## CrRLJ 3.3 TIME FOR TRIAL

- (a) (e) [Unchanged.]
- (f) Continuances. Continuances or other delays may be granted as follows:
- (1) Written Agreement. Upon written agreement of the parties which must be signed by <u>defense counsel or</u> the defendant or all defendants, the court may continue the trial to a specified date. <u>In the absence of the defendant's signature or presence at the hearing, <del>Ddefense counsel's signature constitutes a representation that the defendant has been consulted and agrees to the continuance. The court's notice to defense counsel of new hearing dates constitutes notice to the defendant.</u></del>
