning only demonstration, (a) ensure access to family planning and/or family planning-related services and (b) improve or maintain health outcomes for the target population as a result of access to family planning and/or family

planning-related services by testing the following hypotheses:

1. Enrollees will utilize family planning services and/or family planning related services.
2. Beneficiaries will maintain coverage for one or more 12 month enrollment period.
3. Health outcomes will improve as a result of the demonstration.
4. Beneficiaries will have a higher rate of using more effective contraceptive methods compared to other members of Medicaid beneficiaries.

This evaluation will use comparative quantitative analysis of administrative data for two groups: The demonstration population and the general medicaid population. Data sources include the agency's claims files and a database that joins birth certificate data with claims data called the first steps database. Details of the evaluation design can be found in the extension application.

The demonstration's expenditure authority falls under the state's Title XIX plan and section 1115 (a)(2) of the Social Security Act. Requirements not applicable to the expenditure authorities are:

1. Methods of Administration: Transportation: Section 1902 (a)(4) insofar as it incorporates 42 C.F.R. 431.53. To the extent necessary to enable the state to not assure transportation to and from providers for the demonstration population.
2. Amount, Duration, and Scope of Services (Comparability): Section 1902 (a)(10)(B). To the extent necessary to allow the state to offer the demonstration population a benefit package consisting only of family planning services and family planning-related services.
3. Prospective Payment for Federally Qualified Health Centers and Rural Health Centers and Rural Health Clinics: Section 1902 (a)(15). To the extent necessary for the state to establish reimbursement levels to these clinics that will compensate them solely for family planning and family planning-related services.
4. Eligibility Procedures: Section 1902 (a)(17). To the extent necessary to allow the state to not include parental income when determining a minor's (individual under age eighteen) eligibility for the family planning demonstration. To the extent necessary to allow the state to not require reporting of changes in income or household size for twelve months, for a person found income-eligible upon application or annual redetermination when determining eligibility for the family planning demonstration.
