PUBLIC NOTICE FOR SPARTINA TREATMENT IN WESTERN WASHINGTON

LEGAL NOTICE: The Washington state department of agriculture (WSDA) plant protection division is hereby notifying the affected public that the herbicides glyphosate (e.g. Aquamaster®, Aquaneat®, or Rodeo®) and imazapyr (e.g. Habitat® or Polaris AQ®), surfactants (e.g. R-11™, Agri-Dex™, Class Act Next Generation™, Competitor™, Dyne-Amic™, Kinetic™, or LI-700™) and marker dyes may be used to control invasive *Spartina* grass species between June 1, 2007, and October 31, 2007. Properly licensed pesticide applicators who have obtained coverage under the WSDA National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Waste Discharge General Permit may apply glyphosate or imazapyr to control the noxious weed *Spartina* on the saltwater tideflats of Grays Harbor, Hood Canal, Willapa Bay, Puget Sound, and the north and west sides of the Olympic Peninsula.

Use of herbicides is one of the options used to control *Spartina*. These infestations may also be treated by mowing, digging, crushing, or covering.

RULE 1.15A: SAFEGUARDING PROPERTY

upon request. A lawyer must provide at least annually a written accounting to a client or third person for whom the lawyer is holding property funds.

New JuCR 11.3

Notice to Foster Parents, Preadoptive Parents, Nonrelative Caregivers or Relative Caregivers

(a) Applicability. This rule applies to all proceedings under Chapter 13.34 RCW to be held with respect to a child in foster care under the responsibility of the Washington State Department of Social and Health Services Children's Administration ("the Department"). The Department is responsible for giving notice of such proceedings to the foster parents, preadoptive parents, nonrelative caregivers or relative caregivers who are providing care to the child at the time of the proceeding.

(b) Content of the Notice. The notice shall specify the time, place, and purpose of the proceeding, and shall inform the foster parents, preadoptive parents, nonrelative caregivers or relative caregivers of their right to be heard in such proceedings.

(c) Method of Giving Notice. Notice may be given by any means reasonably certain of notifying the foster parents, preadoptive parents, nonrelative caregivers or relative caregivers, including but not limited to, notice in open court, mail, personal service, telephone, telegraph and email.

(d) Time of Notice. Notice shall be provided at least five court days before such proceedings; in cases where the foster child is placed with the foster parents, preadoptive parents, nonrelative caregivers or relative caregiver less than five court days before the proceeding, the Department shall provide notice as soon as practicable before the proceeding.

(e) Verification of Notice. The Department shall provide the Court with written verification of to whom, where, when, and how notice of the proceeding was provided to the foster parents, preadoptive parents, nonrelative caregivers or relative caregivers.

(f) Party Status Not Conferred. This rule does not confer party status upon any foster parent, preadoptive parent, nonrelative caregivers or relative caregiver solely on the basis of such notice and right to be heard at a proceeding.

**Air Quality Program Introduces Another General Order
of Approval**

In 2005, ecology created the legal framework for general orders of approval. Ecology's air quality program is now proposing another (the seventh) general order. This order is for automobile body repair and refinishing shops. If a business wishes to install the equipment needed to run a body repair and refinishing shop, an application can be made for coverage under the general order, or the business can choose to go through the older more site specific notice of construction order of approval. The choice is made by the applicant.

Applicability Criteria for this General Order of Approval

Criterion	Limitation
Facility description	Repair and refinish the passenger and cargo enclosure (i.e., the "body") sections of automobiles, trucks, and other mobile equipment.
Size	Shall not use more than 950 gallons per year of refinishing materials of all types.
Design	Spray booth with exhaust fan, filter, and unrestricted exhaust stack.
Refinishing materials	Low-VOC: Complaint with 40 C.F.R. Part 59, Subpart B. None may contain cadmium.
Equipment	Spray gun transfer efficiency rating not less than 60%. Spray gun cleanup in closed system.

The draft order and fact sheet are available for review and public comment from August 1, 2007, to September 1, 2007. The public is encouraged to give written comments during the public comment period.

A general order is used instead of a series of individual notice of construction orders of approval when the permitted facilities are similar. Individual facilities that receive coverage under the general order are required to comply with the terms and conditions of the order.

This order will be available to applicants in the counties that are regulated directly by ecology's air quality program. These counties are: San Juan, Okanogan, Chelan, Douglas, Ferry, Stevens, Pend Oreille, Kittitas, Walla Walla, Columbia, Garfield, Asotin, Grant, Lincoln, Adams, Whitman, Franklin, and Klickitat counties. Applicants in other areas are regulated by a local air agency and are subject to their notice of construction rules and procedures. This order is also available to those sources of statewide importance that are directly regulated by ecology.

- Adequacy of environmental protection and order conditions, or
- Any other concern that would result from issuance of the revised order.

In accordance with RCW 90.58.030 (3)(e), the office of financial management (OFM) shall adjust the "substantial development" dollar threshold defined in the Shoreline Management Act every five years beginning July 1, 2007. The new dollar threshold shall be transmitted to the office of the code reviser for publication in the Washington state register at least one month before the new threshold takes effect.

Notice of Substantial Development Dollar Threshold

The Shoreline Management Act, chapter 90.58 RCW, was originally enacted in 1971. RCW 90.58.030 (3)(e) defines a "substantial development" to include any development of which the total cost or fair market value exceeds five thousand (\$5,000) dollars. Chapter 230, Laws of 2002 (EHB 2623) requires the office of financial management to adjust this dollar threshold for inflation every five years, beginning July 1, 2007. The adjustment is to be based upon changes in the consumer price index for the urban areas of Seattle, Washington, during that five-year time period. The new dollar threshold shall be transmitted to the office of the code reviser for publication in the Washington state register at least one month before the new threshold takes effect.

In accordance with the requirements set forth above, the office of financial management submits for publication the new dollar threshold. The new dollar threshold is five thousand seven hundred and eighteen dollars (\$5,718). The new dollar threshold takes effect September 1, 2007.

This new threshold was calculated as follows. Over the five-year period from June 2002 to June 2007, the Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers for the Seattle-Tacoma-Bremerton, Washington area as reported by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, United States Department of Labor, increased by 14.4%. Increasing the total cost or fair market value threshold of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) in RCW 90.58.030 (3)(e) by the rate of increase for the consumer price index results in an updated threshold of \$5,718.
