This is not the due date by which comments must be received, and we will consider any comments we receive before we complete our opinion. NOTICE

Title or Subject: Medicaid State Plan Amendment (SPA) 19-0007 Treat & Refer Services.

Effective Date: July 1, 2019.

Description: The health care authority (HCA) and the department of health (DOH) published notice of their intent to submit medicaid SPA 18-0024 on August 1, 2018, under WSR 18-15-054. This SPA would implement E2SHB 1358 which was signed by the governor on May 10, 2017, and was to be implemented on January 1, 2019.

Because implementation of SPA 18-0024 has been delayed until July 1, 2019, SPA 18-0024 has been renumbered as SPA 19-0007; all other information regarding SPA 18-0024 remains the same. SSB 5591 (2015) allowed emergency medical services providers to develop community assistance referral and education services (CARES) programs. CARES programs are able to hire or contract with health care professionals to provide community outreach and injury prevention services to residents of its jurisdiction to advance population health. E2SHB 1358 directs HCA to adopt standards for reimbursement of covered health care services provided to eligible medicaid clients by specified emergency medical services providers through their CARES programs, when those services are provided to clients whose medical needs do not require ambulance transport to an emergency department. These services are known as "treat and refer" services.

E2SHB 1358 also directs DOH to review the professional certification and training of health professionals partic-

ipating in a CARES program and coordinate with HCA to link the certification requirements with the treat and refer services. Treat and refer services may be provided by the following emergency medical services providers:

- Fire departments (including city and town fire departments).
- Fire protection districts.
- Regional fire protection service authorities.
- Emergency medical service providers eligible to levy a tax under state law.
- Federally recognized Indian tribes.

SPA 19-0007 is expected to increase the annual aggregate expenditures/payments to emergency medical services providers by \$3,840,960 in fiscal year 2019.

A draft of SPA 19-0007 is available for review. HCA and DOH would appreciate any input or concerns regarding this SPA. Policy Title: Interim Policy for Prepreg Waste. Pub. #18-04-029.

Subject: This policy gives an alternative regulatory option to the requirements of chapter 173-303 WAC, Dangerous waste regulations, for generators of dangerous waste prepreg materials. The policy provides a practical waste management system which is equally protective of human health and the environment.

Policy Description: Prepreg fiber materials are widely used in the advanced composite industry, such as the aircraft and aerospace sectors. The interim policy for prepreg waste provides a conditional management and disposal option for oven-cured prepreg waste that is not a federal hazardous waste under 40 C.F.R. Part 261. You may choose to manage some or all of your prepreg waste under the dangerous waste regulations or under the policy. You must follow all of the conditions in the policy to take advantage of these benefits.
