- (3) Effective immediately all areas except for the Everett Flats area of Crab Management Region 2-East are open until 1:00 pm on January 19, 2020. Region 2-East includes Marine Fish-Shellfish Catch Reporting Areas 24A, 24B, 24C, 24D and 26A East.
- (4) Effective immediately, it is unlawful for any license holder or alternate operator to fish for crabs for commercial purposes with more than 25 pots per license per buoy tag number in Crab Management Region 2-East.
- (5) Effective immediately, until further notice, it is unlawful for any license holder or alternate operator to fish for crabs for commercial purposes with more than 50 pots per license per buoy tag number in Crab Management Region 2-West, Region 3-1, and Region 3-3. These regions include Marine Fish-Shellfish Catch Reporting Areas 20A, 20B, 21A, 21B, 22A, 22B, 26A West, 25B, 25D, 23C and 29.
- (6) All remaining buoy tags per license must be onboard the designated vessel and available for immediate inspection.
- (7) Effective immediately until further notice, the following areas are closed to commercial crab fishing.

- (a) That portion of Marine Fish-Shellfish Management and Catch Reporting Area 25A west of the 123°7.0' longitude line projected from the new Dungeness light due south to the shore of Dungeness Bay.
- (b) That portion of Marine Fish-Shellfish Management and Catch Reporting Area 23D west of a line from the eastern tip of Ediz Hook to the ITT Rayonier Dock Everett Flats which are those portions of catch area 26AE east of a line from Howarth Park due north to the south end of Gedney Island and that portion of 24B east of a line from the north end of Gedney Island to Camano Head and south of a line drawn from Camano Head to Hermosa Point on the Tulalip reservation.
- (c) Everett Flats which are those portions of catch area 26AE east of a line from Howarth Park due north to the south end of Gedney Island and that portion of 24B east of a line from the north end of Gedney Island to Camano Head and south of a line drawn from Camano Head to Hermosa Point on the Tulalip reservation.

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds that immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.

Reasons for this Finding: This rule is necessary to close retention of white sturgeon in the McNary Pool on the Columbia River and from the mouth to Ice Harbor Dam on the Snake River. These rules are currently in process of becoming permanent and were approved at the December 2019 commission meeting. This rule also carries forward emergency rules regarding steelhead already in place for the Columbia and Snake rivers. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.

- (4) Tucannon River (Columbia/Garfield Counties): from mouth to the Tucannon Hatchery Road Bridge: Effective immediately through April 15, 2020: Steelhead daily limit is 1 hatchery steelhead, anglers must stop fishing for steelhead after their daily limit has been retained.
- (5) Walla Walla River (Walla Walla County): from mouth to the Washington/Oregon border: Effective immediately through April 15, 2020: Steelhead daily limit is 1 hatchery steelhead, anglers must stop fishing for steelhead after their daily limit has been retained.
