Description: Pharmacy update - Substance Use-Disorder Prevention that Promotes Opioid Recovery and Treatment for Patients and Communities Act (SUPPORT Act) requirements.

The health care authority (the agency) intends to submit SPA 19-0014 to implement requirements of medicaid under Section 1004 of SUPPORT Act (the act). To comply with the act, the agency will submit the following changes to the state plan:

- 1. Description of the agency's opioid policy regarding quantity limits for acute prescribing, prescriber attestation requirements for chronic use, and changes to comply with the act. These limits, related exemptions, and attestation requirements have been in place since November 2017. This SPA will include a new morphine milligram equivalent (MME) limitation as required by the act, which will be incorporated into the existing attestation process.
- 2. Descriptions of existing policies related to rejecting duplicate prescriptions and monitoring for prescriptions refilled earlier than medically necessary.
 - 3. Automated processes for claims review to:
- Indicate when an individual is prescribed a subsequent fill of opioids in excess of the limitations above;
- Indicate when an individual is prescribed greater than a one hundred twenty MME dose of opioids per day; or
- Monitor when an individual is concurrently prescribed opioids and benzodiazepines or opioids and antipsychotics.
- 4. Description of the program the state has in place to identify fraud and abuse related to opioids and what the agency does when fraud or abuse is identified. Description of the agency's program for monitoring antipsychotic use in children, as expanded to comply with the act. Currently, the agency has specific age and dose thresholds for antipsychotic medications, beyond which a consultation with an agency-designated pediatric mental health specialist is required. Under the act, the agency will add an automated claims review process to monitor the prescribing of antipsychotics for all children, regardless of whether these age and dose thresholds are exceeded.
- 5. Provision that affirms the agency has updated its contracts with managed care organizations (MCO) to require MCOs to participate in and implement all of the same activities described above.

SPA 19-0014 is expected to have no effect on the annual aggregate expense/payments for prescription drugs.

Program Administrative Policy Statements

The following is a list of administrative policies published by the SEBB program. These policies are effective October 1, 2019.

The following policies were created to support the SEBB program:

Policy 11-1: Providing a notice to a school employee and a SEBB organization. To clarify the requirements of an employer-to-employee and employee-to-employer notice, as stated in RCW 41.05.009(2) and 41.05.740 (6)(d) and (e).

Policy 12-1: Determining the first day of school for SEBB organizations. This policy applies when a SEBB organization is determining the first day of school for the upcoming school year.

Policy 19-1: Termination due to loss of eligibility or enrollment error. This policy applies whenever coverage for a subscriber or a subscriber's dependent is terminated due to loss of eligibility, or because a subscriber or dependent was enrolled when they were not eligible for coverage.

Addendum 19-1A: Termination due to loss of eligibility or enrollment error: School employee and dependent of school employee.

Addendum 19-1B: Termination due to loss of eligibility or nonpayment: Self-pay subscriber and dependent of self-pay subscriber.

Policy 31-1: Verifying dependent eligibility before enrollment. This policy clarifies which documents the SEBB program considers valid for dependent verification and identifies which accounts are included in the dependent verification process. Although some subscriber accounts are not included in the process, the SEBB program reserves the right to review a dependent's eligibility at any time.

Policy 31-2: Use of premium surcharge help sheet and spousal plan calculator tools. This policy provides direction when a SEBB program subscriber enrolled in SEBB medical is determining if a premium surcharge will be applied for a spouse or state registered domestic partner enrolled in SEBB medical.

Policy 33-1: Verifying legal union's residency status. This policy clarifies which documents the SEBB program considers valid for establishing state residency for subscribers who are in a legal union as defined in RCW 26.04.260 that is substantially equivalent to marriage in Washington state.

Policy 36-1: Certifying eligibility for a dependent child with a disability who is age 26 or older. This policy applies whenever a subscriber requests to enroll or continue enrollment for a dependent child with a disability who is age twenty-six or older on their SEBB program subscriber account.

Miscellaneous [14]

Policy 37-1: Certifying eligibility for an extended dependent child. This policy applies when a subscriber submits the required forms to enroll an extended dependent child in the subscriber's SEBB benefits.

Policy 56-1: Continuation coverage reinstatement for subscribers with mental or physical impairment or incapacitation. This policy applies whenever a subscriber (or another party acting on behalf of the subscriber) requests reinstatement of continuation coverage due to nonpayment of premiums, or applicable premium surcharges, for reason of mental or physical impairment or incapacitation.

This policy establishes the methodology the SEBB program will use to make a determination of mental or physical impairment or incapacitation for the purpose of reinstatement of coverage terminated due to nonpayment of premiums, or applicable premium surcharges.

This policy provides timing requirements for requesting reinstatement due to nonpayment of premiums, or applicable premium surcharges, for reason of mental or physical impairment or incapacity.

Policy 56-2: Election period tolling for applicants with mental or physical impairment or incapacitation. This policy applies whenever an applicant (or another party acting on behalf of the applicant) requests tolling of the continuation coverage, new employee eligibility, annual open enrollment, or special open enrollment election period, for reason of mental or physical impairment or incapacitation.

This policy establishes the methodology that the SEBB program will use to make a determination of mental or physical impairment or incapacitation for the purpose of tolling the election period of continuation coverage, new employee eligibility, annual open enrollment, or special open enrollment.

This policy provides timing requirements to request tolling of the election period for reason of mental or physical impairment or incapacity.

Policy 60-1: Required appeals related documents when the SEBB program conducts a brief adjudicative proceeding. This policy clarifies what particular documents are required from a SEBB organization or third-party administrator when the SEBB program is conducting a brief adjudicative proceeding at the request of one of its school employees or subscribers.

Policy 91-1: Requesting a reasonable alternative for completing wellness incentive program requirements or avoiding the tobacco use premium surcharge. This policy applies when a subscriber who is eligible to participate in the SEBB wellness incentive program is seeking a reasonable alternative to a wellness incentive program requirement in order to receive a wellness incentive.

This policy also applies when an enrollee on a SEBB medical plan is seeking a reasonable alternative so that a subscriber can avoid paying the tobacco use premium surcharge as described in WAC 182-30-050 (1)(c)(iii).

Policy 91-2: Tobacco as it relates to religious or ceremonial use. This policy applies whenever a SEBB program subscriber is attesting to an enrolled member's tobacco use status. The purpose of the policy is to clarify the exception for the religious or ceremonial use of tobacco.

Policy 91-3: Washington wellness worksite designation program incentive requirements. This policy provides a set of requirements for SEBB organizations to use when offering wellness incentives under the Washington wellness worksite designation program.

Announcing for Review and Comment: Draft Zostera japonica (Z. japonica) Management on Commercial Clam Beds in Willapa Bay General Permit

The Washington state department of ecology (ecology) proposes to reissue the *Z. japonica* management on commercial clam beds in Willapa Bay national pollutant discharge elimination system (NPDES) and state waste discharge general permit (permit). The permit was last modified on April 5, 2017, and expired on May 2, 2019. The new draft permit and fact sheet, which explains the technical basis for the permit, are available for review and public comment from September 18, 2019, until 11:59 p.m. on November 4, 2019. Ecology will host informational workshops and public hearings on the draft permit.

Purpose of the Permit: In Willapa Bay only, for commercial clam growers and their pesticide applicator that decide to use an herbicide to manage Z. japonica on their commercial clam beds, the permit regulates the discharge of the aquatic labeled herbicide imazamox. State and Federal water quality laws do not allow the discharge of pollutants to waters of the state without permit coverage. The herbicide imazamox allowed for use in the permit is a pollutant and therefore requires a discharge permit before application to waters of the state of Washington. The permit covers all Z. japonica management activities that result in a discharge of imazamox and marker dyes from treatment of commercial clam beds to surface waters of the state of Washington. Coverage under the general permit will be available to pesticide applicators licensed by the Washington state department of agriculture with an aquatic endorsement and their sponsor (the commercial clam bed owner or manager) who plan to use imazamox to control Z. japonica on commercial clam beds in Willapa Bay. Ecology issues general permits in place of a series of individual permits when the permitted activities are similar.
