Title or Subject: Medicaid State Plan Amendment (SPA) 18-0018 - Third Party Liability.

Effective Date: June 1, 2018.

Description: The health care authority (HCA) intends to submit SPA 18-0018 to identify the threshold dollar amounts HCA uses to pursue recovery of medical services claims that were paid by medicaid when a commercial insurance had primary responsibility for payment. Specific dollar thresholds are set to ensure it is cost-effective for HCA to pursue recovery on those claims. HCA sets thresholds when:

- Health insurance claims are submitted for recovery.
- Casualty insurance files are opened to pursue paid claims on an injured client.
- Treatment questionnaires are sent to the client to gain additional insight about a possible injury or accident.

SPA 18-0018 is expected to have no effect on the annual aggregate expenditures/payments for all benefits and services since the SPA does not affect payments made to fee-for-service providers.
