The primary suggested amendments are to Title 7 of the LLLT RPC and generally mirror the suggested amendments to the Lawyer RPC. The following suggested amendments relate to LLLTs only and are not included in the suggested amendments to the Lawyer RPC:

- Suggested amendments to LLLT RPC 7.1 include a subsection (b) to require LLLTs to state in all communications about themselves or their services that they have a limited license to practice in a particular field of law and to prohibit stating or implying otherwise. This provision would move from its current location in LLLT RPC 7.4 which is to be reserved.
- Comment 2 would be added to LLLT RPC 7.1 to clarify that the words "Legal Technician" must be included in the firm name when there are no lawyers in the firm. This provision would move from its current location in LLLT RPC 7.5(a) which also is to be reserved.
- There are two suggested amendments that are necessary merely to correct references to provisions that would move to different rules; those are LLLT RPC 1.0B cmt [3] and LLLT RPC 1.5 cmt [3].

A communication is false or misleading if it contains a material misrepresentation of fact or law, or omits a fact necessary to make the statement considered as a whole not materially misleading.

**(b)** In all communications about the LLLT or the LLLT's services, an LLLT shall communicate the fact that the LLLT has a limited license to practice in the particular fields of law for which the LLLT is licensed, and shall not state or imply that an LLLT is licensed to practice in any other areas of law, or has an unlimited license to practice law in any area of law.

[1] ~~This Rule Paragraph (a) was adapted from is based on Lawyer RPC 7.1 with no substantive changes and the comments to Lawyer RPC 7.1 applies to LLLTs analogously. [3] ~~In advertising, an LLLT also has an affirmative obligation to communicate the fact that the LLLT has a limited license to practice in the particular fields of law for which the LLLT is licensed and is prohibited from stating or implying that the LLLT is licensed to practice in any other areas of law, or has an unlimited license to practice law in any area of law. See Rule 7.4(a).~~

**RULE 7.3. DIRECT CONTACT WITH PROSPECTIVE CLIENTS SOLICITATION OF CLIENTS**

~~(a) An LLLT shall not directly or through a third person, by in-person, live telephone, or real-time electronic contact may solicit professional employment from a prospective client when a significant motive for the LLLT's doing so is the LLLT's pecuniary gain, unless the person contacted:~~

~~(2) has a family, close personal, or prior professional relationship with the LLLT; or the LLLT knows or reasonably should know that the physical, emotional, or mental state of the subject of the solicitation is such that the person could not exercise reasonable judgment in employing an LLLT;~~

~~(3) has consented to the contact by requesting a referral from a not-for-profit LLLT referral service; the subject of the solicitation has made known to the LLLT a desire not to be solicited by the LLLT; or~~

~~(4) the solicitation involves coercion, duress, or harassment.~~

~~(b) An LLLT shall not solicit professional employment from a prospective client by written, recorded or electronic communication or by in-person, telephone, or real-time electronic contact even when not otherwise prohibited by paragraph (a), if; compensate, or give or promise anything of value to, a person who is not an employee or LLLT in the same firm for the purpose of recommending or securing the services of the LLLT or law firm, except that an LLLT may:~~

~~(1) the prospective client has made known to the LLLT a desire not to be solicited by the LLLT; or pay the reasonable cost of advertisements or communications permitted by Rule 7.1, including online group advertising;~~

~~(2) the solicitation involves coercion, duress or harassment; pay the usual charges of a legal service plan or a not-for-profit LLLT referral service;~~

~~(3) pay for a law practice in accordance with Rule 1.17;~~

~~(4) refer clients to a lawyer or to another LLLT or other nonlawyer professional pursuant to an agreement not otherwise prohibited under these Rules that provides for the other person to refer clients or customers to the LLLT, if:~~

[1] ~~This Rule was adapted from is based on Lawyer RPC 7.3 with no substantive changes except to reflect that LLLTs may solicit employment from lawyers as well as other LLLTs, and that referral services may refer to both lawyers and LLLTs. This Rule The comments to Lawyer RPC 7.3 applies to LLLTs analogously.~~

[2] ~~This Rule prohibits LLLTs from paying others for referrals. See also Rule 1.5(e) (prohibiting the division of fees with another LLLT or lawyer who is not in the same firm as the LLLT); Rule 5.4 (subject to Rule 5.9, prohibiting the sharing of fees with anyone who is not an LLLT).~~

**RULE 7.4 COMMUNICATION OF FIELDS OF PRACTICE AND SPECIALIZATION [RESERVED.]**

(a) In all advertising, an LLLT shall communicate the fact that the LLLT has a limited license practice in the particular fields of law for which the LLLT is licensed, and shall not state or imply that an LLLT is licensed to practice in any other areas of law, or has an unlimited license to practice law in any area of law.

(b) [Reserved.]

(c) [Reserved.]

(d) An LLLT shall not state or imply that an LLLT is "certified," a "specialist," or an "expert," or use any other similar term to describe his or her qualifications as an LLLT, but may identify any award or recognition that the LLLT has received from a group, organization, or association. If an LLLT has received any other legal title, credential, or certificate from any group, organization, or association, then the LLLT may identify the legal title, credential, or certificate provided that the reference must:

(1) be truthful and verifiable and otherwise comply with Rule 7.1;

(2) identify the group, organization, or association that issued the legal title, credential, or certificate; and

(3) state that the Supreme Court of Washington does not recognize certification of specialties in the practice of law and that the legal title, credential, or certificate is not a requirement of the LLLT's limited license to practice in the particular fields of law for which the LLLT is licensed.

**Comment**

[1] An LLLT's license to provide legal services is unique and may not be understood by persons who are not familiar with the limited scope of practice of an LLLT and with the differences between an LLLT and a lawyer. Advertising is designed to help educate the public on the availability of legal services, but advertising by an LLLT may not be false or misleading. See Rule 7.1. In order to avoid confusion about the scope of services that an LLLT can provide as distinct from the broader scope of services that a lawyer is authorized to provide, advertising by an LLLT must communicate that an LLLT may deliver legal services only within a limited scope. Accordingly, Rule 7.4(a) differs from Lawyer RPC 7.4(a) in that it requires that all advertising by an LLLT communicate relevant facts concerning the scope of the LLLT's license and expressly prohibits communications that state or imply that the LLLT's license exceeds that scope.

[2] Lawyer RPC 7.4(b) pertains to a patent practice before the United States Patent and Trademark Office, a practice that exceeds the authorized scope of APR 28. Accordingly, Rule 7.4(b) is reserved.

[3] Lawyer RPC 7.4(c) pertains to an admiralty practice, a practice that exceeds the authorized scope of APR 28. Accordingly, Rule 7.4(c) is reserved.

[4] In order to avoid confusion about the scope of services that an LLLT can provide, APR 28(H)(4) prohibits an LLLT from representing or advertising, in connection with the provision of legal services, other legal titles or credentials that could cause a client to believe that the LLLT possesses professional legal skills beyond those authorized by the license held by the LLLT. The terms "certified," "specialist," "expert," and similar terms suggest achievement of skills

beyond those that are authorized by the LLLT's license, and may not be used when describing an LLLT's credentials. Other titles and recognitions, however, may provide useful information that is not likely to mislead clients or potential clients concerning the skills and authorized scope of an LLLT's practice. Accordingly, if an LLLT has received a legal title, credential, or certificate from a group, organization, or association, the LLLT may identify that title, credential, or certificate so long as communications about it meet the requirements enumerated in Rule 7.4 (d)(1)-(3). Those requirements are substantially similar to Lawyer Rule 7.4 (d)(1)-(3). An LLLT may also identify awards and recognitions that the LLLT has received from a group, organization, or association.

**RULE 7.5 FIRM NAMES AND LETTERHEADS [RESERVED.]**

(a) An LLLT shall not use a firm name, letterhead, or other professional designation that violates Rule 7.1. A trade name may be used by an LLLT in private practice if the trade name does not imply that lawyers are members or employees of the firm unless that is the case, and if it does not imply a connection with a government agency or with a public or charitable legal services organization and is not otherwise in violation of Rule 7.1. If there are no lawyers in the firm, any firm name used by an LLLT in private practice shall include the words "Legal Technician."

(b) A law firm with offices in more than one jurisdiction may use the same name or other professional designation in each jurisdiction, but identification of the lawyers or LLLTs in an office of the firm shall indicate the jurisdictional limitations on those not licensed to practice in the jurisdiction where the office is located.

(c) The name of an LLLT or lawyer holding a public office shall not be used in the name of a law firm, or in communications on its behalf, during any substantial period in which the LLLT or lawyer is not actively and regularly practicing with the firm.

(d) LLLTs may state or imply that they practice in a partnership or other organization only when that is a fact.

**Comment**

[1] This Rule was adapted from Lawyer RPC 7.5 with no substantive changes except that provisions have been added to subpart (a) to require that any trade name not imply that lawyers are members or employees of the firm unless that is the case, and that, if there are no lawyers in the firm, any trade name include the words "Legal Technician." Otherwise, this Rule applies to LLLTs analogously.

[2] An LLLT's license to provide legal services is unique and may not be understood by persons who are not familiar with the limited scope of an LLLT's practice and with the differences between an LLLT and a lawyer. A trade name is a brand and is therefore similar to forms of advertising and is often used in advertising. A trade name must not be false or misleading. See Rules 7.1 and 7.4. In order to avoid confusion, trade names should communicate the nature of the legal services that a licensed practitioner or firm can deliver. Rule 7.5(a) requires that any trade name communicate relevant facts concerning the scope of the legal services that can be delivered by the legal professional or firm.

Notice of Fire District Board Member Dollar Threshold
Adjustment

Compensation limits for fire district board members are set in statute. RCW 52.14.010 provides that payment of compensation for each board member shall be at a rate of one hundred and four dollars (\$104) per day, with compensation for each board member not to exceed nine thousand nine hundred and eighty four dollars (\$9,984) per year. RCW 52.14.010 also provides for the Office of Financial Management to adjust this dollar threshold for inflation every five years, beginning January 1, 2019. The adjustment is to be based upon changes in the consumer price index for "wage earners and clerical workers, all items" compiled by the Bureau of Labor and Statistics, U.S. Department of Labor during that five year period. The new dollar threshold shall be transmitted to the Office of the Code Reviser for publication in the Washington State Register at least one month before the new threshold takes effect.

Over the five-year period from October 2013 to October 2018, the Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers for the Seattle-Tacoma-Bellevue, WA area as reported by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U.S. Department of Labor, increased by 12.68 percent.

In accordance with the requirements set forth above, the Office of Financial Management submits for publication the new dollar threshold. The new dollar threshold is one hundred and twenty eight dollars (\$128) per day with a new annual compensation limit of twelve thousand two hundred and eighty eight dollars (\$12,288). The new dollar threshold takes effect January 1, 2019.

**GR 11.1:**

a) Purpose and Scope. This rule establishes the Interpreter Commission (Commission) and prescribes the conditions of its activities. This rule does not modify or duplicate the statutory process directing the Court Interpreter Program as it is administered by the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) (chapter 2.43 RCW). The Interpreter Commission will develop policies for the Interpreter Program and the Program Policy Manual, published on the Washington Court's website at [www.courts.wa.gov](http://www.courts.wa.gov), which shall constitute the official version of policies governing the Court Certified Interpreter Program.

(b) Jurisdiction and Powers.

~~All court interpreters who are credentialed by the State of Washington AOC in either a certified or registered language category are subject to the rules and regulations specified in the Interpreter Program Policy Manual~~ Every interpreter serving in a legal proceeding must comply with GR 11.2, the Code of Professional Responsibility for Judiciary Interpreters, and is subject to the rules and regulations specified in the Court Interpreter Disciplinary Policy Manual.

The Commission shall establish three committees to fulfill ongoing functions related to issues, discipline, and judicial/court administration education. Each committee shall consist of at least three Commission members and one member shall be identified as the chair.

(1) The Issues Committee is assigned issues, complaints, and/or requests from interpreters for review and response. If the situation cannot be resolved at the Issues Committee level, the matter will be submitted by written referral to the Disciplinary Committee.

(2) The Issues Committee will also address issues, complaints, and/or requests regarding access to interpreter services in the courts; and may communicate with individual courts in an effort to assist in complying with language access directives required by law.

(3) The Disciplinary Committee may sanction any interpreter serving in a legal proceeding for a violation of GR 11.2, the Code of Professional Responsibility for Judiciary Interpreters, and has authority to decertify or deny certification of credentials to interpreters based on the disciplinary procedures for: (a) violations of continuing education/court hour requirements, (b) failure to comply with the ~~Interpreter Code of Conduct~~ Professional Responsibility for Judiciary Interpreters (GR 11.2) or professional standards, or (c) violations of law that may interfere with their duties as an interpreter in a legal proceeding. The Disciplinary Committee will decide on appeal any issues submitted by the Issues Committee.

(c) Establishment. The Supreme Court shall appoint no more than 15 members to the Interpreter Commission; and shall designate the chair of the Commission. The Commission shall include representatives from the following areas of expertise: judicial officers from the appellate and each trial court level (3), spoken language interpreter (2), sign language interpreter (1), court administrator (1), attorney (1), public member (2), representative from ethnic organization (1), an AOC representative (1), and other representatives as needed. The term for a member of the Commission shall be three years. Members are eligible to serve a subsequent 3-year

term. Members shall serve on at least one committee and committees may be supplemented by ad hoc professionals as designated by the chair. Ad hoc members may not serve as the chair of a committee.

(d) Regulations. Policies outlining rules and regulations directing the interpreter program are specified in the Interpreter Program Manual. The Commission, through the Issues Committee and Disciplinary Committee, shall enforce the policies of the interpreter program. Interpreter program policies may be modified at any time by the Commission and AOC.

(e) Existing Law Unchanged. This rule shall not expand, narrow, or affect existing law, including but not limited to chapter 2.43 RCW.

(f) Meetings. The Commission shall hold meetings as determined necessary by the chair. Meetings of the Commission are open to the public except for executive sessions and disciplinary meetings related to action against a certified an interpreter.

(f) Immunity from Liability. No cause of action against the Commission, its standing members or ad hoc members appointed by the Commission, shall accrue in favor of a certified court interpreter or any other person arising from any act taken pursuant to this rule, provided that the Commission members or ad hoc members acted in good faith. The burden of proving that the acts were not taken in good faith shall be on the party asserting it.

## GR 11.2

## CODE OF CONDUCT FOR COURT INTERPRETERS PROFESSIONAL RESPONSIBILITY FOR JUDICIARY INTERPRETERS

**(a) PREAMBLE**

As officers of the court, interpreters must maintain high standards of professional conduct that promote public trust and confidence in the administration of justice. The purpose of this code is to establish standards of conduct that interpreters must abide by in order to preserve the integrity and independence of the judicial system. It establishes core ethical principles of interpreter conduct in all aspects of their profession.

~~PREAMBLE. All language interpreters serving in a legal proceeding, whether certified or uncertified, shall abide by the following Code of Conduct:~~

**(b) SCOPE**

The text of each rule is authoritative, while the comments provide important guidance in understanding the rules.

**(c) APPLICABILITY**

All interpreters serving in the judicial system must abide by this Code of Professional Responsibility.

**(d) COMPLIANCE**

~~A Language interpreter who violates any of the provisions of this code is are subject to a citation for contempt, disciplinary action and/or any other sanction that may be imposed by law. The purpose of this Code of Conduct is to establish and maintain high standards of conduct to preserve the integrity and independence of the adjudicative system.~~

~~(a) A language interpreter, as an officer of the court, shall maintain high standards of personal and professional conduct that promote public confidence in the administration of justice.~~

**(e) DEFINITIONS**

(1) Source language - the original language of the writer or speaker.

(2) Target language - the language of the receiving reader or listener.

(3) Register - the degree of formality of language.

(4) Sight translation - the rendering of a written document directly into a spoken or signed language, not for purposes of producing a written document.

**(f) CANONS**

~~(b) A language interpreter shall interpret or translate the material thoroughly and precisely, adding or omitting nothing, and stating as nearly as possible what has been stated in the language of the speaker, giving consideration to variations in grammar and syntax for both languages involved. A language interpreter shall use the level of communication that best conveys the meaning of the source, and shall not interject the interpreter's personal moods or attitudes.~~

**(1) ACCURACY**

Interpreters must reproduce in the target language the closest natural equivalent of the source language message without altering it by means of addition, omission, or explanation.

**Comment**

(1)[1] Interpreters are obligated to conserve every element of information contained in the source and target languages. In doing so, they fulfill a twofold duty: (1) to ensure that legal proceedings reflect in English precisely what is said or signed by Limited English Proficient individuals and (2) individuals with limited English proficiency on an equal linguistic footing with those who are fully proficient in English.

(1)[2] Interpreters are required to apply their best skills and judgment to render, as faithfully as reasonably possible, the meaning of what is said or signed, preserving the style and register of speech, and the ambiguities and nuances of the source statement.

Everything must be interpreted, even if it appears nonresponsive, obscene, rambling, or incoherent. This includes false starts and apparent misstatements. However, verbatim, "word for word," or literal interpretation is inappropriate if it distorts the meaning of what is said or signed.

Spoken language interpreters should convey the speaker's tone without reenacting or mimicking the speaker's emotions or dramatic gestures. Sign language interpreters, on the other hand, should employ visual cues, including facial expressions, body language, and hand gestures, which are structural elements of sign languages.

(1)[3] Interpreters have the duty to immediately address any situation or condition that impedes their ability to accurately interpret. Examples include, but are not limited to, linguistic ambiguities, unfamiliar terms, inaudible speech, inability to see a speaker, background noise or distraction, and pace of speech.

(1)[4] The obligation to preserve accuracy includes the interpreter's duty to correct any substantive errors of interpretation as soon as possible. Interpreters should be prepared to accept feedback, including challenges to their interpretation, in a professional and impersonal manner.

(1)[5] Due to the difficulty of extemporaneously interpreting recordings (such as 911 calls), the practice of doing

so in court should be discouraged at all times. Rather, proper transcripts and corresponding written translations should be prepared in advance. If ordered by the presiding officer to interpret a recording in court, interpreters should comply but state, on the record, that they cannot guarantee the accuracy of the interpretation.

(1)[6] Interpreters should refrain from sight translating documents for the record. Rather, written translations of documents offered in an evidentiary hearing should be prepared in advance. If ordered by the presiding officer to sight translate such documents, interpreters should comply but state, on the record, that they cannot guarantee the accuracy of the sight translation.

(1)[7] The ethical responsibility to interpret accurately includes being prepared for assignments. Interpreters are encouraged to obtain documents and other information necessary to familiarize themselves with the nature and purpose of an assignment. Prior preparation is described below; it is especially important when testimony or documents include highly specialized terminology and subject matter.

Preparation may include but is not limited to:

(i) reviewing relevant documents, such as criminal complaints, police reports, briefs, witness lists, jury instructions, prior depositions, etc.;

(ii) asking interpreters previously involved in the case for information on language use or style;

(iii) asking attorneys involved in the case for additional relevant information.

## **(2) COMPETENCE**

Interpreters must not knowingly accept any assignment beyond their skill level. If at any point, before or during an assignment, they have (e) When a language interpreter has any reservations about their ability to satisfy an assignment competently, they must the interpreter shall immediately disclose this convey that reservation to all the parties and, if applicable, to the court. If the communication mode or language of the non-English speaking person cannot be readily interpreted, the interpreter shall notify the appointing authority or the court.

In their professional capacity, interpreters must not give legal or other advice or engage in any activity that may be construed as a service other than interpreting or translating.

### **Comment**

(2)[1] Interpreters are duty bound to inquire about the assignment in advance and assess their competence to render services.

(2)[2] Interpreters are not qualified to give written or oral counsel about a legal matter that could affect the rights and responsibilities of the person receiving the advice. GR 24 sets forth what constitutes the practice of law.

(2)[3] Interpreters should maintain and expand competence in their field through professional development. Professional development includes steady practice, professional training, ongoing education, terminology research, regular and frequent interaction with colleagues and specialists in related fields, and staying abreast of new technologies, current issues, laws, policies, rules, and regulations that affect their profession.

(2)[4] Interpreters should know and follow established protocols for delivering interpreting services. When speaking

in English, interpreters should speak at a volume that enables them to be heard throughout the courtroom. They should interpret in the first person and refer to themselves in the third person.

## **(3) HONESTY AND INTEGRITY**

Interpreters have an inviolable duty to provide honest services in which their behavior upholds the values outlined in this code. They must accurately represent their credentials, training, and relevant experience. Interpreters must not engage in conduct that impedes their compliance with this code or allow another to induce or encourage them to violate the law or this code.

### **Comment**

(3)[1] It is essential that interpreters present a complete and truthful account of their credentials, training, and relevant experience prior to an assignment so that their ability to satisfy it competently can be fairly evaluated.

## **(4) IMPARTIALITY AND NEUTRALITY**

Interpreters must faithfully render the source message without allowing their own views to interfere. They must refrain from conduct that may give an appearance of bias and must disclose any real or potential conflict of interest to all parties and the court, if applicable, as soon as they become aware of it.

### **Comment**

(4)[1] Interpreters should strive for professional detachment. They should uphold impartiality by avoiding verbal and nonverbal displays of personal attitudes, prejudices, emotions, or opinions. Interpreters must faithfully render all statements, even those they find personally objectionable, without allowing their own views or opinions to interfere.

(4)[2] As officers of the court, interpreters serve the court and the public, regardless of whether publicly or privately retained. Interpreters must uphold neutrality by avoiding any behavior that creates the appearance of favoritism toward anyone. Interpreters should maintain professional relationships with persons using their services, discourage personal dependence on the interpreter, and avoid participation in the proceedings in any capacity other than providing interpreter services. During the course of the proceedings, interpreters should not converse with parties, witnesses, jurors, attorneys, or friends or relatives of any party, except in the discharge of their official functions.

(4)[3] Interpreters must not serve in any matter in which they have an interest, financial or otherwise, in the outcome, unless a specific exception is allowed by the judicial officer for good cause and noted on the record. Interpreters must not solicit or accept gifts or gratuities from any of the parties, even as a social courtesy, in order to maintain the appearance of neutrality. Interpreters must disclose to the parties and/or the court any circumstance that creates a potential conflict of interest, including but not limited to the following:

(i) the interpreter is a friend, associate, or relative of a party, witness, victim, or counsel;

(ii) the interpreter or the interpreter's friend, associate, or relative has a financial interest in the case at issue, a shared financial interest with a party to the proceeding, or any other interest that might be affected by the outcome of the case;

(iii) the interpreter has served in an investigative capacity for any party involved in the case;

(iv) the interpreter has previously been retained by a law enforcement agency to assist in the preparation of the criminal case at issue;

(v) the interpreter is an attorney in the case at issue;

(vi) the interpreter has previously been retained for employment by one of the parties.

The existence of any one of the above-mentioned circumstances should be evaluated by the parties and the court but should not automatically disqualify an interpreter from providing services. If an actual or perceived conflict of interest exists, the appropriate authorities should determine whether it is appropriate for the interpreter to withdraw based upon the totality of the circumstances.

~~(d) No language interpreter shall render services in any matter in which the interpreter is a potential witness, associate, friend, or relative of a contending party, unless a specific exception is allowed by the appointing authority for good cause noted on the record. Neither shall the interpreter serve in any matter in which the interpreter has an interest, financial or otherwise, in the outcome. (5) CONFIDENTIALITY Interpreters must not divulge privileged or other confidential information obtained in their professional capacity. They must refrain from making any public statement on matters in which they serve.

~~(e) Except in the interpreter's official capacity, no language interpreter shall discuss, report, or comment upon a matter in which the person serves as interpreter. Interpreters shall not disclose any communication that is privileged by law without the written consent of the parties to the communication, or pursuant to court order.~~

**Comment**

(5)[1] Privileged communications take place within the context of a protected relationship, such as that between an attorney and client, a husband and wife, a priest and penitent, and a doctor and patient. The law often protects against forced disclosure of such conversations. Interpreters are bound to maintain the confidentiality of all privileged communications.

(5)[2] Interpreters are also routinely privy to communications that, while not necessarily privileged by law, are conveyed in confidence. In order to preserve the integrity of the judicial process, interpreters have an ongoing duty to refrain from disclosing information obtained in their professional capacity. This duty is consistent with CJC 2.10.

~~(f) A language interpreter shall report immediately to the appointing authority in the proceeding any solicitation or effort by another to induce or encourage the interpreter to violate any law, any provision of the rules which may be approved by the courts for the practice of language interpreting, or any provisions of this Code of Conduct.~~

~~(g) Language interpreters shall not give legal advice and shall refrain from the unauthorized practice of law.~~

**Civil Rule (CR) 82.5 - Tribal Court Jurisdiction**

Submitted by Tribal State Court Consortium

A. **Name of Proponent:** Tribal State Court Consortium

B. **Spokesperson:** Justice Barbara Madsen

C. **Purpose:** To provide a mechanism for state courts and tribal courts to communicate with each other to address issues when parties have simultaneous proceedings occurring in state and tribal court. The rule will also provide a mechanism for communication on enforcement of judgments between state courts and tribal courts.

The reason for this rule is that there is no consistent process for communication between state courts and tribal courts to work through jurisdictional issues or address conflicting orders in simultaneous proceedings. This court rule gives a framework to allow both state and tribal courts an efficient

process to resolve jurisdictional issues and conflicts in orders to get to the substance of the disputes.

CR 82.5 (a)-(c) addresses tribal court exclusive jurisdiction, concurrent jurisdiction, and enforcement of tribal court orders, judgments, and decrees. This rule is the appropriate place to include the proposed communication rule as revised subsection (c) and new subsection (d).

D. Hearing: Not requested.

**Proposed Rule 82.5 (c) and (d) TRIBAL COURT JURISDICTION**

**(a) Indian Tribal Court; Exclusive Jurisdiction.**

Where an action is brought in the superior court of any county of this state, and where, under the Laws of the United States, exclusive jurisdiction over the matter in controversy has been granted or reserved to an Indian tribal court of a federally recognized Indian tribe, the superior court shall, upon motion of a party or upon its own motion, dismiss such action pursuant to CR 12 (b)(1), unless transfer is required under federal law.

**(b) Indian Tribal Court; Concurrent Jurisdiction.**

Where an action is brought in the superior court of any county of this state, and where, under the Laws of the United States, concurrent jurisdiction over the matter in controversy has been granted or reserved to an Indian tribal court of a federally recognized Indian tribe, the superior court may, if the interests of justice require, cause such action to be transferred to the appropriate Indian tribal court. In making such determination, the superior court shall consider, among other things, the nature of the action, the interests and identities of the parties, the convenience of the parties and witnesses, whether state or tribal law will apply to the matter in controversy, and the remedy available in such Indian tribal court.

**(c) Enforcement of Indian Tribal Court Orders, Judgments or Decrees.**

1) The superior courts of the State of Washington shall recognize, implement and enforce the orders, judgments and decrees of Indian tribal courts in matters in which either the exclusive or concurrent jurisdiction has been granted or reserved to an Indian tribal court of a federally recognized tribe under the Laws of the United States, unless the superior court finds the tribal court that rendered the order, judgment or decree (1) lacked jurisdiction over a party or the subject matter, (2) denied due process as provided by the Indian Civil Rights Act of 1968, or (3) does not reciprocally provide for recognition and implementation of orders, judgments and decrees of the superior courts of the State of Washington.

2) The superior court may attempt to resolve any issues raised regarding an Indian tribal court money judgment by contacting the Indian tribal court judge who issued the judgment. The superior court shall follow the procedure for communicating with the Indian tribal court judge outlined in subsection (d) of this rule.

**(d) Communication between superior court of any county of this state and Indian tribal court.**

1) A superior court of any county of this state may communicate with any Indian tribal court concerning co-occurring proceedings before the respective courts to address issues identified by the superior court, the Indian tribal court,

or the parties to the co-occurring proceedings. The parties shall provide to the respective courts the identity, contact information, and a case or docket number of the other court's proceedings to facilitate this communication.

2) The superior court may allow the parties to participate in the communication. If the parties are not able to participate in the communication, they must be given an opportunity to present facts and legal arguments before a decision by either court is made. The Indian tribal court's procedures and customs shall determine the parties' participation in the Indian tribal court proceedings.

3) Communication between the superior court and the Indian tribal court on schedules, calendars, court records, and similar matters may occur without informing the parties. The superior court need not make a record of the communication. The Indian tribal court's procedures shall determine whether and how a record is made.

4) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (3) of this rule, the superior court must make a record of the communication under this section. The Indian tribal court's procedures shall determine whether and how a record is made in their court. The parties must be informed promptly of the communication and granted access to the record.

5) For the purposes of this section, "record" means information that is inscribed on a tangible medium or that is stored in an electronic or other medium and is retrievable in perceivable form.

6) This rule does not apply to adult criminal matters except when a superior court or Indian tribal court have issued orders prohibiting contact between parties that have co-occurring proceedings. Superior courts and Indian tribal courts may communicate about the orders prohibiting contact as set forth in sections 1-5 above.

**(A) Name of Proponent:** Washington Defender Association

**(B) Spokesperson:** Magda Baker, Misdemeanor Resource Attorney, Washington Defender Association

**(C) Purpose:** The Washington Defender Association (WDA) suggests changes to CrR 3.1(f), CrRLJ 3.1(f) and JuCR 9.3(a) that would ensure that criminal defense attorneys who request funds for experts on behalf of indigent clients in superior courts, courts of limited jurisdiction and juvenile courts do so *ex parte* and would require that those courts seal such requests. WDA also suggests a change to GR 15 (c)(1) that would allow defenders representing clients in juvenile court to move to seal motions for expert funding without giving notice to opposing parties and crime victims, as defenders in superior courts and courts of limited jurisdiction may currently do.

Such changes would allow defense attorneys to pursue necessary experts without sharing their developing trial strategies with opposing counsel. This in turn would protect the rights of criminal defendants to both necessary expert assistance and fair trials. The Sixth Amendment right to effective assistance of counsel "includes expert assistance necessary to an adequate defense." *State v. Punsalan*, 156 Wn.2d 875, 878 (2006) (citing *Ake v. Oklahoma*, 470 U.S. 68, 76, 83 (1985)). For counsel to effectively represent a client in a fair trial, "it is essential that a lawyer work with a certain degree of privacy, free from unnecessary intrusion by opposing parties and their counsel." *Hickman v. Taylor*, 329 U.S. 495, 510 (1947). The Washington Supreme Court has recognized that "[t]he public's right of access [to court records and other information] may be limited to protect other significant and fundamental rights, such as a defendant's right to a fair trial." *State v. McEnroe*, 174 Wn.2d 795, 801 (2012) (citing *Dreiling v. Jain*, 151 Wn.2d 900, 909 (2004)). These related rule changes would make it possible for indigent defendants to simultaneously have the assistance of experts when necessary and to confidentially develop trial strategies, as is necessary to fair trials.

A juvenile shall not be deprived of necessary services because a parent, guardian, or custodian refuses to pay for those services. **C. Purpose:**

General Rule (GR) 24 defines the practice of law in Washington. Section (b) of the current rule permits certain conduct whether or not it constitutes the practice of law. Pursuant to the discussion with the Court in April, this proposal would add new language to section (b) permitting online self-representation legal service providers. Pursuant to the discussion regarding this issue in April at the Practice of Law Board's annual meeting with the Court, the Practice of Law Board initially prepared this submission as a report for the Court. Given the suggested amendments to GR 24, however, the report has been incorporated into this GR 9 Cover Sheet.

Consumers are, in the context of self-representation, increasingly going online to seek legal information, generate legal documents, and seek assistance from unlicensed entities. The public interest is served by protecting consumers from incompetent, unfair, and deceptive online self-representation legal service providers (OLSRLSPs). In addition, online legal service providers want guidance on where the boundaries are in providing self-representation legal services and avoiding the unauthorized practice of law (UPL). Additionally, Washington consumers need to have clarity on where to go with concerns related to OLSRLSPs.

To address these changing consumer needs, the POLB recommends that the Washington Supreme Court amend the definition of "the practice of law" to explicitly authorize information and document preparation services under clear limitations with registration of such provider entities with the WSBA.

What does "practicing law" mean in the age of information technology, globalization, and market disruptions that are transforming everything from health care and transportation to the music industry? The lines separating unauthorized from authorized practice of law have blurred. Online legal information, generation of legal documents, online dispute resolution, and direct representation are not just an inevitable part of the future—they are here and growing at an exponential rate. The concept of a law office being an entity owned and run exclusively by lawyers is changing. Multi-jurisdictional practice is an inescapable consequence of technology.



The traditional idea of the lawyer-client relationship is changing as disciplines start to merge and innovate to find more effective and efficient ways to solve complex problems that have a legal component.

Like it or not, the culture is rapidly and continually producing innovative business models that promise more competitive services and products. The practice of law, as defined and regulated by the Court and administered by the state bar association, must thoughtfully and incrementally adjust to changing conditions by exploring ways to expand access to justice while protecting the public from the risk of harm. As technology marches forward and people look for cheaper and more efficient legal services, the organized bar should be a central player. The court, the bar association, and individual lawyers can play a leading role or sit back and watch an under-regulated potpourri of technological innovators, predators, lay people, and legislative partisans define the new world of legal services.<sup>1</sup>

The current sources of regulation of OLSRLSPs are RCW 2.48 (Unauthorized Practice of Law (UPL)); the Consumer Protection Act, chapter 19.86 RCW, which regulates all matters in trade or commerce; and GR 24, which defines the practice of law and identifies otherwise permitted exceptions to the definition of the practice of law.

The rationale in support of a significant revision to GR 24 flows from the recognition that the internet is inexorably a marketplace where people seek information and assistance in every aspect of life, including legal matters.<sup>2</sup> Many consumers in need of legal information and assistance believe they cannot afford to hire a lawyer and have limited access to free or low-cost traditional legal services. It is estimated that 80% of consumers with legal matters do not seek the assistance of a licensed attorney. Often, consumers seek information and assistance online because it is accessible, affordable, and efficient.

As online self-help legal services expand, providers who are currently operating in Washington are largely doing so without effective regulation or oversight, albeit they are subject to the criminal prohibition of the unauthorized practice of law and the Consumer Protection Act (CPA) and held accountable through contract and tort law to the professional standard of care. *Perkins v CTX*, 137 Wn.2d 93, 106, 969 P.2d 93 (1999). The rationale for regulating this marketplace and displacing competition is that consumers of OLSRLSPs

are at risk of harm by under-regulated online providers that knowingly, deceptively, or negligently create the misperception that licensed lawyers are assisting consumers or that the particular provider is legally authorized to provide the legal assistance adapted to individual needs.<sup>3</sup>

Existing practice of law rules in Washington do not expressly authorize the provision of *interactive* online legal assistance outside the scope of the conventional lawyer-client relationship. Once a legal service is personalized for an individual's situation, it crosses over from lawful provision of generic legal information (or a mere form/scrivener service) to particularized legal advice subject to the rules and regulations governing the practice of law. Thus, only individuals authorized to practice law may lawfully provide web-based legal assistance adapted to individuals' needs. OLSRLSPs may wish to introduce innovative interactive software and helpful online services in Washington, but the legitimate prospective players will only do so if the Washington practice of law rules clearly provide permission for the services.

To address the regulatory gap, emerging OLSRLSPs could be fairly characterized as "*pro se*" assistance businesses that are an exception to the lawyer-centric practice of law. And, if the providers have attributes of the traditional "practice of law," they could nonetheless be expressly "authorized" within the qualified *pro se* exception. This authorization would be justified because these providers deliver critical information and guidance to consumers who are seeking non-lawyer assistance to assess and respond to legal issues that routinely arise in their lives. Whatever mechanism for regulation and accountability is put forward, it should be narrowly tailored to protect consumers' expectations; promote competition and access to justice; and adhere to the GR 12.1 Regulatory Objectives

The North Carolina Statute (NCS) § 84-2.2 is an example of state regulation of online legal assistance involving software that generates legal documents based on information inputted by a consumer. However, rapidly evolving technology and artificial intelligence inevitably will enable entrepreneurs to offer consumers particularized legal advice and opinions (not just documents) based on consumer input and needs. These technological developments in online legal services should be considered by the court as it considers amending GR 24.

The Practice of Law Board recognizes that this suggested amendment to GR 24 could be viewed as impacting competition in the legal services marketplace. This suggested amendment attempts to narrowly tailor the proposed regulations to protect consumers while avoiding unnecessary inhibitions on competition and innovation. In a June 2016 letter to the North Carolina legislature, DOJ and FTC Anti-Trust Division staff offered support for the proposed North Carolina statute. The letter stated, in part:

[S]taff believe that "the practice of law" should mean activities for which specialized legal knowledge and

training is demonstrably necessary to protect consumers and an attorney-client relationship is present. Overbroad scope-of-practice and unauthorized-practice-of-law policies can restrict competition between licensed attorneys and non-attorney providers of legal services, increasing the prices consumers must pay for legal services, and reducing consumers' choices.

Accordingly, the Agencies recommend that the North Carolina General Assembly consider the benefits of interactive websites for consumers and competition in evaluating HB 436. Interactive software for generating legal forms may be more cost-effective for some consumers, may exert downward price pressure on licensed lawyer services, and may promote the more efficient and convenient provision of legal services. Such products may also help increase access to legal services by providing consumers additional options for addressing their legal situations.

The Agencies also recognize that such interactive software products may raise legitimate consumer protection issues. The Agencies recommend that any consumer protections, such as requiring disclosures, be narrowly tailored to avoid unnecessarily inhibiting competition and new ways of delivering legal services that may benefit consumers.

The Rule the POLB proposes here would expand competition in the legal services marketplace while establishing the minimum regulation necessary to protect consumers.

#### **Rationale for Additional Regulation of Online Self-Help Legal Service Providers**

To protect consumers from entities operating outside the scope of the authorized practice of law (including outside the amended GR 24), the POLB has recommended to the WSBA and Attorney General's Office that they consider a bill providing that the Unauthorized Practice of Law is a *per se* Consumer Protection Act violation. See Attachment A for rationale and details of this approach.

#### **Criteria for Evaluating Potential Regulatory Approaches**

The threshold question in evaluating potential regulatory approaches is, "Which branch of government should regulate online legal services activity?" If it is deemed "permitted activity" under GR 24 *within* the definition of the practice of law, the Court may prefer to maintain control over such entities in order to fulfill its traditional constitutional role to regulate the practice of law in Washington. If it is deemed an exception to the definition of the practice of law, it could be regulated as "mere" commercial activity by the legislature and executive branches of government.

Our recommendation is that the Court structure the "permission" so as to retain control of the scope of the exception and who is authorized to engage in the restricted activities. Consumer protection could be strengthened by having the legislature make the unauthorized practice of law a *per se* violation of the CPA (the Practice of Law Board is currently working with WSBA to advance this suggestion). This statutory change will empower consumers, who suffer *actual*

damages caused by UPL, to obtain recovery and deter unfair and deceptive practices in this emerging online self-representation legal services marketplace, while keeping authority over the practice of law with the judicial branch. This advances the public interest in access to justice and promoting a fair and non-deceptive market place.

#### **Benefits and Drawbacks of Potential Regulatory Approaches**

The POLB's recommendation focuses on the Court retaining regulatory authority over of online self-help legal service providers. This recommendation is based on our anticipation of the Court's potential concerns that legislative/executive branch oversight may violate separation of powers and tread on the Court's inherent and plenary authority to regulate the practice of law.

The POLB makes its recommendation in light of the Supreme Court Order Reconstituting the POLB dated July 8, 2015, which directs that the POLB focus on "educating the public about how to receive competent legal assistance and consider new avenues for nonlawyers to provide legal and law related services." Our recommendation is fully aligned with that charge.

#### **D. Hearing:**

A hearing is not recommended.

#### **E. Expedited Consideration:**

Expedited consideration is not requested.

#### **Supporting Material:**

The Board has involved stakeholders during the development of this rule proposal, including representatives from the Access to Justice Board. The proposed rule was provided to the WSBA Board of Governors. The Board has not received written comments from stakeholders on this rule.

#### **SUGGESTED AMENDMENT SUPERIOR COURT GENERAL RULES (GR) GR 24—DEFINITION OF PRACTICE OF LAW**

**(a) General Definition:** The practice of law is the application of legal principles and judgment with regard to the circumstances or objectives of another entity or person(s) which require the knowledge and skill of a person trained in the law. This includes but is not limited to:

(1) Giving advice or counsel to others as to their legal rights or the legal rights or responsibilities of others for fees or other consideration.

(2) Selection, drafting, or completion of legal documents or agreements which affect the legal rights of an entity or person(s).

(3) Representation of another entity or person(s) in a court, or in a formal administrative adjudicative proceeding or other formal dispute resolution process or in an administrative adjudicative proceeding in which legal pleadings are filed or a record is established as the basis for judicial review.

(4) Negotiation of legal rights or responsibilities on behalf of another entity or person(s).

**(b) Exceptions and Exclusions:** Whether or not they constitute the practice of law, the following are permitted:

(1) Practicing law authorized by a limited license to practice pursuant to Admission to Practice Rules 8 (special admission for: a particular purpose or action; indigent representation; educational purposes; emeritus membership; house counsel), 9 (legal interns), 12 (limited practice for closing officers), or 14 (limited practice for foreign law consultants).

(2) Serving as a courthouse facilitator pursuant to court rule.

(3) Acting as a lay representative authorized by administrative agencies or tribunals.

(4) Serving in a neutral capacity as a mediator, arbitrator, conciliator, or facilitator.

(5) Participation in labor negotiations, arbitrations or conciliations arising under collective bargaining rights or agreements.

(6) Providing assistance to another to complete a form provided by a court for protection under RCW chapters 10.14 (harassment) or 26.50 (domestic violence prevention) when no fee is charged to do so.

(7) Acting as a legislative lobbyist.

(8) Sale of legal forms in any format.

(9) Activities which are preempted by Federal law.

(10) Serving in a neutral capacity as a clerk or court employee providing information to the public pursuant to Supreme Court Order.

(11) Such other activities that the Supreme Court has determined by published opinion do not constitute the unlicensed or unauthorized practice of law or that have been permitted under a regulatory system established by the Supreme Court.

(12) The operation of a hosted site or service, including but not limited to a web site, hosted service, mobile app, or cloud-based application that offers self-represented consumers access to interactive software, including software that gives legal information related to civil law matters or generates a legal document based on the consumer's input and responses to questions presented by the software, under the following conditions:

(A) Providers must:

(i) Provide consumers a means to view the blank template and the final document before finalizing a purchase of that document;

(ii) Have an attorney licensed to practice law in the State of Washington review all blank templates and legal operative language offered to Washington consumers, and that may appear in the completed document;

(iii) Maintain the name and address of each reviewing attorney and provide this information to any Washington State regulatory authority or agency, including but not limited to the Washington State Bar Association, or the Washington State Attorney General upon request;

(iv) Provide consumers a written itemization of the services and documents provided and the total cost of each, including all fees when the final document is viewed;

(v) Communicate clearly and conspicuously that the services provided are not a substitute for the advice or services of an attorney. This disclosure shall be separately and expressly acknowledged by the consumer;

(vi) Disclose to consumer the entity name, entity type, state of entity formation, and physical address of the provider's main place of business;

(vi) Disclose clearly and conspicuously to the consumer that personal information provided by the consumer and other communications through the service are not subject to the attorney client evidentiary privilege and the provider or consumer may be compelled to testify about the information in a court action. This disclosure shall be separately and expressly acknowledged by the consumer;

(vii) Consent to service of process on a registered agent in Washington;

(viii) Have a voluntary consumer satisfaction process clearly and conspicuously documented and displayed on the provider's website, service or application;

(ix) Refer all consumer concerns involving the unauthorized practice of law to the Practice of Law Board;

(x) Register with the Washington State Bar Association, pursuant to fees and conditions approved by the Court, prior to commencing operation in the State and renew the registration annually. The Washington State Bar Association shall have the authority to recommend denial or revocation of registration or renewal to the Supreme Court, pursuant to regulations adopted by the court;

(xi) Pay an initial registration fee and an annual renewal fee in an amount set by the Supreme Court.

(B) Providers may not:

(i) Directly or indirectly offer or sell any financial or investment products or financial or investment services to a consumers who purchase completed forms or services;

(ii) Use the consumer's information for any purpose other than preparing the purchased documents or providing the services;

(iii) Misrepresent, directly or by implication its products or services;

(iv) Disclaim any warranties or liability or limit the recovery of damages or other remedies by the consumer;

(v) Require the consumer to agree to jurisdiction or venue in any state other than Washington for the resolution of disputes between the provider and the consumer.

(vi) Act as the appointed power of attorney for the consumer or any beneficiary;

(vii) Appear in any proceeding nor take on the role of representative for any consumer or beneficiary in any context, forum, communication or proceeding.

(viii) Accept compensation for services from anyone other than the consumer.

**(c) Non-lawyer Assistants:** Nothing in this rule shall affect the ability of non-lawyer assistants to act under the supervision of a lawyer in compliance with Rule 5.3 of the Rules of Professional Conduct.

**(d) General Information:** Nothing in this rule shall affect the ability of a person or entity to provide information of a general nature about the law and legal procedures to members of the public.

**(e) Governmental agencies:** Nothing in this rule shall affect the ability of a governmental agency to carry out responsibilities provided by law.

**(f) Professional Standards:** Nothing in this rule shall be taken to define or affect standards for civil liability or professional responsibility.

We do so in order to provide members of the public with a chance to provide any legal analysis that they would like us to consider as we develop our opinion. In preparing any comments, please be aware that our opinion will provide our considered legal analysis of the question presented, and therefore comments that address the interpretation of the law are more helpful than comments that express an opinion as to what the law should be.

If you are interested in commenting on a request listed in this volume of the register, you should notify the attorney general's office of your interest by December 26, 2018. This is not the due date by which comments must be received, and we will consider any comments we receive before we complete our opinion. However, if you do not notify the attorney general's office of your interest in commenting on an opinion request by this date, the opinion may be issued before your comments have been received. **QUESTION(S):**

- 1. Does RCW 18.79.050 supersede the physician-only restriction in the Reproductive Privacy Act (RPA) insofar as that restriction would prevent qualified Advanced Registered Nurse Practitioners (ARNPs) from performing first trimester aspiration abortion?**
- 2. The plain language of the RPA permits health care professionals to perform abortions under the supervision of a licensed physician, and there is nothing in the RPA that requires this supervision to be in-person. Does this mean that there is nothing in the RPA to prevent physician assistants (who at all times operate under the supervision of a licensed physician) from performing first trimester aspiration abortions?**
- 3. Assuming that the RPA does not prohibit qualified Physician's Assistants (PAs) whose scope of practice includes first trimester aspiration abortion from providing this service, does the RPA require in-person supervision by a physician?**
- 4. Does the application of the physician-only restriction in the RPA to Advanced Practice Clinicians (APCs) in Washington State otherwise violate state or federal law?**

Notice of Administrative Policy Statements

The following is a list of administrative policies published by the public employees benefits board (PEBB) program. These policies are effective January 1, 2019. You can download the complete policy statements at [www.hca.wa.gov/public-employee-benefits/rules-and-policies](http://www.hca.wa.gov/public-employee-benefits/rules-and-policies).

The following policies were amended:

**Policy 11-1: Providing a notice to an employee and an employer.** To clarify the requirements of an employer-to-

employee and employee-to-employer notice, as stated in RCW 41.05.009(2) and 41.05.065 (4)(c)(iii), (iv), and (v).

**Policy 11-3: Correcting employing agency and contracted vendor enrollment errors.** This policy clarifies the requirements placed on an employing agency or contracted vendor when they correct their own enrollment errors as described in WAC 182-08-187.

**Policy 15-1: Determining eligibility for a seasonal employee and maintenance of employer contribution through the off-season.** This policy clarifies seasonal employee eligibility for PEBB benefits and the employer contribution.

**Policy 17-2: Determining faculty eligibility after a layoff.** Applying the criteria for maintaining the employer contribution toward insurance coverage for faculty following a layoff as described in WAC 182-12-129.

**Policy 17-3: Determining faculty eligibility for off-quarter/semester or for decreases in workload.** To clarify when a faculty member qualifies for the employer contribution toward insurance coverage during an off-quarter/semester or when there is a decrease in workload.

**Policy 19-1: Termination due to loss of eligibility.** This policy applies whenever coverage for a subscriber or a subscriber's dependent is terminated due to loss of eligibility.

**Addendum 19-1A: Termination due to loss of eligibility: Employee.**

**Addendum 19-1B: Termination due to loss of eligibility: Self-pay subscriber.**

**Policy 21-1: Exemption from the retiree deferral form requirement.** This policy exempts certain retirees from the "deferral form requirement" under WAC 182-12-171 (1)(d) and 182-12-205 (4)(a).

**Policy 26-1: Administering PEBB insurance in coordination with Medicare Part D.** To administer PEBB retiree medical plan enrollment in order to participate in the employer incentive program established in section 1860D-22 of the Medicare Prescription Drug, Improvement, and Modernization Act of 2003.

**Policy 31-1: Verifying dependent eligibility before enrollment.** This policy clarifies which documents the PEBB program considers valid for dependent verification and identifies which accounts are included in the dependent verification process.

**Policy 31-2: Use of premium surcharge help sheet and spousal plan calculator tools.** This policy provides direction when a PEBB program subscriber enrolled in PEBB medical, but not enrolled in Medicare Part A and Part B where Medicare is the primary payer of claims, is determining if a premium surcharge will be applied for a spouse or state-registered domestic partner enrolled in PEBB medical.

**Policy 33-1: Verifying legal union's residency status.** This policy clarifies which documents the PEBB program considers valid for establishing state residency.

**Policy 36-1: Certifying eligibility for a dependent child with a disability who is age 26 or older.** This policy applies whenever a subscriber requests to enroll a dependent child with a disability who is age 26 or older to their PEBB program subscriber account.

**Policy 37-1: Certifying eligibility for an extended dependent child.** This policy applies when a subscriber sub-

mits the required forms to enroll an extended dependent child in the subscriber's PEBB benefits.

**Policy 45-2: Special open enrollment (SOE).** This policy applies whenever a subscriber requests an enrollment change or election change outside of the PEBB program annual open enrollment period.

**Addendum 45-2A: Special Open Enrollment (SOE) matrix:** Summary of permitted election changes.

**Policy 56-1: Continuation coverage and retiree insurance coverage reinstatement for subscribers with mental or physical impairment or incapacitation.** This policy applies whenever a subscriber (or another party acting on behalf of the subscriber) requests reinstatement of continuation coverage or retiree insurance coverage due to nonpayment of premiums, or applicable premium surcharges, for reason of mental or physical impairment or incapacitation.

This policy establishes the methodology that the PEBB program will use to make a determination of mental or physical impairment or incapacitation for the purpose of reinstatement of coverage terminated due to nonpayment of premiums, or applicable premium surcharges.

**Policy 56-2: Election period tolling for applicants with mental or physical impairment or incapacitation.** This policy applies whenever an applicant (or another party acting on behalf of the applicant) requests tolling of the continuation coverage, retiree insurance coverage, new employee eligibility, annual open enrollment, or special open enrollment election period for reason of mental or physical impairment or incapacitation.

This policy establishes the methodology that the PEBB program will use to make a determination of mental or physical impairment or incapacitation for the purpose of tolling the election period of continuation coverage, retiree insurance coverage, new employee eligibility, annual open enrollment, or special open enrollment.

**Policy 60-1: Required appeals related documents when the PEBB program conducts a brief adjudicative proceeding.** This policy clarifies what particular documents are required from an employing agency or third-party administrator when the PEBB program is conducting a brief adjudicative proceeding at the request of one of its employees or subscribers.

**Policy 91-1: Requesting a reasonable alternative for completing wellness incentive program requirements or avoiding the tobacco use premium surcharge.** This policy applies when a subscriber who is eligible to participate in the PEBB wellness incentive program is seeking a reasonable alternative to a wellness incentive program requirement in order to receive a wellness incentive as described in WAC 182-12-300.

This policy also applies when an enrollee on a PEBB medical plan is seeking a reasonable alternative so that a subscriber can avoid paying the tobacco use premium surcharge as described in WAC 182-08-185 (1)(c).

**Policy 91-3: Washington wellness worksite designation program incentive requirements.** This policy provides a set of requirements for state agencies to use when offering wellness incentives under the Washington wellness worksite designation program.
