The Washington State Supreme Court considered the request by the Limited License Legal Technician (LLLT) Board to waive the requirement in APR 28, Regulation 3 (B)(1)(a) that a candidate for the license complete all the core

courses prior to enrollment in the domestic relations practice area courses. Because of the impact of COVID-19 on the colleges and the pending deadline for completion of the LLLT requirements, some students may not be able to complete the core coursework by September, 2020, which is when the last series of domestic relations practice area courses begins. Waiver of that requirement in the rule would assist eligible candidates in timely completing all education requirements.

Now, therefore, it is hereby

ORDERED:

That the provision in APR 28, Regulation (B)(1)(a), which requires that core courses be completed prior to enrolling in the domestic relations practice area courses, is hereby suspended.

IN THE MATTER OF SUGGESTED) ORDER AMENDMENTS TO APR 3 AND APR 5) NO. 25700-A-1305

The Washington State Supreme Court considered the request by the Limited License Legal Technician (LLLT) Board to change the requirement of a LLLT candidate to take the specific Paralegal Core Competency Exam cited in APR 3 (e)(3), to completing a LLLT Board approved paralegal certification examination instead. Further, the court reviewed the requirement to take such an exam prior to sitting for the LLLT exam and determined that the LLLT Board approved paralegal certification examination requirement should be required for licensure only. Because of the impact of COVID-19 and the pending deadline for completion of the LLLT requirements, some students may not be able to complete the paralegal certification examination prior to sitting for the LLLT examination. Requiring proof of completion of a LLLT Board approved paralegal certification examination prior to licensing, instead of prior to the LLLT examination, would assist eligible candidates in completing all requirements for LLLT licensure.

Having recommended the expeditious adoption of the suggested amendments, and the Court having considered the suggested amendments to APR 3 and APR 5, and having determined that the suggested amendments will aid in the prompt and orderly administration of justice;

Now, therefore, it is hereby

ORDERED:

(a) That the proposed amendments as shown below are expeditiously adopted.

(b) That pursuant to the emergency provisions of GR 9 (j)(1), the suggested amendments will be published expeditiously in the Washington Reports and will become effective immediately.

This fee shall be waived if the pro bono status lawyer, LLLT, or LPO provided at least 30 hours of pro bono service through a qualified legal service provider in the previous calendar year. Emeritus PPro bono status lawyers, LLLTs, or LPOs are subject to

This memo serves as notice that the department of health (department) is withdrawing the policy statement for dental hygiene temporary practice permit - scope of practice limitations during the COVID-19 response. The policy statement was filed on July 30, 2020, and published as WSR 20-16-090.

The department filed a policy statement to limit the scope of practice for dental hygienists who hold a temporary practice permit in support of Governor's Proclamation 20-59. Dental hygienists working under a temporary practice permit are not allowed to administer local anesthesia, or to perform restorative duties including, but not limited to, placing restorations into the cavity, and carving, contouring, and adjusting contacts and occlusion of restorations. These duties are prohibited until dental hygienists complete all licensing requirements and [are] issued a nontemporary credential.

The policy statement incorrectly addresses the practice of administering local anesthetic for dental hygienists working under a temporary practice permit. Administering topical local anesthesia is permitted, but current language suggests administering local anesthetic of any kind is prohibited. This inconsistency creates confusion for dental hygienists working with a temporary practice permit. The department has decided to withdraw the current policy statement and to file a new policy statement to clarify the local anesthesia restriction. The new policy statement clarifies that dental hygienists are not allowed to give injections of local anesthesia. Specifying "injection" allows dental hygienists to administer topical local anesthesia.

Purpose of the Permit: The permit addresses various legal requirements and responsibilities, and regulates the discharge of pollutants to protect water quality in Washington state. The permit authorizes the discharge of stormwater and

authorized non-stormwater associated with construction activity. The permit is a combined NPDES and state waste discharge permit that limits the discharge of pollutants to surface waters under the authority of the federal Water Pollution Control Act (33 U.S.C 1251) and limits the discharge of pollutants to surface and groundwater under the authority of the state Water Pollution Control Act (chapter 90.48 RCW).

Public Notice Process and Comments: Ecology accepted public comments on the draft permit and fact sheet from *July 1 through August 14, 2020*. Ecology held informational public workshops and hearings during this time via online statewide webinars on August 4 and 6, 2020. Ecology received written public comments and emails. The comments and ecology's responses are included as Appendix D of the fact sheet.
