Title or Subject: Medicaid State Plan Amendment (SPA) 19-0024 Private Duty Nursing Rates.

Effective Date: January 1, 2020.

Description: The health care authority intends to submit Medicaid SPA 19-0024 to implement the ten percent rate increase for private duty nursing services provided to children receiving medically intensive care in a home setting, effective January 1, 2020. The rate increase is authorized by ESHB 1109, passed in the 2018-2019 legislative session.

SPA 19-0024 is expected to increase annual aggregate expenditures/reimbursement/payment for private duty nursing services by ten percent as legislatively authorized.

The department of enterprise services (DES) has begun work in support of amending chapter 200-200 WAC, State capitol grounds traffic and parking regulations. The purpose of this rule making is to:

1. Align the rules with current parking practices, policies and statutory requirements;
2. Not present barrier when implementing improved processes and practices;
3. Make sure the rules are easily and quickly understood; and
4. Not replicate/duplicate other parking requirements.

In support of this rule making, DES has identified sections in chapter 200-200 WAC parking and traffic control on the capitol grounds that are more appropriate to chapter 200-220 WAC, Use of the public areas of the capitol buildings and grounds. These sections are not parking related and should transition out of chapter 200-220 WAC. DES has also identified a section in chapter 200-210 WAC, Capitol Lake and adjoining lands and roadways, that should transition to chapter 200-200 WAC parking and traffic control on the capitol grounds.

Based on the above, I request the code reviser's office decodify and recodify the rules, as shown on the list of changes below.

The agency will take this opportunity to increase the number of covered cough and cold products.

SPA 19-0020 is expected to have no effect on the annual aggregate expenditures or payments for covered drugs and drug classes.

Title or Subject: Medicaid State Plan Amendment (SPA) 19-0022 Facility Rates.

Effective Date: July 1, 2019.

Description: The health care authority in conjunction with the aging and long-term support administration, department of social and health services (DSHS), intends to submit medicaid SPA 19-0022 in order to increase the medicaid rates for assisted living facilities, adult family homes, adult day health, agency providers, independent providers, enhanced service facilities, nursing facilities, and for nursing facility swing beds. These changes are due to an increase in appropriation from the state legislature. The department also intends to update language regarding the calculation of the swing bed rate in accordance with federal practice. The proposed effective date of these changes is July 1, 2019.

The annual combined total fiscal impact for state and federal dollars for SPA 19-0022 is \$29,806,000 for federal fiscal year 2019 and \$132,965,000 for federal fiscal year 2020.

The anticipated annual combined total fiscal impact for state and federal dollars per facility, service, or provider is as follows:

Announcing the Final Municipal Stormwater General Permits

On July 1, 2019, the Washington state department of ecology (ecology) reissued the Phase I, Western Washington Phase II, and Eastern Washington Phase II municipal stormwater national pollution discharge elimination system and state waste discharge general permits (permits). The permits

become effective on August 1, 2019, and expire on July 31, 2024.

Purpose of the Permits: Under federal and state water quality laws (Federal Clean Water Act and State Water Pollution Control Act), these permits require municipalities and secondary permittees to develop and implement a stormwater management program to control stormwater runoff into and from their municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4). The Phase I permit applies to all regulated large and medium municipal MS4s. The Phase I permit covers the cities of Seattle and Tacoma, and unincorporated King, Pierce, Snohomish, and Clark counties. The Phase II permits apply to all regulated small MS4s and cover cities and portions of counties in urban areas of eastern and western Washington. All three permits also cover secondary permittees, which are MS4s in permitted cities and counties that are owned or operated by public entities, such as: Ports, irrigation districts, colleges and universities, state institutions, school districts, drainage districts, and park districts.

Public Notice Process and Comments: Ecology accepted comments on the draft permits, fact sheet, and related permit documents from August 15, 2018, until November 14, 2018. Ecology offered two hearings via online webinars and five in-person hearings with workshops. The in-person hearings took place in Moses Lake, Mount Vernon, Seattle, DuPont, and Vancouver.

Ecology received written comments during the public comment period. The comments and ecology's response to comments are included as an appendix to the fact sheet.

**Announcing the Issuance of the
Water Treatment Plant General Permit**

On July 17, 2019, the department of ecology (ecology) is reissuing the water treatment plant national pollutant discharge elimination system waste discharge general permit (permit). The previous permit was issued in July 2014, and expires on August 31, 2019. The new permit will be in effect for five years, from September 1, 2019, through August 31, 2024.

Purpose of the Permit: The permit provides coverage for certain water treatment plants located in Washington state that produce potable or industrial supply water and discharge backwash effluent from certain water treatment filtration processes. Under federal and state water quality law (federal Clean Water Act and state Water Pollution Control Act), a permit is required for the discharge of wastewater. The federal definition of wastewater includes backwash effluent from water treatment plants. Certain water treatment plant facilities that produce finished water at a rate of at least thirty-five thousand gallons per day and that discharge wastewater either directly or indirectly to surface water must obtain permit coverage for their discharge.

Summary of Public Involvement: Ecology accepted public comments on the draft permit, fact sheet, and supporting documents from February 20 until April 2, 2019. Ecology announced the public comment period in the State Register and via email to more than two thousand one hundred interested parties. Ecology held a public workshop and hearing at its headquarters building in Lacey, Washington, on April 26, 2019, to discuss the draft documents and to receive oral, written, and electronic comments.

Ecology responded to all of the comments that we received and then published a response to comments as an appendix to the fact sheet.

Special Condition S-7.1 (Application for Coverage) in the permit provides the details for how to obtain coverage.
